PANHANDLE OPPORTUNITIES.

They are all doing well and are making a good living and the most of them some money. In all the twenty-six counties of the Panhandle there is not a poor house maintained at public expense. No such a thing as a poor farm has ever been known in this country. All these things certainly speak well for the country. The very fact that nothing of this kind exists is evidence of the thrift of the people. In other countries where land is selling from \$100 to \$150 per acre the people are forced to maintain such institutions. In other countries where they boast of wonderful crops and plenty they have the poor always with them and beggars upon the streets of their cities. There is room in the Panhandle yet for thousands more. We want tillers of the soil to join the settlers of the Panhandle, and help us build up the country. Our country is prosperous, has always been prosperous, and more people with more means will make it more prosperous. Land is cheap enough to induce good settlers to take hold and its producing qualities sufficient to remunerate them with a bountiful crop for their labor. The Panhandle needs more good settlers.

The eyes of the people of the East are now centered upon the state of Texas, and especially the Panhandle portion of it, as a place for investment. The fact that the lands of the big cattle companies of the plains have been offered in tracts to suit purchasers who desire to become settlers and has been advertised for sale has induced the populace of the crowded east to consider well the situation. One by one they visit our country and return to tell the story over and over again to those eager to better their condition by coming to a new country. The east is full of people, they are wonderfully overcrowded. The trades are all overdone. There are more working men than there is work. Men are hunting jobs to find that there are many others after the same job. The Panhandle hasn't enough people. We want more people. The trades need more workmen. There is more work than there are workmen to do it, more farms than there are farmers to cultivate the soil. No one has to hunt a job in this country, a job is always ready if there is a willing man to take it. The opportunities for the farmer are better

DEFEAT OR VICTORY?

Now that the Baptist College has been lost to our citizens, notwithstanding their very liberal proposition, would it not be proper for those who were so liberal on that proposition to invest a good per cent of the money they intended to invest in the Baptist proposition into the college already located in our town? This institution can, by the help of the citizens, be made to surpass any similiar institution in the state of Texas as it has no foreign board to retard its growth in any way. If the citizens will furnish the necessary cash to purchase the apparatus and appurtenances and put the college on a sound financial basis at the start we will have an institution of learning, not only a credit to the town, county, state and country in which it is located, but one that will be worth thousands of dollars every year to the business interests of our town and county—and who can gainsay the fact that when the merchants are prosperous all others are necessarily in that condition? With such reputable men and women composing the faculty of the new Add-Ran there can be no doubt in the minds of any but that if they are supplied with the proper equipment the students attending will be limited only by the accomodations. The Institute at Roswell is at all times overcrowded and have to refuse admittance to many prospective students every year, notwithstanding the fact that more and better accomodations have been provided each year for students. Why is this? Simply because Roswell has the climatic advantages added to an excellent equipment and corps of teachers, and because Roswell's is the only institution of learning in this section of the country which has these three qualities combined in its make-up. Hereford's college has the climatic advantages and all that is necessary for it to eclipse the Roswell Institute in point of students is for the people of Hereford to properly equip Add-Ran and provide accomodations for the students who will congregate within its walls as a consequence. The fact that this institution is open for the admission of both sexes is one of the reasons why Roswell's could not

cope with us in college population, as none but males are admitted therein. Citizens of Hereford, will you take the interest that you should in this institution and thus turn the defeat of not obtaining the Baptist college into a most glorious victory: or will you allow it to start off as a secondary school and remain so until the time shall have arrived when it will have the proper equipment only through the earnings of the school, which, on account of not having these advantages at the start, will take years of hard work to accomplish, the business interests of the town losing thereby? This is no idle talk, gentlemen. Nor is it published to fill up space. On the contrary it is a subject which should concern every citizen of this town. Is it possible that Hereford, conceded to be the best and most progressive town in the Panhandle, is to be eclipsed in her college enterprise by some other town with far less natural advantages simply because her citizens, through no reasonable cause, fail to provide it with the necessary equipment? It is of no use to argue that you are too poor, for if you could so easily raise \$22,500 for the Baptist College enterprise, you could surely raise half of that amount to make this college do more for the enterprises of the town than two would have done not properly equipped—and you had no assurance whatever that the Baptist college would be any better equipped than you yourselves can equip Add-Ran, and that with ease.

