Texas Farm To Expand In Area

Officials with Texas Farm, the Perryton-based pork producer, announced plans last week to expand their operations in the northern Panhandle of Texas. Part of that expansion includes at least one site in Hansford County, according to Don Clift, General Affairs Manager for Texas Farm.

The site, a 2,000-sow genetic facility, is located five miles southeast of Spearman off Farm to Market Road 760, and will produce offspring that will populate other production sites, said Clift. Those production sites have yet to be selected, he said.

"We've been given the goahead by our management to expand our production capacity to 53,000-sows," said Clift. "That is double what our existing plans call for and will allow Texas Azuma's letter stated. Farm to ultimately market over one million hogs per year."

Currently, Texas Farm is a 27,000-sow hog production facility under construction in Ochiltree County south and east of Perryton. Texas Farm is a subsidiary of Day-Lee Foods of California, which is owned by Nippon Meat Packers. The hogs produced by Texas Farm will be customprocessed and exported to Japan where they will be sold under a premium brand label called "Silk

In a letter to Perryton and Ochiltree County officials, which was read at a luncheon in Perryton. Heihachirou Azuma, president of Texas Farm Inc. and vice president Nippon Meat Packers Inc., said, "the demand for imported pork products in Japan has been increasing and this trend is expected to continue.

"To satisfy this need, we have decided to expand our operations,"

This expansion begins with the genetic herd, which Texas Farm plans to build in Hansford County. Other facilities will be populated by the genetic herd. Texas Farm is

currently looking at sites in several counties in the area for this additional expansion.

Texas Farm's initial project was estimated to cost \$100 million and employ 230 people. The additional live production will cost another \$80 million and add 190 employees, said Clift.

The current Hansford County site is expected to add \$4 million to the tax base and employ as many as 15, said Clift.

Texas Farm officials said the concept for a United States-based production hog farm was researched for more than three years and Missouri, Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado and New Mexico were considered before Nippon selected Texas.

The sites in Ochiltree County in

the Texas Panhandle were finally selected for meeting the criteria for ensuring the project's environmental soundness; relative distance from neighbors and conservation area; availability of feedstuffs; and a quality workforce.

The site in eastern Hansford County was chosen for its environmental soundness, distance from neighbors and proximity to Texas Farm's exiting projects. Spearman officials were invited to attend the announcement luncheon Friday, hosted by Texas

Last week, Texas Farm officials also announced plans to construct a large feedmill two miles east of

QUESTION: What happens to a child whose parents are overprotective and fail to assign appropriate responsibility to their child?

DR. DOBSON: A dependency relationship may develop with far reaching implications. Such a youngster often falls behind his normal timetable in preparation for ultimate release as a young adult.







The early days and growth of the town of Gruver and the life and work of A.R. (Ralph) Bort are stories so intertwined that neither can be told separately. They provide the narrative of a man and a town who were brought together by chance and "grew up" together by choice.

Hansford County, Texas was not a name or a place Ralph Bort knew as a youngster growing up near Iberia, Missouri, where he helped on the family farm clearing land and picking tomatoes for extra money. However, the seed of a dream which would be fulfilled in that day without four-buckle Hansford County was planted during that time in young Bort's mind. As the lad was digging stumps one day near the farm house, he was able to closely observe a banker who came to the family farm. The young boy later reflected that the banker's occupation seemed much more appealing than his, and the aspect of driving a car rather than walking seemed infinitely more attractive.

Later as a teenager, Bort worked in Nebraska with mule teams before attending business college in Springfield, Missouri. He moved to Zenda, Kansas in 1920, and worked for his brotherin-law at a grain elevator until he found employment at a bank in nearby Penalosa, Kansas. Eventually, as Bort sought to better his career, he approached Frank Carson at the First National Bank in Wichita, Kansas. Although Mr. Carson had no job openings at his bank, he told Bort of an opening in a bank at Spearman, Texas.

Even though Bort had never heard of Spearman, he decided to pursue the opportunity and began

Spearman with Bob Thom. The two men worked with Clay Gibner until March of 1929, when a bank was opened in Gruver, a small community of less than ten families located 13 miles west of Spearman. Transferring to the Gruver bank, (the building presently housing Gruver Floral Shop), Bort worked as a cashier alongside a young lady, Beulah Ben Ownbey who served as bookkeeper. The two had met and dated once previously when both worked in Spearman, but the date had sparked no interest.

As the days passed, however, the couple soon became a twosome and were eventually married on June 1, 1930. This was a union which would be severed only by Bort's death 66 years later.

The next six years were busy ones for the Bort family. Their two daughters, Barbara Jean (Barbara Cluck of Gruver) and Peggy Lou (Peggy Jones of Hillsborough, California) were born, and Bort himself, would have two occupations, a banker by day and a farmer after business hours.

When the Gruver bank was sold to the First National Bank of Spearman in 1936, Bort made the comment that he hoped he lived long enough to start a new bank in Gruver someday. For two years, Bort commuted to the Spearman bank to work. His wife, Beulah, often feared for his safety as he would carry money from one Gruver business in one coat pocket and money from another in the other pocket.

Although never losing his love for banking and his dream of founding a bank in Gruver, Bort decided in 1938, that he was financially able to live from the proceeds of his farming and cattle

interests. This he did until 1946, when he was able to secure the backing and collateral to establish the Gruver State Bank which opened its doors on September 7, in the lobby of the mezzanine of the present day El Vaquero Restaurant.

In 1949, the bank moved across the street west from its original location to the buildings which most recently housed the Caprock Industries offices. The modern picturesque building that houses the bank today was completed in

Bort was elected president of the Gruver bank in 1955, and chairman of the board in 1976. He was an ever-present part of the bank until his illness in August 1993, and remained chairman of the board emeritus until his

In his lifetime, he was honored by being elected the second mayor of Gruver, being named to the top ten men with fifty years of banking experience in the Texas Panhandle in 1978, and being a promoter of new business developments in Gruver. Wes Izzard, editor of the "Amarillo Daily News" once dubbed Bort as "the one man chamber of

Bort and his wife were active in civic, school, and church
