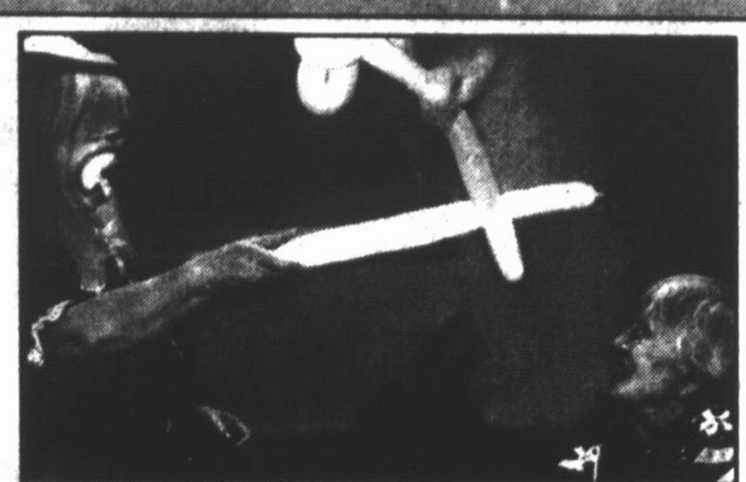

## ■ Troupe uses humor to spread message

What a bunch of clowns!  
Really!  
They wear buttons that read, "Clowning is love made visible," and "On the 8<sup>th</sup> day God made clowns."  
And if you need further proof, one has shoulder-length fluorescent orange hair and two have curly purple hair — in different shades.  
They are the Clowns Under Construction, a group of local individuals who have chosen a clown ministry as a method of Christian outreach.  
Two members of the troupe, Twinkles and Luvey, decided to attend a clown convention in Houston this past January. They asked a couple of others they thought might be interested and the "construction" work was begun to create a clown ministry.  
The troupe, which now includes six members, has established its "pecking" order and each clown has chosen their own character, developing a face and costume around that character.  
Luvey is the white-faced clown, which means she is the head clown at the top of the pecking order.  
She is followed by the "auguste," Twinkles, Daisy and Pepper.  
Lowest in the clown order are the hobos. That means they are the clowns who are the brunt of all the jokes, the ones who get the pie in the face. Hokie and Bubba fill this role with Clowns Under Construction.

Pepper chose her name because she is "on fire for the Lord."  
Twinkles picked her name because "God used the star to guide the Wise Men to Jesus and I want Him to use me to guide people to Jesus."  
Luvey got her name because she "loves to hug people's necks."  
Hokie's name came about because "when I found out about the plan of salvation, I was asked to be part of God's family and I said, 'Hokie, dokie.'"  
Daisy selected her name because she wanted her character to remind people that "God grew everything and since I'm a very simple person, I chose the most beautiful of the simple flowers, the daisy."  
Bubba is the newest member of the troupe and his character is still "under construction." He just knew that he wanted to be a hobo clown.  
"You can be anything when you get the red nose on," Twinkles said. "When you get in behind the makeup, you are a whole different person."  
"At the clown convention, we found out how to pick a character and how to get started, but the more you perform, the more you learn and add to your routine."  
Luvey attended the clown convention to learn how to get the clown ministry organized.  
"I didn't want to be a clown," she said. "I was the last one to decide on a character and a costume."  
Twinkles said the troupe had promised

Luvey that when they get organized, she can be the straight person.  
"But I don't want to now," Luvey said.  
As a part of their ministry, the clowns do songs and skits with Christian messages. A favorite part of what they do is songs with secular tunes and religious words. One is the tune to "YMCA" with the words "Why Not Today," and another is the theme music for Monday Night Football with the words, "Are You Ready for the Rapture?"  
They perform the numbers to sound tracks and are trying to get a sound system together now. "Donations are gladly accepted," Hokie said.  
They have kept adding to their routine so that now they have enough skits, jokes and songs to last about an hour.  
This includes twisting balloons. Clowns Under Construction took part in "Balloons Across America" last Wednesday by donating an hour of their time to twisting animals and other sculptures for residents of King's Manor.  
"We have so much fun, probably nobody enjoys it as much as we do," Twinkles said. "When we were performing at Bible school, I told my husband there was one little girl who looked at me and said, 'I'm so glad that's not my mother.'"  
His response was that the little girl didn't say anything, but Twinkles told him she knew the little girl had said it in her heart.  
At the conclusion of Bible school, Twinkles' husband asked the little girl how she liked the

## Deadline nears for registration

Voters who want to cast ballots in the Nov. 7 general election have until Tuesday to register.  
Registration closes at 5 p.m. Tuesday at the Deaf Smith County Clerk's Office in the courthouse, 235 E. 3<sup>rd</sup>. Tuesday also is the final day for voters to apply for a mail ballot.  
Voters will find some changes this year. Precincts 3 and 8 have been consolidated. In July, County Clerk David Ruland filed a preclearance report with the U.S. Justice Department seeking approval to combine Precincts 3 and 8. He received word last week that the federal government has approved the request.  
Precinct 8 is in the sparsely populated western portion of the county and the number of registered voters has dropped to 59, with fewer than 25 casting ballots in elections.  
In the preclearance report, Ruland contended the expense of opening the Precinct 8 polling place in Walcott School cannot be justified by the normal turnout. With the Justice Department's OK, the voters in former Precinct 8 will cast ballots at Hereford Junior High School, the Precinct 3 polling station.  
Early voting will be Oct. 23-Nov. 3.  
There will be three contested races for Deaf Smith County offices.  
• Incumbent Wayne Betzen, who narrowly survived a challenge in the Republican primary, will face Democrat Armando Gonzales in

**Navy gives computer contract to Texas firm**

WASHINGTON — In a bold move to privatize its computer services and strengthen its defenses against hackers, the Navy awarded a contract potentially worth \$9 billion to a Texas company to link hundreds of separate Navy and Marine Corps computer networks into a single, seamless system.

The contract, awarded Friday to Electronic Data Systems Corp. of Plano, Texas, is the largest of its kind ever issued by the government, Navy Secretary Richard Danzig said.

This marks the first time in the computer age that a branch of the military has turned over to a private company the responsibility and risk of operating and maintaining its entire network of computer systems.

The new information system, known as an intranet, is seen by the Defense Department — whose thousands of computer networks are the largest and most far-flung in the world — as a model for the military as a whole.

The new system is expected to be fully operational by June 2003.

The contract is for a guaranteed minimum of \$4.1 billion over five years, although Danzig said that probably will be about \$6 billion. The Navy can extend the contract for another three years for a minimum of \$2.8 billion. The winning bid was announced after the closing of regular trading on the New York Stock Exchange.

**Aeromexico jet crashes upon landing, killing six**

MEXICO CITY — An Aeromexico plane carrying 88 people skidded out of control as it was landing in heavy rain on the Texas-Mexico border, slamming into cars and through houses. At least six people in its path were killed, including a woman and her three young children.

The 83 passengers and five crew on the DC-91 escaped with only scrapes and bruises, climbing out of the crumpled plane, which laid to rest in a ditch after crashing Friday evening.

It wasn't immediately clear what caused the accident in Reynosa. Airline spokeswoman Alejandra Gonzalez said the pilot put on the brakes but the plane didn't stop. In a statement earlier, the airline blamed the rain, saying "the climatic conditions caused the plane not to brake."

Airport manager Silverio Ruiz told the government news agency Notimex that the braking system had failed. Later, he told Notimex that the airport's short runway could have contributed to the crash, saying it is the shortest in the country. It was also soaked from heavy rains from tropical depression Keith.

"Please tell my family I'm OK," passenger Raul Galuvez told Mexico's national Radio Formula.

At least 60 of the passengers and four crew were treated for minor injuries at hospitals in Reynosa

— let Ashley learn poise and get familiar with the stage," Kim said. "She (Anderson) was talking about doing head shots and resumés, but we weren't really wanting to do that.