THE Amarillo Star says we were mistaken in regard to the Reunion being held at Canyon next year. Perhaps so, but we had the authority of the Secretary of the Reunion to make the statement. Here is what the Star says of the matter:

You are mistaken brother. The place of holding the next reunion has not been determined yet; it may go to Canyon and it may not. In a few days we will submit you the proposition from the committee and Hereford people may govern themselves accordingly.

WE have talked with many people in regard to this and that project for the upbuilding of Hereford and the concensus of opinion seems to be that unless we finish and fully finance the projects already on foot and in a state of incompletion no other project would be a success. While it is a fact that a sanitarium, a Chautauquan entertainment yearly, an artesian well and other propositions too numerous to mention for the upbuilding of the business interests of the town would be of inestimable value to our business enterprises, it is, perhaps, also a fact none of these propositions could be brought to a successful culmination unless we bring to success those enterprises already under way. From this time on THE BRAND will be utterly opposed to anything in the way of new enterprises which call for donations until Add-Ran College is fully equipped for business and our public school building treated to improvements which will make it a place of pride instead of a disgrace to our citizens. It is a shame that the buildings of these institutions have been allowed to drag along as they have and are still in an unfinished state. Gentlemen—you who are honestly working for the town's advancement—if you wish to see our town once more take on that all-pull-together air and habit, drop all petty differences and new propositions and work with a unanimity of purpose to put Add-Ran College on a sound financial basis and commence at once to improve the building and grounds of our public school—in fact, we favor incorporation for school purposes only (if we can not have incorporation for city purposes) and then issue bonds and erect a brick building—one capacited to our needs and one to which we can point with pride. A college will bring pupils, but an up-to-date public school will bring families. Don't forget that fact, but get out of your sulky or lethargic state and go to work.

THE Memphis Herald in commenting on that town's failure to get the Baptist college, strikes a keynote when it says: "A good public school after all is the thing which homeseekers are after." And that Memphis will have such a one is evidenced by the brick school house being erected in that town.

REV. J. W. WHATLEY, in the Canadian Record, says that by a unanimous vote at the Claude meeting of the Panhandle Baptist Education Commission the Canadian proposition was accepted in addition to Canyon City's and that the Baptists will have two colleges in the Panhandle and that the Canadian college will be opened for business this fall. It is possible that Canyon will object.

COL. POOL WRITES OF HEREFORD VISIT.

The Greatest Shipping Point in the Texas Panhandle, and a Town That Has a Future.

Editor West Texas Stockman:

I arrived here on Friday, August 7th, and met a hearty welcome from many old friends. This county—Deaf Smith—is one of the western border counties, and is being rapidly settled by the small stock farmer. Its soil is of a peculiar red and black loam, having qualities which seem to resist drouths—this fact, after having had no rain for over seven weeks, one could make mud balls from the soil lying six or eight inches below the surface—and as a consequence all feed crops are green and needed but one good rain to insure their maturing (which they received Saturday night).

During my visit here I was driven to different nearby "farms" where I found small fruits of all kinds (including trees and vines) in a flourishing condition, and I was assured that the grower had experienced no difficulty in obtaining such rapid growth, and in my opinion but a few years will have lapsed before this country will have a fruit industry equal to any part of Texas. I saw many shade trees that were fully six inches in diameter that were planted less than five years ago, and this without irrigation; yet these trees were cultivated, which is more essential than irrigation in this country, so I am informed. Hereford has a well established nursery in connection with Add-Ran College, containing several thousand trees, which seem to be well rooted and growing rapidly. These are also without irrigation.

This is an ideal country for the stock farmer who has not sufficient means to carry on the stock raising business on a large scale. With a section or so of land he can have a few cattle and raise feed to care for them, in addition to raising fine crops of oats, wheat and other cereals, together with vegetables and garden truck of all kinds. In fact, I saw samples of oats and wheat raised here which were unexcelled by any I have seen in Texas this year. This is the home of dwarfy milo maize, kaffir corn and sorghum (not a stalk of cotton is growing in the county), which, owing to the before mentioned peculiarity of the soil, has never failed to mature and produce heavy yields. During my drive I saw several patches of alfalfa, which, I was assured, was very prolific in this section of the country.

