Agoraphobia typically involve clusters of situations that include being outaside the home alone, being in a crowd or standing in line, being on a brid
or automobile father is agoraphobic, and for her, the computer and the Internet allow her to world and communicate freely with anyone whom she encounters on the World Wide Web. Thanks to the Internet, Schulz has become a published writer, winning awards for her
poetry, constructs crossword puzzles and participates in writers groups.
"As long as I am in the house with no strangers, I do fine," Schulz said in a computer interview. "Family members and people
that I know, $I$ do fine well, usually. If that I know, 1 do fine - well, usually. If
someone angered $m e$ by getting too close and coming to fast, I tend to avoid him or her." Unlike people who are manic depressive or who have eome physical ailments, agoraphobics
don't have "goods ior "bad" days, their lives seldom change, day in and day out.
According to psychologists, the criteria for
agoraphobia include anxiety about being in
to lose my temper." ${ }^{\text {I }}$ was never really active socially, although I "I was never really active socially, although I enjoyed conventions, for instance, going to the theater, games and other activities. I shunned people some, but not to the extent that I did before diagnosis.
"I tend to get furious when people come at me. If a person just has to approach me, he or
she should walk at an angle, perhaps to anshe shours waik at an angle, perhaps to an-
other person and then walk parallel a few feet to the left or right.
"I enjoy playing 42 with family members and going for drives and trips to Colorado. Id like
to visit my children, but I just can't go on a public conveyance,", she said.

Healt a cer Health Care Financing Administration
does not make comforting bedtime reading
The report's main conclusion: Nursing home in inthe United Scanclusion: Nursing are terribly
understafted understaffed. And not just some of them. The HCFA
report concluded that more than 92 percent of the nursing homes in the nation fall below minimal nurse-aide staffing standards to provide optimal care ... . .ime
... The study ... has been a long time coming. Congress asked for a study on the minimum requirements for nursing staff in relation to patients a decade ago
and gave the executive branch two years to come up with the figures. Five years
after the 1992 deadline, the study started. There are 1.6 million patients in 17,000 nursing homes in the nation. Florida

of nursing homes meet or exceed state of nursing homes meet or exceed state
standards. But it isn't so quick to ac-

museum will bring together 100 of Bugbee's finest works in oil, watercolor, pen-and-ink, Bugbee portrayed historic and then-contemporary Southern Plains life, including cowboys, American Indians, and

At the suggestion of his cousin, cattleman T.S. Bugbee, Harold Dow Bugbee came to the Texas Panhandle from Lex-
ington, Mass., in 1914 with ington, Mass., in 1914 with
his parents. He studied at his parents. He studied at
Texas A \& M College in 1917 and the Cumming School of
Art in Des Moines, Art in Des Moines, Iowa, in
1920.
Advised by cattlemen Frank
Collinson and Charlese Goodnight, Bugbee Charlese the landscape and wildlife of