"I said, 'You know, we really just want to take the classes. I don't want her to become the next little model, I just want her in some classes.' So, in the beginning of August, they called us and said they're having a class.

"We hadn't done anything, and it was a free class, so we said, 'Sure, let's go,'" Kim said.

When they got to the class, they were amazed to find 30-40 people there.

"They're dressed up, they have their portfolios, they have their resumés — and I was thinking, 'OK, what are we doing?'"

the race for Precinct 1 commissioner. In the March primary, Betzen eked out a one-vote victory over former Precinct 1 foreman Alfred Ortiz. On the Democratic side, Gonzales defeated Joe Henry in a runoff to earn a spot on the Nov. 7 ballot.

Incumbent Sheriff Joe Brown, a Democrat, will try to fend off the challenge of Republican Brent Harrison, a sergeant on the Hereford Police Department.

Democrat Teresa Garth will meet Republican Jeannine Zimmerman in the race for county tax assessor/collector.

Although no Democrat in the 19<sup>th</sup> Congressional District stepped forward to challenge incumbent Larry Combest, the Lubbock Republican won't have a completely free ride to re-election.

Libertarian John Turnbow, a Lubbock physician, has pledged to wage a "vigorous" challenge to Combest and will "attempt to motivate the thousands of people who no longer vote because they think their vote makes no difference."

With no Democrat in the race, Turnbow has said he believes he has a "legitimate chance" of unseating Combest.

Other than Democratic presidential nominee Al Gore, only one other Democrat is listed on the statewide ballot — perennial candidate Gene Kelly of San Antonio is challenging incumbent Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison for the U.S. Senate.

**C TRICK: Sort of a Memoir**

**Dallas columnist spotlights editor's Berlin memories**

Don Cooper, Hereford author and managing editor of the *Hereford Brand*, had his book, *C Trick: Sort of a Memoir*, included recently in a review by *The Dallas Morning News* columnist Larry Powell.

Powell, who had previously worked with Cooper at the *Texarkana Gazette*, said, "Texarkana, with the Texas-Arkansas state line running right through it, is a divided city. As it turns out, Texarkana was not Don's most significant encounter with a divided city."

Cooper's recently published book is about his time in West Berlin as a "supersecret" German translator with the U.S. Army Security Agency. "C Trick" refers to the work shift on The Hill, a Cold War electronic eavesdropping facility run by the Americans in the British sector.

In his review, Powell stated that the tone for *C Trick* is set early when Cooper quotes a fellow enlisted man known as "Hairy Ranger" who said, "Every day spent in the Army is a day of my life that's wasted."

The book gives a glimpse of Cold War West Berlin and personal and official shenanigans that made up the military experience from Cooper's point of view.

And the book is filled with nicknames: Rock Weed, Shakey, Blackie, Big Clyde, Dirty Joe and a military bus driver called "Mr. Greyhound." Nearly every soldier got a nickname.

"C Trick may be a story of military conflict (most of it within our Army), but it also gives a glimpse — a tender and respectful look — at how some Berliners dealt with Cold War pressure from the mid-to late 1960s," Powell said.

Cooper's book has been added to the displays at the Allied Museum in Berlin. According to Cooper, Helmut Trotnow, director of the Allied Museum, said he added the book because, "everything else was written by diplomats and officers but *C Trick* gives the viewpoint of the enlisted men."

**New area code, dialing system starts in Ft. Worth**

FORT WORTH (AP) — Making a simple phone call will be a little more complicated for more than 1 million North Texans starting today.

Phone companies within the 817 area code switched to a 10-digit dialing system after 12:01 a.m. today. The change affects all of Tarrant County, most of Johnson, Parker and Hood counties, small parts of Denton and Wise counties and a tiny piece of Somervell County.

Calling across town or even across the street will require

dialing the three-digit area code plus the old seven-digit number, but those calls will remain local, said Jerry Alwais, spokesman for the Texas Codes Administration.

New service or new lines installed after this weekend could get a new 682 area code, but not necessarily. Numbers within the 817 area code will be recycled as they become available, but in some cases there will be different area

codes for multiple phone lines within the same house or business.

No one's existing area code or number will change. Calls between the 817 and 682 area codes will be local.

There will be no change for 911 emergency calls and calls to 1-411 for information. Long distance calls still require dialing a 1 or 0 before the 10-digit number.

The change is needed to

accommodate the demand for more telephones, pagers, fax machines, cellular phones, modems and other services.

**YOUR EYES**

**Get The Red Out**



If you suffer from red, swollen eyes don't automatically think that you have pink eye or conjunctivitis. There are numerous conditions that can lead to the same results.

A stye or hordeolum is a bacterial infection (usually staphylococcal) of the tiny glands at the base of an eyelid. It is really a small abscess, which is red and tender. To treat a stye, apply warm, moist compresses for 10-15 minutes at

least three times a day (Do not use this cloth for anything else to prevent infection). Antibiotic ointment or drops may be prescribed and in some cases the abscess may need to be drained. Do not apply eye makeup to the affected area.

One of the common causes of redness and swelling is blepharitis, an inflammation of the lid margins that causes a persistent and unattractive redness and scaldiness of the skin. The disorder is usually a form of seborrheic eczema and is sometimes accompanied by another form of eczema, dandruff. Among the most common causes of blepharitis are: poor eyelid hygiene, excess oil produced by the glands in the eyelids, a bacterial infection (often staphylococcal) and an allergic reaction. Good eyelid hygiene and antibiotics when necessary will treat the condition.

### Will violence derail Mideast peace effort?

The violence that has convulsed the Middle East since late last week has given Israelis and Palestinians alike a frightening replay of the bloodshed that scarred the region for so many years. The question now is whether the fighting will prove to be a temporary setback in the drive to make peace or a terminal point in negotiations. The recent experience of Northern Ireland suggests that violent outbursts need not upend a determined effort to settle a prolonged conflict, but heroic work will be required by Israeli, Palestinian and American leaders to save the Middle East peace talks. That can begin at the planned meeting in Paris on Wednesday of Prime Minister Ehud Barak of Israel, Yasir Arafat, the Palestinian leader, and Secretary of State Madeleine Albright.

There must be a quick cessation of violence. Mr. Arafat and Mr. Barak should take urgent measures to halt the clashes that have left at least 48 dead and hundreds wounded. ...

Mr. Barak must forcefully defend the lives of Israeli soldiers and civilians under attack. He needs to avoid sending troops into unnecessarily confrontational positions and should minimize the use of live ammunition. Mr. Barak and Mr. Arafat should issue a joint call for an end to the violence.

President Clinton has made clear that he is ready to help restrain the violence and revive the peace talks. If the violence ends, security officials from both sides should discuss ways to avoid a recurrence of fighting. The alternative to rebuilding trust and communications is now on deadly display.

### RU-486 is a logical alternative

Abortion, under a variety of restrictions, is legal in the United States. You wouldn't think so given this country's de facto 12-year ban on RU-486.

The early-term abortion pill, also known as mifepristone or Mifeprex, has been available to women in France since 1988. ... Yet the drug has been unavailable to women in this country until now, mainly due to the political clout of the anti-abortion movement. ...

Use of RU-486 to terminate a pregnancy is not as simple as popping a pill. The drug is actually only one of two medications, administered over the course of three physician visits, that results in abortion. It is appropriate only during the first seven weeks of pregnancy, and only doctors with specialized training will be allowed to prescribe it.

So the suggestion that abortion will become widely available and private, thus removing abortion clinics as a visible target for protest, is probably unrealistic.

For the same reason, it seems unlikely that abortion will become much more common as a result of RU-486's availability, despite what presidential candidate George W. Bush suggested last week. No similar spike in abortion rates has occurred in France, Britain, Sweden or other countries after the drug's introduction.

In practice, it seems, RU-486 is an alternative to surgical abortion, not an inducement to those who wouldn't otherwise consider such a difficult, personal course.

## Politics by invitation only?

When the framers of the Constitution signed the document, Benjamin Franklin reportedly said, "Gentlemen, we have a republic — if we can keep it."

