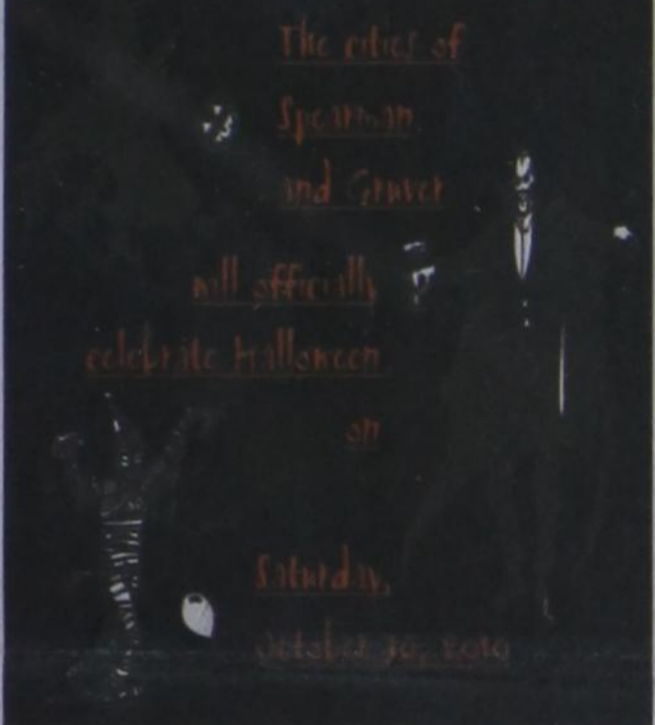

Spearman Varsity Lynxettes & Lynx
Spearman girls, Bushland boys successful in title defenses: The two-time defending state champion Spearman Lynxettes and defending district champion Bushland won team titles Monday, October 25, 2010 in the District 1-2A Meet at Palo Duro Lake in Spearman.

Highland Park sophomore Quinlin McGregor ran 16:56 to break his own course record and repeat as individual champion, while Tylo Farrar of Spearman also defended her individual title in strong wind on a course longer than three miles.

"The times were slow," Lynxettes coach Starla Whitley said. "Tylo usually runs 12 minutes in practice. Quinlin breaking the course record in those conditions with the wind off the lake was amazing."

McGregor, who finished fourth at last year's regional as a freshman, easily defeated Tony Surace of River Road, who was second in 18:28.

Spearman scored 24 points to claim the girls title ahead of Bushland with 35 and the district's third regional qualifier, Sanford-Fritch, with 85.

Bushland, led by Jared Vogler's third-place finish, easily captured the boys title with 26 points over Highland Park with 51 points and River Road with 53.

Tylo Farrar led the Lynxettes, finishing in first place with a time of 13:08. Other top ten finishers were: 2. Adrienne Jackson, Bushland, 13:53; 3. **Shelby Hanna, Spearman, 14:03**; 4. Macie Smith, Bushland, 14:06; 5. **Sarah Snider, Spearman, 14:08**; 6. Madison Berry, Bushland, 14:09; 7. **Malory Martin, Spearman, 14:21**; 8. **Itzel Meza, Spearman, 14:28**; 9. **Gately Garnett, Spearman, 14:35**; 10. **Cynthia Mendoza, Spearman, 14:55**. (The top ten runners and the top three teams in the varsity competitions advance to the Regional competition. The top ten runners in each race also receive medals.)

The Varsity Lynx did not have enough runners for a team. Sol Pittman finished in 10th place with a time of 21:46. Other runners for the Varsity Lynx were: Sawyer Sutterfield, 17th; Tristan Wilborn, 21st; and Cesar Torres, 26th.

Seat seekers stage final blitzes before Election Day

AUSTIN — Political candidates, now in their final week of campaigning before the Nov. 2 election, are hailing Texas voters with the traditional march of television and radio spots.

For those who haven't voted and want information on candidates, places to go are the League of Women Voters of Texas, www.lwv-texas.org, and the Texas Secretary of State's Office, www.sos.state.tx.us.

Those whom voters choose to put in the state House, Senate, governor's office and comptroller's office will have their hands full. Estimates of the projected state budget deficit have ranged from as low as \$8 billion to as high as \$25 billion.

And the always-challenging task of redistricting will be waiting at the Capitol steps when the 82nd Texas Legislature convenes in regular session on Jan. 11, 2011.

Courts get ticket info digitally

The Texas Department of Public Safety on Oct. 14 announced it is now making available its traffic citation information to Texas courts and precincts electronically and on paper.

Before, courts received ticket information from Texas Highway Patrol citations either by mail or via hand delivery by the troopers who wrote the tickets.

Status with IRS at risk for some

Nearly 24,000 Texas employers could lose their tax-exempt status because they have not filed required returns in the last three years with the Internal Revenue Service, the Texas Workforce Commission said.

Oct. 15 was the deadline for small nonprofit organizations with 501(c)(3) status to comply with the law under a one-time relief program the IRS announced in July. Non-filers could be liable for filing and paying Unemployment Insurance taxes for the first time if they failed to meet the deadline.

