Food Manager Training Offered June 26-27

Texas restaurants are required by law to have certified food managers. To train these service professionals, Texas Cooperative Extension of Hansford county will offer a manager certification course called "Food Safety: It's Our Business" on June 26-

The event will be at the Fellowship Hall of Spearman Church of Christ, 121 S. Haney in Spearman. The deadline for registration is June 15.

"This hands-on learning experience equips participants with the latest food safety principles and practices to prepare for the examination," said Peggy Winegarner, Extension Agent Family and Consumer Science in Spearman.

The course fee of \$89 includes training, materials and the state food manager certification examination. A test-only option is available but recommended only for those with a strong food safety background. Cost for the test without the training is \$50. New food manager certificates are valid for five years.

On average, one in four Americans become sick each year from a food borne illness. One in 1,000 people are hospitalized and 5,000 die from ingesting unsafe food.

Course instructors will teach ways to identify potential hazardous foods, prevent common errors in food handling, and methods preventing contamination and cross-contamination of food. Other topics will include personal hygiene for employees, compliance with governmental regulations, clean work area, utensil and equipment maintenance in addition to safe pest control methods.



Shedeck Sisters Named 2007 Heritage Days Queens

Leona Shedeck Sikes, and her sister Adelaide "Dolly" Margaret Shedeck McWhirter have been selected as the Heritage Days Queens for 2007.

Adelaide "Dolly" Margaret Shedeck McWhirter was born November 14, 1923 in Yukon, OK, the second child of Harry and Margeret Shedeck. Leona was born near Yukon, OK in 1925

In August of 1929, the Shedecks moved their chil-

dren, Richard, Dolly and Leona, to Spearman. Dolly attended Spearman schools, where she played trombone in the band. She was also very active in 4-H and was the first Gold Star Girl of Hansford County. After graduation in 1941, she attended Wayland Baptist College prior to transferring to West Texas where she met Jack McWhirter in 1942.

Jack and Dolly married in August, 1943, while Jack was stationed at Amarillo Air Force Base. A year after the birth of their first daughter, Cynthia, they moved to Canyon, where Jack completed his B.S. Degree in Agriculture in 1947. Shortly thereafter, they moved to Spearman to begin farming with Dolly's parents. Their

second child, Lloyd, was born in December of that

year. Their third child, Marla Jo, followed in 1954. Dolly was an active member of many community and personal interest groups such as the Home Demonstration Club, Jonquil Flower Club, and the Eastern Star. She and Jack square danced and bowled together for several years. She also served the community as the chair for the Red Cross Blood Drive sever-

As members of the First United Methodist Church, both Dolly and Jack were very active - she taught Sunday School for many years and served as the Superintendent of the Children's Sunday School as well as working in the Methodist Women's group. (There was always a casserole or dessert ready in the freezer for a church function or grieving family.)

Jack and Dolly traveled on many Lay Witness Mission trips, often taking high school students along with them. The McWhirter's were also Spearman's first American Field Service host family in 1965, when Geir Berge Overland from Norway, arrived to live with them for the year. Geir quickly became another member of their family.

Dolly and Jack were always in attendance for their children's school and extra curricular activities - 4-H, boy scouts, basketball, football, piano recitals, etc. Dolly was active in PTA with all three children. From the stories told, her favorite school events had to be the trips with the band to Enid, OK. (You've heard the saying, "What happens in Enid, stays in Enid?")

Dolly was not only supportive of her children, but also of her husband of 59 years. Jack was a very active charter member of the Spearman Chapter of Rotary International. As an Assistant Governor, they had to travel to other chapters, both serving Rotary in their

With all these activities, Dolly still managed to be an accomplished homemaker. Not only was she a great cook, Dolly was an excellent seamstress, skilled at furniture refinishing, decoupage, and tole painting. Sewing seemed to be her first love and eventually, Jack and Dolly opened a fabric store, Kaleidoscope, and then she took up quilting. And what beautiful quilts she has created!