After more than two centuries, there are some signs that we might be losing our republic. The republic established by the Constitution is in danger of becoming a corporate oligarchy, with two entrenched political parties depending on the same source of money to fund their campaigns.

This corporate oligarchy is exclusive, with its money flowing to Republicans and Democrats alike and ensuring that these two political parties are the only outlets available to the voters.

That the voters are increasingly disenfranchised with their disenfranchisement has no effect on the two political parties because in their tight little world, the only voters who count are those with the deep, deep pockets.

Nowhere has this been more apparent than at Tuesday's so-called presidential debate between Al Gore and George W. Bush. While the representatives of the two wings of the same corporate party went through the debate charade, all the while harping on their superficial differences, other presidential candidates not only were not allowed on the stage, these other candidates were not even allowed to enter the building.

Ralph Nader, the nominee of the Green Party, was in Boston where the debate, which was sponsored by corporate money, was being held. Although Nader has a significant national following — and is speaking out on issues that Gore and Bush either ignore or tiptoe around — he was not allowed to participate in the debate.

The Commission on Presidential Debates, which set the rules for the engagement, is made up equally of — Who do you suspect? — Democrats and Republicans. The commission arbitrarily set a figure based on polls to

determine who would participate. Naturally, the commission picked a poll figure that was high enough to ensure that only Gore and Bush would be on the stage.

If they had chosen attendance at rallies, then Nader would have been on the stage. Last week, more than 10,000 people paid \$7 each to attend a Nader rally in Portland, Ore. The day before, Bush drew about 2,300 people to a free rally.

Nader is not the only minor party candidate who deserved to be on the stage. Although I cannot think of a single issue on which Pat Buchanan and I agree, the Reform

Party nominee should have had the opportunity to present his views on issues affecting all of us. Buchanan has qualified for federal campaign funds — just like Gore and Bush.

The Democrats (or Republicans, take your pick), through their control of Congress and the state legislatures, have managed to write election laws that have made the political process their exclusive domain.

And, the news media, which prefers the orderliness of a two-party horse race, have collaborated in this stifling of political expression. For that is exactly what it is — political censorship. If dissidents of any stripe are denied access to the system, that is a form of political oppression.

During the Cold War, the United States constantly lectured the former Soviet Union about its lack of free elections, pointing out that the voters had only one party — the Communist Party — for which to vote.

In this country, we have managed to emulate the Soviet system. The only difference is we manage to put two people from the same party on the ballot. Either way, the voters have no real choice.

And, that means we are losing our republic.

## Bottom of ticket may be the key

In the story of the two brothers, one ran away to sea, one became vice president, and neither ever was heard from again. That sometimes has been the lot of vice presidential nominees, too.

But not this time. Democrat Joe Lieberman and Republican Dick Cheney are not the low visibility campaign figures prior running mates often have been. In the closely rated contest between Vice President Al Gore and Gov. George W. Bush, the running mates could turn out to be crucial players.

It is a cliché that people vote for president, not for vice president. But in a contest so close that a percentage point or two, or a state or two, could turn the outcome, the No. 2 nominees could be factors.

That put an extra charge into their vice presidential debate on Thursday night, as they presented themselves to the broadest audience they will face all campaign.

The advantage so far has been Gore's with Lieberman, the first Jew nominated on a national ticket, the ebullient senator from Connecticut who called his role a miracle and seems to be thriving in it.

Cheney was the safe choice, the running mate Bush's people said he picked because he was more concerned about governing than about campaigning. But candidates do not get to the former without the latter, and Cheney has proved a routine campaigner at best.

He was thrown off stride from the start by questions about his votes against popular programs as a conservative congressman from Wyoming. Next came criticism of his big money retirement deal with the oil supply corporation he had headed, and the question of whether he would forgo millions of dollars worth of stock options were he elected vice president. He finally said he would forfeit the options.

Then he was dogged by questions about skimpy donations to charity and about not voting in 14 elections, most of them on local offices or issues, in the five years he had lived in Dallas.

Lieberman came to the ticket with his own set of problems, but managed to duck or talk his way around them. He swallowed his support for test runs with school vouchers, his sometime skepticism about affirmative action, his backing of private investments as a part of Social Security, his criticism of making prescription drug benefits part of Medicare. These positions differed from Gore's.

Lieberman also had problems early on when he made religion part of his standard campaign speech, pressing it to the point that the Anti-Defamation League said he was overdoing it.

Lieberman also is running for re-election to the Senate in Connecticut, with an overwhelming lead. The dual role makes congressional Democrats uneasy because if he and Gore win, Lieberman will resign the seat and the Republican governor will appoint a Republican to the Senate.

Lieberman brought a special asset to the Gore ticket: his standing as the Senate moralist who was the first Democrat to denounce Clinton in the Monica Lewinsky scandal that led to his impeachment. While Lieberman scolded the president in a Senate speech in 1998, he voted in 1999 against convicting Clinton of the impeachment charges.

A Washington Post poll published Sept. 30 showed Bush and Gore even on the question of which would do a better job of improving the nation's moral values but the Democrat's rating shot up to a 10-point advantage when Lieberman's name was part of the question.

Vice presidential nominees have been election factors before. Without Johnson, John F. Kennedy probably could not have won crucial Texas. Bob Dole's harsh campaign hatchet work in 1976 may have cost Republican votes. Dan Quayle's challenged qualifications probably did the same in 1988, but George Bush was elected won easily anyway. Gore was an adroit ally and campaign companion for Clinton in 1992.

Incidentally, that observation about the vanishing vice president came from one — Thomas Marshall, who served under Woodrow Wilson. He's the man who ventured another bit of vice presidential wisdom:

"What this country needs is a really good five-cent cigar."

# LOSING WEIGHT

As you come to grips with the nominal loss, the oldest kid comes in and offers so

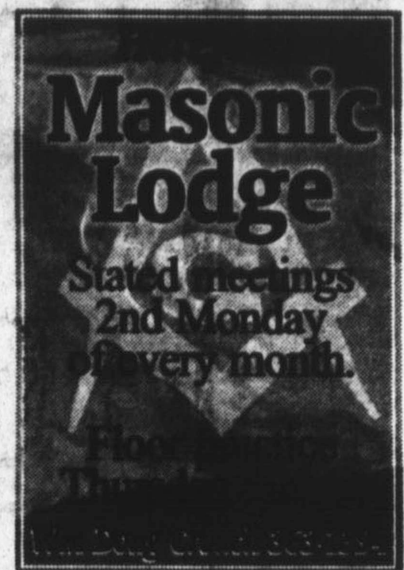
much encouragement. "Mom, all that exercising, I've been helping you do has really paid off. Can you take my jeans up an inch on either side? They just won't stay up anymore."



## Bush played role with firm that dawdled on clean up

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — An oil company Texas Gov. George W. Bush once worked for was slow to clean up pollution from leaky gasoline tanks in Florida, documents show.

Underground storage tanks acquired by Texas-based Harken Energy Corp. leaked petroleum into the water supply near a Panhandle retirement home and threatened ocean waters in the Keys, according to records of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

In 1986, Bush served as a consultant and director for Harken in Houston after the company bought his almost bankrupt oil and gas exploration business. Bush held hundreds of thousands of dollars in Harken stock and

earned between \$50,000 and \$120,000 per year.

Soon after Bush sold the company, Harken bought E-Z Serve Inc., which ran more than 900 retail gas stations. E-Z Serve stored petroleum products in more than 2,500 underground tanks across the South.

During Bush's tenure with Harken, between 1986 and 1992, environmentally hazardous gasoline and petroleum leaked from at least six E-Z Serve storage tanks in Florida, according to state DEP records.

A Bush spokesman said Thursday that all the E-Z Serve tanks were drained of any potentially hazardous material when the spills were discovered. But records show Harken was slow to clean up the chemicals, and in some

cases, did nothing.

One of the worst spills was in Plantation Key, where three tanks spilled benzene and other toxins at levels dangerous to marine life into groundwater less than 600 feet from the Gulf of Mexico and 1,000 feet from the Atlantic Ocean.

