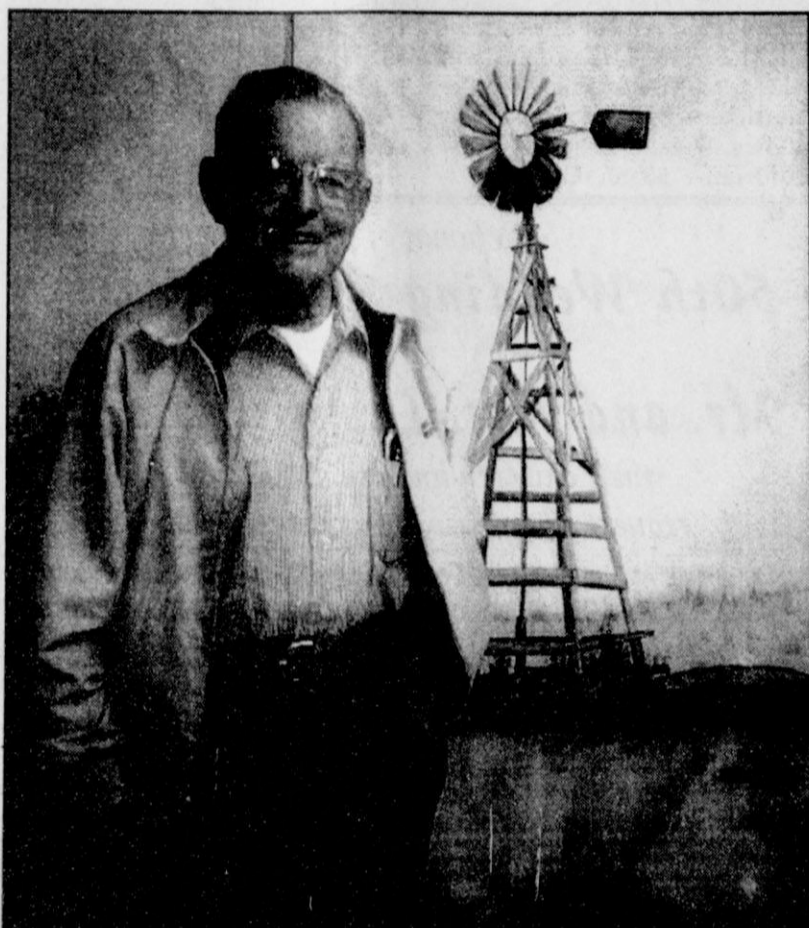
June Immunization Clinics

Heritage Days King

Albert Freeman Barkley Jr. was born February 28, 1914 at Old Hansford. He was the third child of Albert Freeman Barkley Sr. and Gertrude Lyon Barkley, both born in Missouri.

Three sisters completed the Barkley family. They are Reba Huffhines of Amarillo, Gertrude Archer of Spearman, and Virginia Renfroe, recently deceased.

Freeman was called A.F. until he started to school. His family moved to Spearman in 1920, where Freeman attended all 12 years of school. Two of his close friends in school were Chesta Lieb and Hugh Hazelwood. He later went to one year at Texas Tech.

Freeman's father organized Hansford Abstract Company in 1905. He later sold this to P.A. Lyon Sr. in 1929. In 1936 he became the County Judge and served until 1948. His mother, Gertrude, was a teacher for several years.

Although Freeman's family had a lot of business in their background, he thought he would live on a farm all his life. Farming was what he enjoyed doing the most. His father owned a farm near Morse which was run by an uncle. Freeman spent a lot of his time there, but in the 30's farming was not good.

Freeman met his wife, Ruby Moss, in Spearman. They were married in August 1937. To this union were born William Freeman (Bill) in 1942 and Mary Ellen in 1946. Bill lives in Amarillo, where he owns several car-wash businesses, and Mary Ellen lives in Sulphur Springs, where she is a teacher. Both children were born on June 2.

Bill has three children, Heather Suzanne, an English professor, Bryan Freeman, who just graduated from medical school at San Antonio, and William Clint, who graduated

from Baylor and is a teacher in Dallas. Bryan Freeman, the fourth generation with the Freeman name, will be doing his internship in Parkland Hospital in Dallas.

Mary Ellen has two children, Jana Mae, who graduated from college in December and is looking for a teaching job, and Paul Eugene, who is a senior in college.

Ruby Barkley passed away October 1970.

Freeman has always enjoyed working with wood. He has made bookcases, picture frames, and quilt racks. His wife, Ruby, had a China shop in the back of their home for many years.

Although Freeman did not intend to go into the business phase of life, that is what he did. His first job was at Consumers before he went to the one year at Texas Tech. He then worked at the Post Office for five years, the A.S.C.S. Office for five years, and the First State Bank for 30 years, where he was cashier and Vice President. He was Employee of the Year for Spearman while working at the bank.

Freeman has served on the Cemetery Committee for 20 or 25 years, on the board at the Methodist Church, and at one time was very involved with the Boy Scouts of America.

Freeman married his second wife, Elva Lee Sheets, in 1975. She passed away May 30, 1983.

Freeman still lives in the house he and Ruby built on Barkley Street, the street named for his father. This house is next door to the house his parents moved in from Old Hansford.

Note: It is indeed an honor to have Freeman Barkley represent the Stationmaster's House Museum and our county as Heritage Days King. I have never heard anyone say one unkind word about Freeman. That is truly an accomplishment for any man!

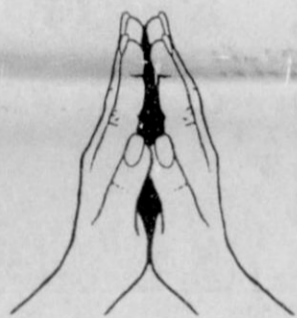

Focus On The Family

QUESTION: Should parents ever force a child to eat?

DR. DOBSON: No. I am no expert on nutrition, but I believe a normal child's appetite is governed by the amount of food he needs. He will get hungry when he needs nourishment.

However, I do believe the parent should carefully guard that appetite, making sure he satisfies it with the foods his body requires. A bit of sugar in the afternoon can make him disinterested in his dinner. Or he may sit down at the table and fill his stomach with juice or one item on his plate.

Thus, it may be necessary to give him one kind of food at a time, beginning with iron-rich meat and other proteins, followed by less important items.

Once he is satisfied, I can see no value in forcing him to continue eating. Incidentally, the parent should know that a child's appetite often drops off rapidly between 2 and 3 years of age. This occurs because his time of maximum growth rate has subsided, and his need for food is reduced.