Among organizations that could lose their tax-exempt status if they failed to file are local sports associations and community support groups, volunteer fire and ambulance associations and their auxiliaries, social

clubs, educational societies, veterans groups, church-affiliated groups, groups designed to assist those with special needs and others, the Texas Workforce Commission said.

Pre-Republic history is subject

The Texas General Land Office will host a history symposium on Nov. 6 at the Stephen F. Austin State Office Building in Austin, titled "Discovering Spanish and Mexican Texas."

The focus will be on the settlement of Texas before 1836.

"It's important to remember the first illegal immigrants in Texas didn't come across the Rio Grande — they crossed the Sabine River into Spanish and Mexican Texas," said Land Commissioner Jerry Patterson, in inviting students of Texas history.

Symposium registration fees will help fund the preservation of more than 35 million historic maps and documents archived at the General Land Office.

Pay up or we'll come knocking

The Texas Comptroller's office announced Oct. 22 it will begin working with the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission in the following respect.

The two agencies plan to team up to suspend mixed beverage and private club permits held by businesses that are delinquent on franchise, sales or hotel occupancy taxes. This will begin early next year and add to current tax-collection measures.

Motorcyclist signage to go up

The Texas Department of Transportation plans to unveil on Oct. 26 the first of its new motorcycle-specific "Stay Alert, Save a Life" signs in Real County.

Signs will be placed along winding roads to caution riders to be alert through the next few miles. TxDOT will install other such warning signs in Real County before the annual Three Sisters Motorcycle Rally in November.

Since September 2006, 14 motorcyclists have been killed in crashes along the route, TxDOT said.

Monthly unemployment rate drops

Texas' unemployment rate improved to 8.1 percent in September, better than the 8.3 percent recorded for the month of August, the Texas Workforce Commission reported Oct. 21.

Honors for TV 'Texas Rangers'

The Texas Public Safety Commission on Oct. 21 voted 4-0 to name "Walker, Texas Ranger" star Chuck Norris and his brother, the show's executive producer Aaron Norris, as honorary Texas Ranger captains. The Dallas-Fort Worth-based television series ran from 1993 to 2001.

Other actors who have been so honored include Willie Nelson, Tom Mix, Gene Autry, Audie Murphy, Tommy Lee Jones, John Wayne, Clint Eastwood, Robert Duvall, Glen Campbell, and many more.

May the Holy Spirit "Re-Form" your life that you may embrace dynamic 'justice' and find salvation in God's grace through faith in Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