An environmental consulting firm hired by Harken to correct the problem promised to clean the site within six months. The cleanup didn't occur until eight years later in 1994 after repeated prodding by environmental officials.

A 1989 petroleum spill into soil near drinking wells and about 500 feet from a retirement home in north Florida has not been cleaned up 11 years later.

# Friends of NRA bash a success; Pheasant outlook is good

Hereford Friends of the NRA's first fund raising banquet and auction last weekend was quite a success according to Jerry Curtis, who chaired the banquet committee.

A crowd of 85 adults and 25 youngsters showed up for the dinner, assorted raffles, and auction. Curtis reports that the evening was lively and entertaining and the event netted \$11,000 for Friends of the NRA, a stellar accomplishment for a first-year function in a town the size of Hereford.

"We want to thank all of the local sponsors and donors who helped—they are the folks who made this event successful," said Curtis.

On the heels of the fund raiser, Deaf Smith County's 4-H Shooting Sports club and the local Boy Scouts are being encouraged to apply for grants through Friends of the NRA. Curtis says the local groups have a good chance of being awarded grant funds to help with shooting facilities and training following such a successful initial effort.

Friends of the NRA is part of the non-profit NRA Foundation that raises funds for local and nation-wide shooting-related programs.

At least 50 percent of the money raised at the Hereford Friends of the NRA event will remain in the West Texas region, to be used in local projects.

Already, Friends of the NRA funds have helped with \$15,000 worth of renovations to shooting facilities at the Don Harrington Boy Scout Camp, and \$2,400 has been granted to area 4-H shooting programs.

An additional \$2,000 went to a firearms training program for Texas corrections officers at Amarillo College.

Since its inception in Texas, Friends of the NRA has spent over \$500,000 promoting gun safety and teaching about the responsibility that goes with owning a firearm.

Curtis says the wheels are in motion toward another fund raiser next fall. Several individuals have already volunteered to serve as members of the banquet committee.

Despite the blazing-hot summer and lack of any significant rainfall since last June, prospects for the Panhandle pheasant season that will run December 9 through 24 are surprisingly good.

If you ponder long and scratch your head, you may remember that we did have some rain back in the April-June time frame.

What rain we received came at the crucial time for hatching pheasant broods. A lot of them got off to a good start in the local area. Chicks found plenty of insects to eat and grew off.

Danny Swepston, upland and big game biologist with the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department at Canyon went so far as to project in mid-September that pheasant hunting should be slightly better this year than last.—Go figure. If you'll recall, the area enjoyed good rainfall during the growing season last year.

Danny's projections may be close-to-right based on combine-seat observations by local farmers and my own informal "windshield surveys" along local county roads.

Driving a stretch of about two miles of county road north of Hereford the other day I counted no less than a dozen pheasants, and literally had to stop in the road to let a couple of birds get out of the

way.

In areas that are heavily clean-farmed, the birds are likely to be bunched-up in the small areas of available cover when opening day comes around.

I'm also surprised at how many reports I'm hearing of good quail numbers in the Panhandle and Rolling Plains, despite the dry weather. Even blue quail numbers seem to have picked up a bit in some areas. The pockets of plentiful quail population are widely scattered, though, and the good fortune isn't statewide.

Quail populations can look good as a season is about to get underway, and crash dramatically in short order—for any number of reasons. Quail are sort of like the sheep of the avian world—looking for any excuse to die—and they are heavily impacted by predation and diseases. Nearly everything that walks, crawls, or flies is fond of dining on quail.

So...quail hunters would likely be well-advised to get in on the action early. The season is only weeks away, opening statewide on November 4.

While upland bird hunting prospects may be decent for the upcoming season, unless something radical happens in the next three weeks, the same can't be said for waterfowl season.

Simply put, due to the drought there is precious little surface water to hold ducks and geese in this area. Even long-time waterfowl wintering lakes are dry. Without water, we're not likely to be wintering a lot of ducks, geese, and sandhill cranes hereabouts.

The scarcity of playa lakes will likely make for good duck hunting on major reservoirs such as Lake Greenbelt and Lake Meredith—provided you don't mind fighting the inherent hazards and the crowds.

Hopefully, the water outlook will improve.

# Bosox for sale

## ■ Storied franchise up for grabs

BOSTON (AP) — The Boston Red Sox were put up for sale Friday by the family trust that has owned the storied franchise for 67 years.

The Red Sox, whose rich history includes Cy Young, Ted Williams and Carl Yastrzemski, haven't won a World Series

since 1918, two years before they sold Babe Ruth to the Yankees.

They play in beloved Fenway Park, the oldest and smallest of the 30 ballparks in the major leagues with the most expensive tickets in baseball.

The Jean R. Yawkey Trust, which has owned the team since 1992 but whose namesake has had a stake in the

club for decades, has been trying to get financing for a \$665 million ballpark project, which would be built on land adjacent to Fenway.

But efforts by John Harrington, the lawyer who runs the trust, have stalled in recent months.

"The trust was never designed to be a permanent form of ownership," Harrington said.

there to pick out a receiver and make the right reads," Hodges said.

Hereford opened the game with a textbook drive down the field eating up more than 4 minutes. Hodges completed 6-of-7 passes for 39 yards with senior fullback Kyle Artho punching the ball in to give Hereford an early 6-0 lead.

# Yankees take 2-1 lead over Oakland

## ■ "El Duque" comes through for New York

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York Yankees used Orlando Hernandez's playoff experience and Oakland's lack of it to move within one win of the AL championship series.

Hernandez, pitching without his best stuff, won his sixth straight postseason decision, and the Yankees capitalized on the Athletics' shoddy defense to win 4-2 Friday night and take a 2-1 series lead.

"This is what we strive for," Yankees manager Joe Torre said. "We've been here before and had success and we like the taste of winning."

Written off by many after losing the opener to Oakland — their eighth straight loss dating to the regular season — the two-time defending World Series champions will send Roger Clemens (13-8) to the mound in Game 4 Saturday night against rookie Barry Zito (7-4).

"We've been a lot crisper ballclub since the postseason started," Torre said. "Hopefully we are on our way to doing something special this year."

Hernandez battled through seven tough innings — with help from his defense — before

turning the game over to closer Mariano Rivera, who saved New York's 10th straight postseason win at Yankee Stadium.

Rivera tied Dennis Eckersley's record of 15 postseason saves.

"For the first five innings my control was terrible and my team was encouraging me," Hernandez said. "After the fifth inning Mr. Torre pulled me aside and said stop battling yourself and pitch your game."

El Duque allowed two runs, four hits and five walks, needing 130 pitches to do it. The Cuban defector had a sub-.500 regular season, but improved to 6-0 with a 1.24 ERA in seven postseason starts.

Hernandez's half-brother, Livan, beat the New York Mets on Wednesday for San Francisco to go to 5-0 in the postseason.

The Yankees couldn't mount much offensively against Tim Hudson, but took advantage of two errors, a couple of defensive lapses and two infield choppers to score their runs.

"We certainly didn't hit it very hard or far," Torre said. "We benefited from the opportunities they gave us."

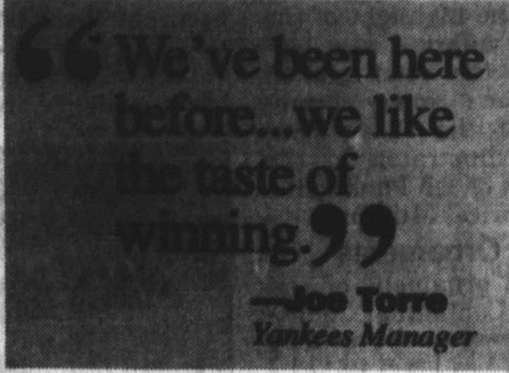
The A's, who have eight players who are 25 years old or younger, insisted that they wouldn't be spooked by play-

ing at Yankee Stadium. But their play in the field indicated otherwise.

