

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project involves the construction of an extension to Jones Energy, Ltd.'s Collard Amine Plant gathering system for the transportation of natural gas having a hydrogen sulfide content in excess of 100 parts per million. The pipeline extension is approximately two miles in length. The diameter of the pipe is 8 5/8 inches. This extension was necessary to reduce line pressure and friction in the area of the extension, thus enabling Jones to produce the gas at a more efficient rate. The gas produced in this area contains hydrogen sulfide ("H2S") and, therefore, cannot be sold until it is treated. It is transported to Jones' Collard Amine Plant where it undergoes a "gas sweetening" process to remove the H2S. The sweet gas is then sold commercially. The pipeline extension has been designed for a normal operating pressure of 1200 psig and is currently transporting gas containing H2S at a rate of approximately 2 million cubic feet of gas per day.

RADIUS OF EXPOSURE: The 100 ppm radius of exposure (ROE) for all points along the pipeline extension is 130 feet. The ROE was calculated using the methodology contained in the Railroad Commission's Statewide Rule 36.