On the south skirts of the town flows the head waters of Red river, called the Tierra Blanco, which is fed by springs, maintaining a flowing stream the year round, and in which abound abundance of black blass, croppie and other specimens of the finny tribe. This stream was stocked with fish about eight years ago by Sam Dunn, the well known cattle inspector and other enterprising citizens, and many are caught weighing as high as six pounds. The fishermen here have an unwritten law to the effect that any fish caught weighing less than one pound shall be returned to the stream. This stream is equal, if not better, for bass fishing than the Conchos, Spring or Dove creeks o

Tom Green county. This may seem strange to the uninitiated that this section of the country—nearly 4000 feet above sea level and on the Staked Plains—should have a bold, running stream providing such excellent fishing grounds, but it is a fact, nevertheless.

This is Hereford, the seat of government of Deaf Smith county, and the only town in the county, founded about four years ago after the completion of the Pecos Valley and Northern Texas railroad (now a part of the Santa Fe), having one through train each way daily, and which renders good service. The city has three church buildings belonging respectively to the Christian, Baptist and Methodist denominations, while the Cumberland Presbyterians have the material on the ground for a modern edifice. The Presbyterians (old school) also have a thriving congregation and expect to erect a church house in the near future.

The town has a population conservatively estimated at 2500, which supports about sixty business houses, including two national banks. All lines of business are represented, including a most excellent telephone service, connecting 150 business houses and residences, besides having connection with all the surrounding towns.

F. L. Vanderburgh, editor of THE BRAND, who, by the way has one of the best equipped printing offices I have seen in West Texas, has placed me under many obligations for so many nice attentions during my two days' stay here. His paper is first-class in every respect and deserves the excellent patronage it is receiving from the business men of the town. Yet he has failed to get my dog, so far.

Hereford has an endless supply of the purest of soft water, obtained at a depth of from twenty to sixty feet, and nearly every house has its own water works in the shape of a wind mill and tank. The town has a gradual slope southward toward the Tierra Blanco, which furnishes the finest of natural drainage. Now, boys, if you want anything to drink, you must bring it with you, for there is not a drop of "stump water" sold in this town.

I had the pleasure of stopping at the Hereford House, conducted by Mr. Martin, who serves his guests with good, wholesome meals and gives them every attention. The young ladies of the house also served to make my stay pleasant by rendering several musical selections, both vocal and instrumental. Ladies, you have my good wishes for all time to come.

I pause right here to remark that if those ladies and my wife find out that I was posing as a widower here, I am a ruined man.

Add-Ran College, a continuation of the old and well known educational institution at Thorp Springs, is located here under the same former management—Addison and Randolph Clark. Thousands of ladies and gentlemen scattered all over Texas and other states, who received their education from those noted educators, can bear witness to the thoroughness of their courses of study and the discipline with which they operated the school. Add-Ran College of Hereford is a repetition of Add-Ran at Thorp Springs

so far as discipline and thoroughness of work is concerned. Besides the regular college courses Add-Ran offers exceptionally fine courses in a practical business education under the management of L. A. Wyatt, M. A., who for many years has been one of the leading business educators of the south. Add-Ran also offers special advantages in its Industrial and Domestic science departments. This school opens the 15th of September for the admission of pupils. The Girls' Home, situated about two hundred feet from the college building, is a three-story structure and contains about thirty well ventilated sleeping rooms, each one cosily furnished and heated by steam, besides parlors, a large dining room, commodious kitchen and pantry, and several bath rooms. The main building of Add-Ran—117 feet long, 70 feet wide, two stories and basement and garret—is one of stone and brick, the lower story being built of Pecos granite or sandstone, while the upper story is of brick, trimmed with stone. This building, when completed (which, according to contract, must be finished by October 1), will contain twelve large reciting rooms, a commodious chapel and several music rooms, besides offices, cloakrooms, closets, etc., and will be heated by steam and have all the modern improvements and furnishings.

And last but not least, I desire to thank my old friend, A. P. Murchison for the drive over the country Saturday evening. It gave me a chance to see the surrounding country. That's all for the present.

For an Artesian Well.

Last Saturday a meeting of business men was held at the real estate office of Ricketts & Rayzor for the purpose of discussing the proposition of drilling for artesian water in Hereford. On motion G. A. F. Parker was elected chairman and C. L. Stocks secretary. After some discussion of the subject, pro and con, the chair was authorized to appoint a committee to investigate the probable cost of drilling to the depth of some 1500 feet (if necessary) and a report at a meeting to be called by the chair. The committee appointed is composed of J. P. Snyder, B. H. Frazier, W. H. Rayzor and F. L. Vanderburgh, the latter of whom went to Roswell on that day to ascertain the charges made by the Roswell drillers, and who found that their price in deep water districts was \$1 per foot for the first 100 feet, \$1.50 for the second 100 feet and so on, adding fifty cents to each 100 feet drilled.