"We knew we were coming home to our crowd, and our crowd could be very overwhelming to the opposing team," New York's David Justice said. "I don't think they're afraid. I think they just made a couple of misplays that we took advantage of."

Bernie Williams led off the second inning with a double for New York and Paul O'Neill chopped a one-out infield single over Hudson's head for his first hit of the series.

chopper that Hudson was able to field. But the 25-year-old right-hander threw home with no chance to catch the speedy Williams. Giving up the easy out at first ended up costing Hudson when Derek Jeter hit a two-out infield single that shortstop Miguel Tejada couldn't backhand cleanly to give New York a 2-1 lead.

New York added another run in the fourth with help from a bad decision in the field by Oakland. With Luis Sojo on first and no outs, Scott Brosius bunted in front of the

plate. Catcher Ramon Hernandez, 24, went for the tough play at second, but his high throw hit off Tejada's glove, sending Sojo to third on the error. Jeter gave New York a 3-1 lead with an RBI forceout.

"We just didn't execute tonight. It was as simple as

that," Oakland manager Art Howe said. "We didn't make the plays we can make."

Sojo added a run-scoring single with two outs in the eighth, his fourth RBI of the series. A's center fielder Terrence Long slipped after fielding the ball, and was helped off the field.

## ■ PBS show chronicles 30 years in the battle — with no end apparently in sight

After three decades, the war on drugs is largely a bust. That's one finding of "Drug Wars," an epic exploration into the United States government's battle to stem the flow of illegal drugs.

Examinations of the drug problem are usually framed from the perspective of the users or the cops who bust them on the street.

The four-hour "Frontline" report, which PBS airs at 8 p.m. CDT Monday and Tuesday, lets viewers hear from high-level government officials and traffickers, drug agents and drug lords, including men who once headed Colombia's notorious Medellín cartel, which the film identifies as the world's largest-ever criminal syndicate.

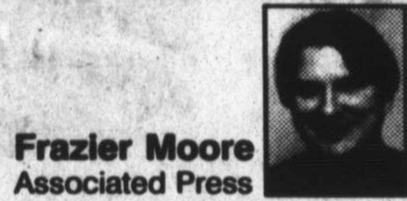
More than a year in the making, "Drug Wars" takes an inside look at the drug business, including footage of the ambush of an entire division of Mexico's federal drug police by a unit of the Mexican army protecting a drug operation.

The story begins in the first days of Richard Nixon's presidency.

"You can imagine the challenge trying to lay out for an audience the last 30 years," says reporter and co-producer Lowell Bergman, adding, "I think people will be surprised that Nixon turns out to be the most effective in terms of getting control of a particular drug, in this case heroin."

In 1970, a controversial program of dispensing to addicts the new synthetic opiate, methadone, was launched by a White House concerned that, outside its door, the nation's capital had become the nation's crime capital. A year after methadone clinics opened around Washington, burglaries had dropped by 41 percent.

The message seemed clear. With treatment, addicts could be helped to overcome their habit. And while they were helped, they no longer had to

steal to support that habit. Even so, Nixon wasn't ready to launch a national methadone treatment program. Then, a year later, he was shocked to learn of raging heroin use by American troops in Vietnam. This put a far more sympathetic face on the junkie.

With that, the law-and-order president unveiled a drug program that addressed drug abuse as a sickness, not a crime. And as the sonorous "Frontline" narrator declares, "For the first and only time in the history of U.S. drug policy, treatment supplanted law enforcement for most of the attention and most of the money."

In the film, former Drug Enforcement Administration head Jack Lawn calls for a new, centralized anti-drug force that devotes a full 90 percent of its budget to education, treatment and prevention.

"Would that work? We won't know unless we try it," Lawn says. "But 20 years of doing it the other way certainly has not worked."

In reporting "Drug Wars," Bergman stays safely out of camera range (as usual, "Frontline" has no use for an on-camera personality). But his anonymity was shattered.

He, of course, is the former CBS News producer whose struggle to get a report about a tobacco industry whistleblower on "60 Minutes" became the subject of an Oscar-nominated film, "The Insider." Al Pacino played Bergman in the 1999 drama.

# Higher winter heating bills expected

WASHINGTON (AP)— Even with a normal winter, consumers are likely to spend an average of \$190 to \$240 more this year to heat their homes if they use natural gas or oil, an Energy Department report predicted Friday.

With an expectation that colder weather will return this year after three unusually mild winters, the report said a long cold spell could strain supplies of natural gas and heating oil despite the introduction of emergency oil supplies from a government reserve.

"Potentially it could be a somewhat difficult winter if we have a sustained cold spell," Mark Mazur, acting administrator of the department's Energy Information Administration, said in releasing the report.

Mazur said, most customers, including residential users

should be able to get oil and natural gas, although some "interruptible" industrial customers — which agree to switch to alternate fuels if there is a supply problem — may encounter shortages.

"The customers may not like the price," Mazur said at a conference of state energy officials on the winter heating situation.

Additional oil from the Strategic Petroleum Reserve will ease the supply situation by producing 3 million to 5 million barrels more heating oil and diesel fuel, Mazur said. He said the EIA analysis also did not take into account the new stockpile of 2 million barrels of heating oil in the Northeast, which would be released only if there is a severe supply interruption.

"Fuel oil inventories remain very tight," said the EIA re-

port. Crude oil stocks are 17 million barrels below levels a year ago. Distillate stocks (heating oil and diesel fuel) remain 40 percent below a

year ago along the East Coast, where people rely heavily on oil to heat their homes. Natural gas stocks are 9 percent below the five-year average for this time.

# WATER PLAN: Regional water planners recommend purchasing of ground water reserve

**LUBBOCK** — A proposal to purchase a large reserve of ground water in Hartley County and/or Roberts County and the construction of a regional water pipeline network to supply water to all the towns and industries in the Llano Estacado Regional Water Planning Area are key components of a regional water plan unveiled last week during a public hearing in the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center Theatre.

A. Wayne Wyatt, chairman of the Llano Estacado Regional Water Planning Group, told the audience that it is important for everyone to realize that there is no water crisis within the planning area at this time. He stressed that area residents must plan ahead and take necessary action to assure that the region does not have a water crisis in the future.

"The Texas High Plains has received some bad hype in recent years concerning its

water resources. Articles were published in the mainstream media stating that the Ogallala Aquifer would run dry by 1980, and then by 2000, and then by 2020. Even though some localized depletion of the aquifer is expected, the region is not likely to run out of water within the 50-year planning horizon," he said.

The quantity of ground water currently in storage in the Ogallala Formation within the 21-county water planning region is 106 million acre-feet (ac/ft). This is expected to decline to 84 million ac/ft by 2020 and to 61 million ac/ft by 2050. (An acre-foot of water equals 325,851 gallons of water.)

According to consultant Herb Grubb of HDR Engineering in Austin, projections show the total water demand within the water planning area to decrease from 3.25 million ac/ft in 2000 to 2.96 million ac/ft in 2030 and 2.79 million ac/ft in 2050.

Municipal water demand,

which includes residential and commercial use, is projected to be 92,579 ac/ft of water by 2050.

Use of water for recovery of crude oil, sand/gravel washing, and other mining operations is expected to reach a peak of 30,383 ac/ft in 2000, followed by a decline to 11,824 ac/ft in 2050. This expected reduction in water usage is attributed to reduced use of "water flood" technology for secondary recovery of oil and gas.

Irrigation use in the region accounted for 3,657,740 acre-feet of water in 1990, or 37 percent of the total irrigation water use in Texas. Projected irrigation water demands for the region in 2050 are 2,562,076 ac/ft or 30 percent less than in 1990. This is based upon increased irrigation application efficiency, reduced well yields due to thinning of the saturated material in the aquifer, economic factors, and reduced government programs affecting the profit-

ability of irrigated agriculture. Livestock water demand projections for 2050 are 73,729 ac/ft, which is an increase from 34,492 ac/ft in 1990. Water use by beef cattle feedlots, swine feedlots, dairies, horses, range beef cows/bulls, range beef stocker cattle, sheep, and poultry are included in these projections.