Leona also attended Spearman schools, graduating with the class of 1942. Going to college was in her future plans since she wanted to be an elementary school teacher. She graduated from West Texas State College (now WTAMU) in 1946 and moved to Portales, NM, where she taught 4th grade students and

It was in Portales that she met Noble Sikes, who had recently been discharged from the U.S. Navy at the end of World War II. They were married in December of

1948, and continued to live in Portales, where they raised two sons and two daughters, who graduated from Portales schools. Her husband died in 1990. Leona now has two daughters-in-law and five grand-

Her hometown of Spearman has always been important to her and she and her family visit often. Her parents, Harry and Margaret Shedeck and her brother, Richard, are deceased, but she always enjoys a visit with her sister and her family. She still looks forward to the Spearman paper each week for news from the area and keeps up her subscription to the Hansford County Reporter-Statesman.

Richard, Dolly and Leona have shared their family history by supporting the Stationmaster's Museum with many items on exhibit and donating the Shedeck Barn, in honor of their parents, Harry and Margaret Shedeck. This barn houses, among other things, the covered wagon used by Harry and Margaret Shedeck as charter members of the Rolling Plains Mule Train.

Words from Faith & Grace

We begin the season of Pentecost, "Lord show us the father." We begin the study of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2:1-21, Psalm 104:24-34,35b, Romans 8:12-25, and John 14:8-27.

The Feast of Pentecost comes fifty days after the Passover, it celebrates the giving of the law to Moses and the barley harvest. One hundred twenty believers are assembled in a large upper room when the Holy Spirit descended upon them; immediately they start speaking in tongues and go forth with the "good news". The first recorded Christian sermon is Jack Webb-like, "Just the facts, Ma'am, Just the facts". Peter tells the crowds that they have witnessed the "Day of the Lord", the day God has broken into human history. To paraphrase a nineteenth century theologian. "to set the world on fire for Christ, you must first burn a little yourself'. Note in this scripture that with the Apostles there are 108 lay people sharing the gospel. In modern day Namibia, in Africa, 50% of the people are Lutheran Christians, 85% of the people are Christian. This is a higher ratio of believers than we have. This fire of the Spirit was not solely the result of the first two missionaries to appear, but of the two villagers who went back to their villages to share the gospel of hope they had found, and each villager then shared, etc. The Psalmist sings of the greatness of God, the Creator, the Master of the Sea. A reminder that the nature of God appears to us in the nature of His creation.

Paul assures us that all who are "led" by the Spirit are children of God. He uses the legal example of Roman adoption whereby the adopted child 1) lost all rights to his old family, received all rights in his new family; 2) became an heir to the estate of the new parent; 3) in law, the old life is completely "wiped out"; 4) the child becomes absolutely the child of the adoptive parent. Similarly in the Spirit we are dead to our old life, we are heirs of the Kingdom, we are absolutely the children of God. Our "adoption" is complete when we are received in Heaven. Know that "sanctification" is the process by which we are moved from sinner to saint, a child

Peter has just asked Jesus, "where are you going?" Thomas asks, "how will we know the way?" John next shows us Philip saying, "show us the father". Jesus explains that the Father is in Him and He is in the Father. For those unable to grasp this, He says, "believe me because of the works themselves". In Jesus, God has shown us that he is not ashamed to live as a man, to be tempted, to reveal his true nature. Jesus assures us that anything we ask in his name; He will do, Consider dear Christian that the test of love is obedience. The word used for "name" is the Hebrew 'Shem' which has the meaning of all the accumulated testimony of the character of the man "named". Hence if we live in love, in obedience to Christ Jesus our prayers will be "in" Him and not like Janis Joplin's "O Lord won't you buy me a Mercedes-Benz?" We are then promised that we will not be left to face the world alone, we have an advocate, the Holy Spirit. This Spirit gives us the peace that passes all understanding, Shalom!

Lake Palo Duro has changed dramatically since I last wrote this column. The eight foot rise in the lake level has really made a difference. The lake covers three hundred surface acres, up one hundred thirty. The lake contains approximately two and one half times more water than it did. While the water does not cover the bridge, at least there is water under it. The lake always drops after a good rise, as the water saturates dry ground. 