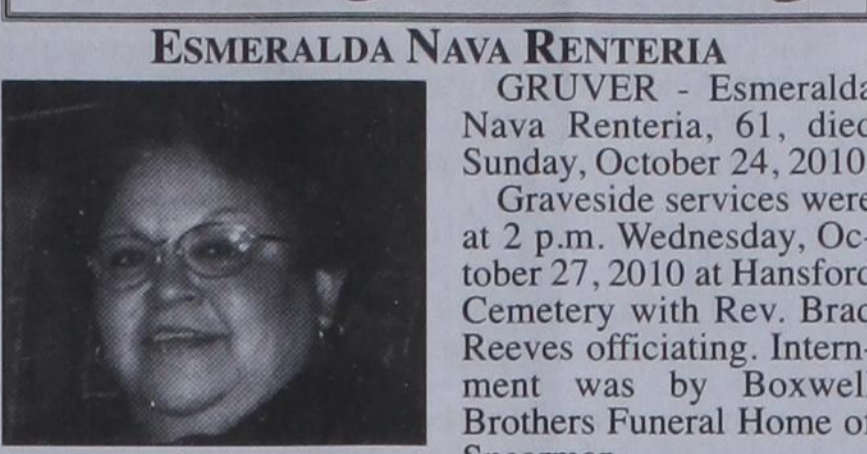

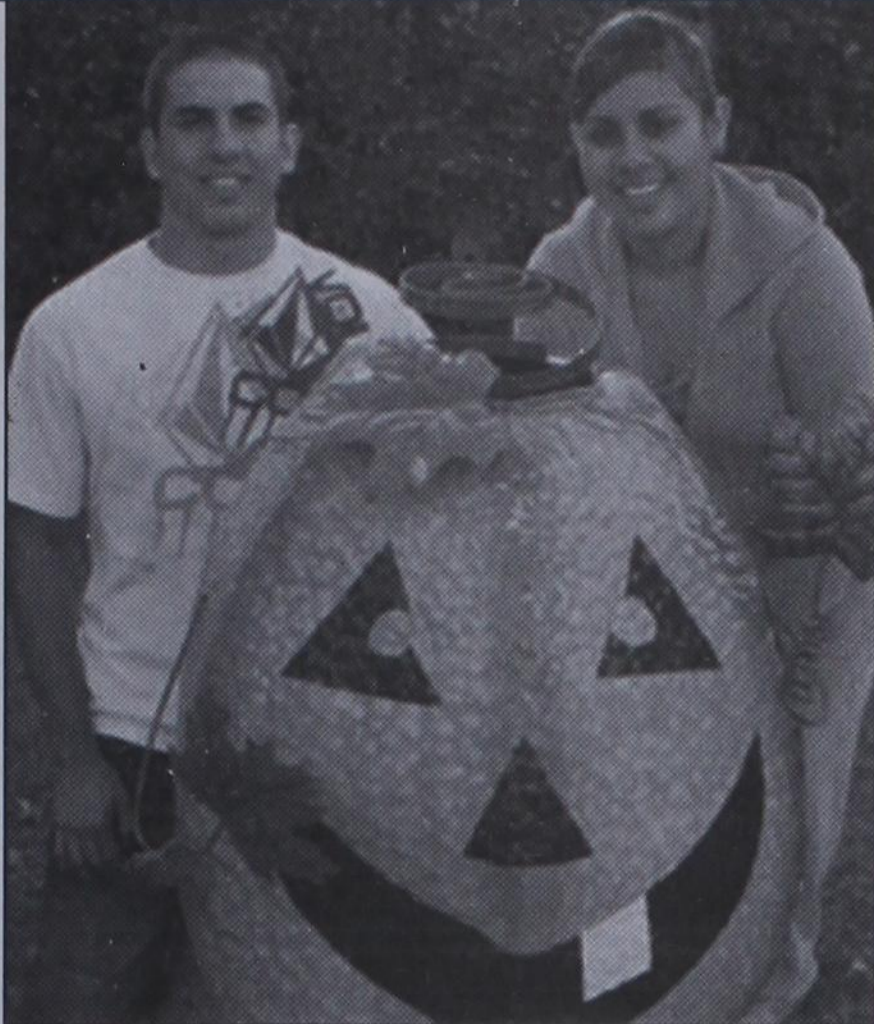

Despite Rumors, Nov. 2 Ballot Does Not Include Statewide Propositions

While Texans will go to the polls on Nov. 2 to decide who will represent them in many federal, state, district and local offices, there are no statewide propositions on the ballot that day, according to Secretary of State Hope Andrade.

Rumors - fueled by an e-mail circulating around the state - of a constitutional amendment on the ballot regarding the homestead tax are not accurate, Andrade said.

"Our office has been contacted by citizens that received or heard of the e-mail," said Andrade. "We want to make sure people have correct information and are prepared to vote on the issues before them. It is an important election, but there are no statewide constitutional amendments on the Nov. 2 ballot."

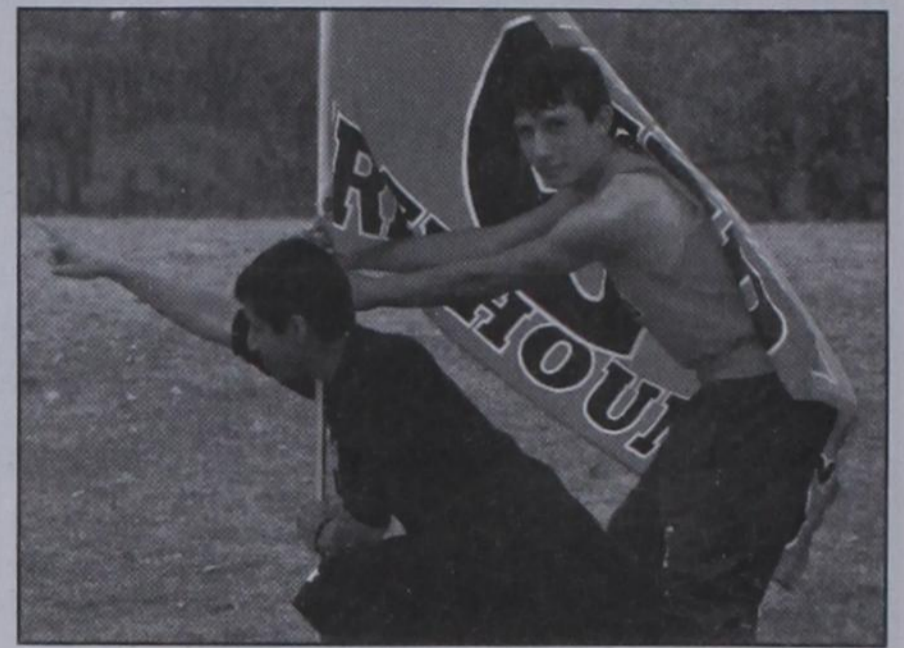

Amphibians

Son-in-law Kenneth Harris told of seeing waterdogs on a highway north of Gruver. With help from the Internet I learned that the waterdogs (Tiger Salamanders) were amphibians just like the frogs. Jim had told me about them being used for bait, but I had not realized it was the young green ones

with peculiar gills that he meant. The name Tiger comes from their yellow against black coloring, sometimes in striped patterns. I think the adult ones I used to see in our farmhouse basement were more blotched with the yellow. The basement had a dirt rear wall that they burrowed through.

Newts are another salamander-like amphibian. As Halloween is approaching, this makes me think of the incantation of the Three Witches in Shakespeare's MacBeth: "Eye of newt, and toe of frog, wool of bat and tongue of dog..."