The water needs of the region (shortages) amount to about six percent of the projected demand by 2020, increasing to seven percent of demand in 2040 and 2050. This means the region would only be able to supply about 93 percent of projected water demands in 2050, unless additional supplies are developed and/or other suggested water management strategies are implemented.

The Llano Estacado Regional Water Planning Group identified several water management strategies as possible methods to meet the projected water needs within the region.

## Reasons why October is special

Every month on the calendar is designated as a month for observing some special event or two or three or more.

As you will notice elsewhere in today's Lifestyles section, October is National Pizza Month. But it is also the month for two other very special -- an very important -- observances. They are "Pastor Appreciation Month" and "Domestic Violence Awareness Month."

How often do you tell your pastor how much you appreciate all that he or she does, not only for your church, but also for your community?

How often do you hear about instances of domestic violence or family abuse and turn a deaf ear?

While this is the month designated to especially recognize both of these, they are things that should have our attention on a daily, year-round basis.

I realize that pastors get paid for what they do. But that does not mean they don't appreciate being recognized just the same as the rest of us. I like a word of encouragement and appreciation from my boss and my guess is that you do to. And I think we all like to feel that our co-workers appreciate us for the job we do.

Filling a pulpit, whether in a large church in the center of town or in a small, rural church, is a job. And while we usually file out the door on Sunday morning and tell our preacher how much we "enjoyed (?) the message, maybe October is the month to really say

how we feel about not only the sermon, but the job he or she is doing.

I haven't poled any local pastors, but I'm certain they would also appreciate some public acknowledgment for a job well done.

If you have read the papers during the last week, you may have noticed my byline on two articles about raising money for a local shelter for abused women and children, so you will realize that family violence is certainly not a subject I take lightly.

After having served on the board for the local crisis center for nearly three years, I have heard many stories about battered women and children who have left an abusive partner only to feel like they have to return. And I know that what I have heard is only the tip of the iceberg.

The movies and commercials that appear frequently on television are not from some writer's imagination. They are real stories -- or based on real stories -- of domestic violence that is so prevalent in our nation and the world.

We must all take an active part if this abuse is to be halted. Like one commercial says, the children in a household with an

abusive parent don't have much choice but to sit by and listen. (And sadly, to learn the abusive behavior.) But as adults, we can take steps to help these women and children -- and, in some instances, the men -- who are victims of abuse.

Hereford is not immune to this violence. It happens here. It happens in the best neighborhoods and in the worst neighborhoods.

Those pastors you should be expressing your appreciation to for the job they do are probably trying to help some of these victims as a part of their job. I think it's appropriate that these two observances share the same month.

And I pray that some day we won't need to be reminded to express our appreciation to anyone, our pastors or anyone else, and that we won't need a special month to make us aware of domestic violence because it won't exist.

## Unique ministry aids children of inmates in Juarez prison

Hereford resident Raymond Cantu is, for the fourth consecutive year, seeking assistance for "God's Prison and Jail Ministry," a special ministry directed toward children of inmates in prison in Juarez, Mexico.

According to Cantu, conditions are very different in the Mexican prison from those in the United States.

## An Old Tool Can Be Your New Front Door

(Part one of a two part series)

**Q**uestion: What's more common than a cell phone ringing in an important meeting? Answer: Only the words "uh" and "ah" occur more often than a ringing phone in most meetings. The idea for this column came in a recent meeting. I was surrounded by a former U.S. Ambassador, a college President, a nationally known advertising executive, a bank president, a few PhDs and a vice-president or two. Suddenly, one of the heavy hitter's phones erupted.

Now I'm not good at "Name that Tune" but this phone chirped a 94-decibel version of "When the Saints Go Marching In" combined with the "William Tell Overture." And, that was just the first ring.

He quickly excused himself and slipped out of the room while his phone chimed the closing bars of "Stardust." Several of us setting around the room unobtrusively checked our phones to see for certain that they were off.

In just a few seconds the phone answerer returned. The speaker paused as the gentleman returned to his seat. All eyes were on him, so the phone answerer said with just a tinge of embarrassment, "Wrong number."

We all had a good laugh and most returned to the speaker's remarks. My mind went back to the phone.

How did people do business without phones? The phone is an easy-to-access front door for all businesses. It's versatile, portable and accessible worldwide.

Some day the Internet may be the most popular business "front door," but now the phone is number one. And because it is so common, it is often taken for granted. It shouldn't be, because using it correctly can boost your business image, bring in new business and help you satisfy more customers.

Most of us feel pretty comfortable with the phone, and probably feel we are good at using it. However, in reality, many of us could use a little help with our telephone skills. And, we're not alone. SkillPath seminars generate annual revenue in excess of \$2 million from teaching customer service and telephone skills alone.

This week we will get started on our list of 18 telephone tips to build your business or career. Remember, the telephone is like your

front door; it should be easy to open and offer a friendly atmosphere from the first word.

### Tips for Telephone Success

**Tip One** — If your objective is to get business, get a business line. It doesn't matter how good you are on the phone if no one can find your number in the business pages.

**Tip Two** — Use the yellow pages. Again, I'm assuming you're in business. Choose the category you'll be listed in carefully. For example, if you cut hair you might want to be listed in both barber shops and beauty or hair salons.

**Tip Three** — Have enough lines. Your front door has to handle the traffic. You may need two or more lines and a "hold" feature is essential.

**Tip Four** — Don't abuse the "hold" feature. Many businesses abuse customers by making them listen to company commercials, CNN headline news or elevator music. They spend time and money each month to do this. Instead of entertaining your callers, focus on getting them connected to the person they want or need to speak to.

**Tip Five** — Get a toll free number. This only applies to folks who expect customers to call from outside the local area. However, if you are trying to lure customers from across the country, a toll-free number is a must.

## Farmer experienced decades of change

### Improvements continue to benefit wheat producers

Tall Sudan grass, mules and wagons, and thrashing teams were all part of farming in the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Farmers worked the land and made do with what they had at hand.

Memories, such as a mule and plow, the harvesting crews and steam powered equipment, are rapidly fading into the past. Some long-time families, though, still remember pre-World War I days and farming techniques of the time.

Neighbors and families came together, taking advantage of the then-modern equipment and working through difficult situations, to turn farming into the multifaceted industry it is today.

Leo Witkowski and his wife Louise still have the vivid

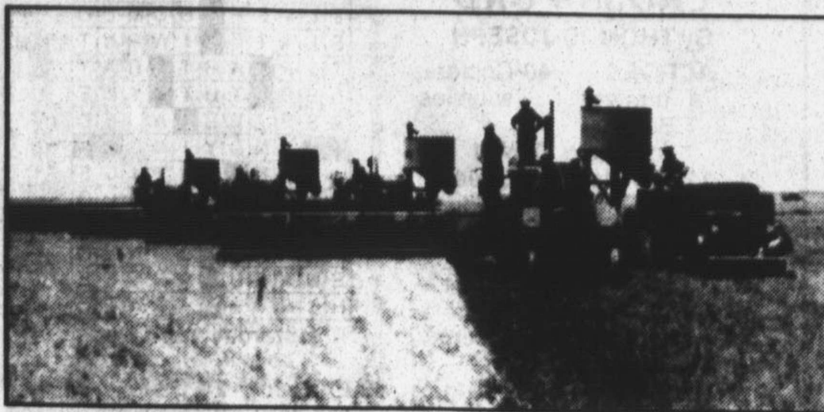
memories of the early farmers, as both their families have worked the Panhandle land since the early 1900s.

Through the years, the Witkowskis have seen farming improvements and participated in making those changes benefit all farmers.

"Farming back then took a lot more physical labor, and we got less out of a harvest than we do today," Witkowski said. "It took at least 10 men to make a harvester crew. You had a header, a barge man, one running the tractor, four pitching the grain, and a couple of others. You had to have someone to drive the wagons to the granary and unload them while others stayed in the fields. I'll guarantee they worked hard."

