The tract consists of nearly 20,000 acres of land, situated in Potter, Moore, Carson and Hutcheson counties, long known as the LX ranch. The deal was concummated through G. C. Wood, of the Texas Land and Mortgage Co., of Dallas, and E. A. Poffrath, of Ft. Worth, who represent the English land holders. The cost is known to be close to \$1,000,000.00.

The property was bought from the American Pastorial Co., of London, England. This company is composed mostly of English capitalists, and they have held the land in question for the past twenty-five years. 