An "agitation committee" was also appointed, consisting of the chair, E. J. White, B. H. Frazier and George W. Dale.

"Not a Poor Man's Paradise."

Under the above caption in the McKinney Examiner W. L. Yarbrough, who paid the Canyon City Reunion and parts of New Mexico a flying visit, (and we judge from his remarks that this was also his first visit to this country) had the temerity to give a "writeup" of the conditions and resources of the plains and southeastern New Mexico country.

His first thrust was: "Judging from the number of prairie dogs we saw on our way, there must be a full crop of them this year." In this regard we would call his attention to the fact that all of the prairie dogs were seen south of Clarendon and NOT ON THE PLAINS and hardly in the Panhandle. So much for that misleading statement. His next "impression", after arriving at Canyon City, was that "half the population seemed to be in the real estate business." When it is considered that the twenty-six counties of the Panhandle were represented there and that this occasion draws the largest number of people of any in the Panhandle, it is not surprising that many real estate men were present. We will venture the assertion, however, that there are more real estate dealers in Collin county than there are in any six counties in the Panhandle, the reason that they are not noticed in Collin county being that that county has no celebration every year to draw a crowd and that there would be no homeseekers attending if there was.

He next says of the New Mexico country, though implying that the same conditions prevail in the Panhandle, that "they can raise feed for cattle and horses, but can not as yet raise the essentials to support life." We suppose that by the word "life" he means human life. Mr. Yarbrough is undoubtedly one of those non-difersifying, one crop—and that a cotton crop—sort of men, who thinks that a country which will not raise cotton, is no place for a poor man. In this, we quite agree with him, as the men who are content to work the year 'round to raise cotton (the men who do the work—the renters—not the owners of the land) and accept as their pay a handful of receipts for merchandise already used up, are so poor that in an enterprising, get-up-and-do-something country like this we fear they would starve, but a man who has ambition and hustle in his makeup can make dollars in the Panhandle where he can not make dimes in Collin county on the same amount of money invested. To prove this we have only to cite the legions of stock farmers who are now well-to-do, but who, according to their own story, were practically "broke" when they migrated from Collin and neighboring counties. We are surprised that Mr. Yarbrough (though we are not acquainted with the gentleman) should make a statement inferring that nothing "as yet can be raised to support life," when at the home of Mr. Pritchard at Canyon City he enjoyed vegetables and fruits which were raised on that gentleman's place. Mr. Yarbrough made many other misstatements in the article referred to, but, as we are short on space, and believing that a man who would make such misstatements about something he new nothing about, would have little weight among

its readers, even in his own community, we will conclude this mild reproach on the gentleman's statements by advising him, in the future to confine his writings to subjects he has some knowledge of. It is such men as he who prejudices good people against one of the finest countries on earth for the home seeker, and who need to spend but a year here to be convinced of the truth of our statement.

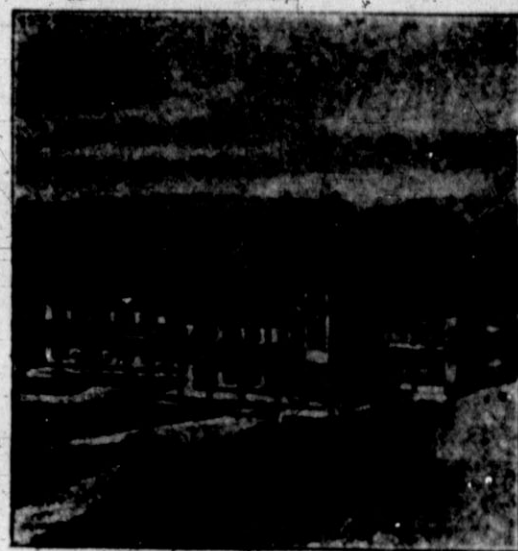

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND CHRISTIAN EVIDENCE
On these subjects Dr. A. Clark will deliver two lectures each week. These will embrace the science and pedagogy of ethics and the why of Christianity.