The Witkowskis have numerous photos of their antique tractors and harvesting equipment, but that's not where their interests stopped.

Witkowski's farming background comes fairly naturally. As a child of only 6-years-old he remembers watching the 2550 Avery tractors and the

36-inch Case separators work through the fields. The 30-bushel trucks and horse drawn combines were all part of his life.

"Back then you acquired equipment as you went along. Sometimes you had to make do with what you had. Now you just about have to have the equipment necessary to do the job," Witkowski said.

As the decades passed, Witkowski got involved with various farming entities, usu-

ally centered around wheat and other grains and saw each improvement as an opportunity, not only for himself, but for farming in general.

"They used to have tall beardless wheat that would fall over and make it hard to harvest. Now we have some of the newer varieties, that are easier to harvest and give us a better harvest," he said.

Witkowski was one of the founding members of the

Texas Wheat Producers Association and helped organize wheat farmers in Deaf Smith, Castro and Randall counties in the early 50s. He's met with lawmakers on behalf of grain producers concerned with low prices, served as president for the Texas Wheat Growers and traveled to Panama to help upgrade millers' and bakers' knowledge of U.S. wheat.

He has met with U.S. presidents and foreign dignitaries trying to improve markets, varieties and use of wheat. He's promoted agricultural pursuits through his support of local 4-H and FFA groups.

Witkowski attributes his success in the wheat industry to his years at Texas A&M University where he received a degree in agronomy and minor in ag-engineering.

Later that degree helped him buy some of his first land when he impressed a landowner who was looking to sell his land.

"Mr. Kinney was very impressed with the fact Leo had graduated from A&M. And that he worked so hard. He didn't

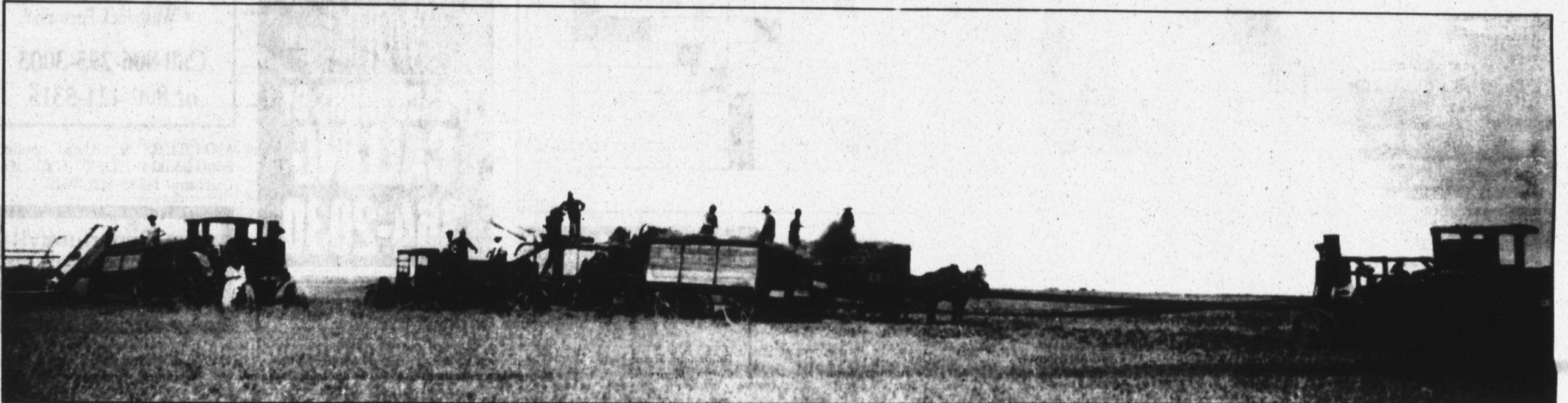
waste time going back to the house for lunch, but instead had the meals brought to the fields," said his wife, Louise.

From that first farm Witkowski went on to bigger and better things. He farmed as many as 5,300 acres in Castro County and another 674 acres in Deaf Smith County where he grew wheat, grain sorghum and corn.

A farming accident in 1985 caused him to quit farming, but he never lost his interest in his life's work. He still enjoys seeing and learning about the progress of the wheat industry.

Witkowski sympathizes with young people who want to get into farming, knowing financing now causes would-be farmers to look elsewhere for a job.

"You used to be able to borrow money on a good name and a handshake. You can't do that anymore," he said. "You gotta have the backing before you get started. But, farmers have to keep going. We can't look back or stop the progress."

## Farmers bolster crop insurance

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — Enticed by higher federal subsidies and fearful of a deepening drought, Kansas farmers have dramatically bolstered insurance coverage on their 2001 winter wheat crop as they seed parched fields.

"They are just selling crop insurance hand over foot out here because it is hot and windy," said Vance Ehmke, a Lane County farmer who is planting 2,000 acres of winter wheat.

In 25 years of farming, this is the first time Ehmke has bought insurance on his wheat crop. In the past he had carried minimal catastrophic insurance provided by the government for a small processing fee.

"It is pretty gruesome out here," Ehmke said. "I've seen some fields where there is

not one chance in a trillion of getting a stand — and I guarantee you those guys are getting crop insurance."

Kansas wheat growers this year paid a 30 percent increase in gross premiums compared to last year — most for added insurance coverage of their crop, said Gregg Classen, vice president of Rain and Hail Insurance Co. in Omaha.

His firm is a major insurer of Kansas farmers, with 30 percent of the market share in Kansas for crop insurance. Classen said the biggest increase is among farmers who have upped their usual insurance to take advantage of higher government subsidies for policies of 70 percent or 75 percent coverage.

The big factor behind the decision to bolster insurance coverage is recent federal leg-

islation that dramatically increased their subsidies for higher levels of insurance. Classen said.

For example, the U.S. Department of Agriculture pays 59 percent of the premium for a farmer who buys coverage at the 70-percent level, said Art Barnaby, agriculture economist at Kansas State University Research and Extension.

Many are also taking advantage of relatively new crop

insurance policies guaranteeing not just a level of production but a minimum price for their crops.

Ehmke said higher crop coverage is driven not by the insurance companies, but by the producers themselves.

Classen said his insurance company is advising farmers that they should plant — even if it is in the dust — if they hope to collect come spring on a claim for a poor crop.

## TBSWCD elects director

The purpose of the Tierra Blanca Soil and Water Conservation District is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on agricultural lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers, ranchers and local community entities on conservation matters.

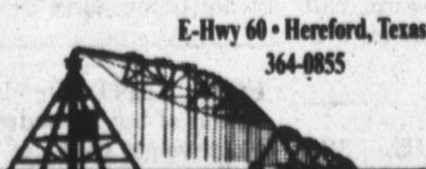

Mexico City: I was cut out of a multimillion dollar will because I was a drug addict. Some time later, I checked into rehab, and have been clean and sober for the last 13 years.

Chanute, Kan.: I had a

handicapped sister who lived to be 77. Thirty years ago, our parents left their entire estate to our brother with the understanding that he and his wife would always care for our handicapped sister. My brother died five years ago.

When my sister became terminally ill, my sister-in-law said I was responsible for the bills because it was not HER relative. Now my sister-in-law has my parents' farm and everything they owned. I have nothing but attorney's bills. Verbal agreements are worth nothing.

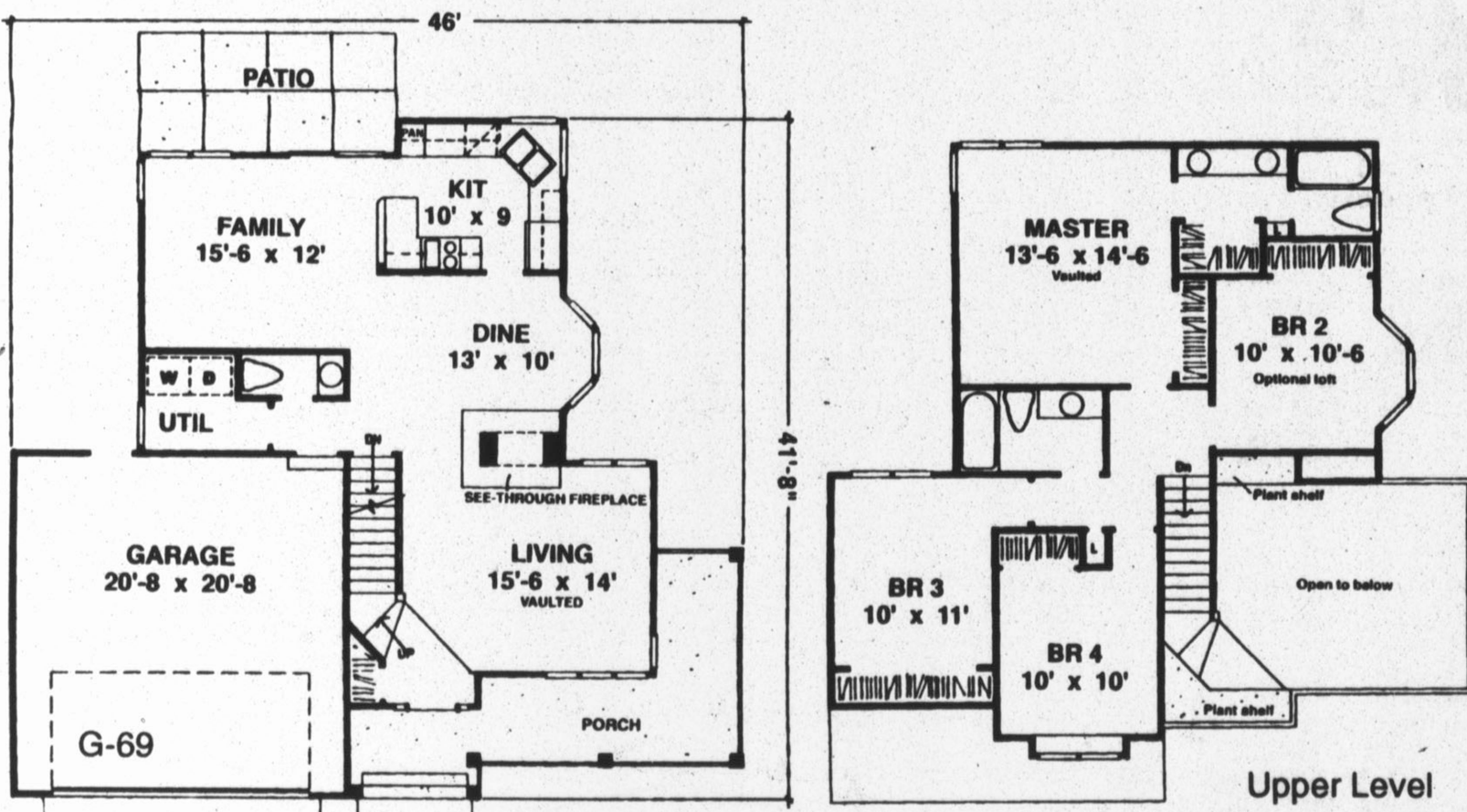

## Rigby and A&E's Peter Pan soars and enchants

Cathy Rigby, who first flew into international fame as a gymnast at the 1968 Olympics, is still hoisting herself through the air in a leotard. What's far more shocking is how good she is at it.

At 47, Rigby looks as if she's spent much of the past few decades as a Neverland resident. In the last 15 years, Rigby has played Peter Pan 2,500 times. And one *Peter Pan* performance at the La Mirada Theatre was taped to be broadcast for the first time Sunday, Oct. 8, on A&E Network.

Even those who have Mary Martin's acclaimed performance emblazoned in their memories will likely be won over by Rigby. Rigby's *Peter Pan* is, not surprisingly, extremely athletic.

"The physical aspect of the show is just so frigging demanding," Rigby says. "And eight shows a week. The first six months, my knees hurt, my back hurt. Everything hurt. Then it gradually went away. ... You just have to get through the pain a little bit."

Rigby's so nimble that she pulls a few Fred Astaire moves such as walking on the edges of chairs. She also assumes the strutting stance of a young boy.

Part of that, she says, is "growing up tomboyish. The physical aspect is what I did and what I do. As much as it is the walk, it is the stillness, the quick movements little boys will move and move and move and stop, with no attitude. If you can find that within yourself, you really do find the kid inside."

Adults may shy away from this because Sir James M. Barrie's novel has long been a syrupy staple at schools and community theaters. But this musical manages to enchant even those cranky enough who usually root for Nana the dog to make a snack out of Tinkerbell. Thankfully, Tinkerbell is but a light and tinkly sounds in this version. And Tinkerbell calls Wendy (Elisa Sagardia) a "silly ass."

*Peter Pan* is intended for the gentlest viewers. Even the most fearful of children won't fret when the crocodile appears because he's so obviously an actor (Rigby's son Bucky) in a croc suit. The play is truly a family affair, for

Rigby's daughters Theresa and Kaitlin play Jane and a mermaid, respectively. Bucky also wears a fluffy dog suit for his role as Nana. And despite these somewhat precious touches, this musical does not talk down to those old enough to remember Rigby garnering 12 medals in international gymnastics competitions.

The incomparable Jerome Robbins did the original Broadway choreography, and Patti Colombo changed it for this rendition. The result is terrific, particularly when Dana Solimando takes the stage as Tiger Lily. The other breakout performance is Paul Schoeffler, who's a wonderful, scurvy Capt. Hook. And John Iacovelli's sets, particularly the Darling children's Victorian nursery, are exquisite.

"The James Barrie novel is so rich, and it is as much the psychological side as much as it is the light and wonderful flying and fun and adventure," Rigby says. "We tried to add more of a contrast and you saw more of the character. Hook was funny and a bad guy. Neverland is a wonderful place to visit and also very dangerous. If you add those colors to it, it is richer and more fun to watch and you also get to see the different aspects of Peter. He has everything a child could want. He flies and he has a band of lost boys and they play and they build homes underground. But everybody leaves him and he doesn't have the very thing he longs for — a mother and a father and a family."

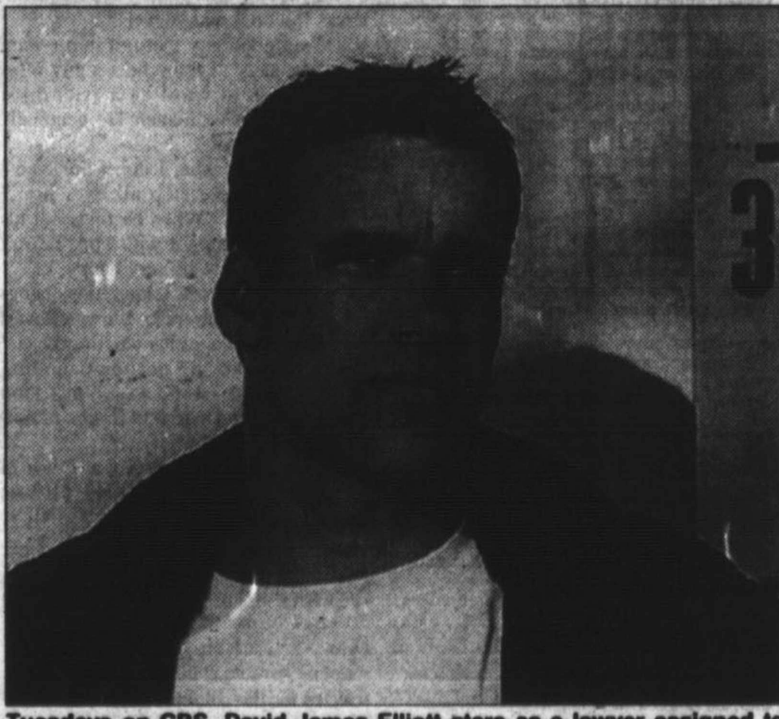
