Jpperclasswomen Can Forget Curfew

Upperclasswomen at West women residents who are Texas State University will no dissatisfied with the present longer be required to keep curfew system. dormitory hours-if their parents agree.

A student-advanced proposal that the present curfew system be abolished was approved Wednesday by the university Board of Regents.

The proposal was made by the Women's Residence Hall Council after 92 per cent of the 566 coeds responding to a poll favored self-determined hours.

The new hours would affect only sophomore and junior students who have written parental permission to keep self-determined hours. Seniors and 21-year-old residents do not need this permission.

Dormitory hours for upperclasswomen now in force are 11:30 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 1:30 a.m. Friday and Saturday. Freshmen women would continue to have restricted hours.

Under the proposal, a security officer would be hired to admit students to their dormitories after midnight upon presentation of proper identification

Male students living on campus are not required to keep hours. In a statement to the regents, the student life office said the "poll was taken as a result of great demand by "It is the feeling of the

(curfew) committee, which also reflects the desire of the women residents, that self-determined hours would be of definite benefit to the university. Many have expressed the opinion that, if self-determined hours were instigated, they would move back on campus.

The statement added the poll results show the women dormitory residents "strongly feel that such a program is desirable and we feel benefits to the university will be in favor of the program and any complications can be worked out."

The regents also approved a \$5 assessment to all residence hall students at the beginning of each semester for a "student entertainment card."

The card will admit the students to two major concerts and any additional concerts Committee



The church became debt free once again in 1953, and already plans were being made for the building of a new school.

At the beginning, school classes were held in various buildings until permanent quarters were built in 1926-27, near the original church The building now houses the Deaf Smith County Museum.)

The Sisters of the Atonement continued to serve St. Anthony's School until 1938. The school was then placed in the hands of the Sisters of the Incarnate-Word of the Blessed Sacrament from Victoria, Texas until 1942 when the Sisters of St. Francis from Amarillo, now called Franciscan Sisters of Mary Immaculate, took charge and have continued since that time.

The original school served, educating eight grades of students, until 1955; when a larger building costing \$170,000, a convent and .rectory, all totalling \$274,750, were dedicated at the sight of the new church property.

S.A. directed the building of a library and science laboratory in 1968, and the facilities were of the Rev. Simeon Heine, S.A. Dedication ceremonies were

similar in size and build to the Angus. Calving seems to be of no significant problem with the breed, and it is quite adaptable to cold climates due to the long hair characteristic to the breed.

Raisers of the breed have experienced some difficulties in selling the animals in a regular ring when the buyers were not familiar with the breed, due to a belief of some buyers that long hair on an animal is a sign of worms. However, this belief does not hold true with the Black or White Galloway anymore than the belief that the hump on a Brahma indicates

that the animal is part camel. Currently the White Galloway is bringing very high prices due mainly to the fact that the breed is a novelty. Andrews effort is mainly to produce a show calf and experiment with the cross breeding to see what amount of hybrid vigor will be yielded,

streak mosaic and soil borne mosaic in some localized areas. McBride said that the county problem with insect and disease damage to the wheat this year has been very light, and that

only a few acres were sprayed. "Damage as a whole was unusually light, with some scattered reports of loses due to hail," he said.

The main disease problems reported in the county were a few cases of foot rot, a disease which affects the root system of the wheat and causes a loss in moisture consumption. The main reason for the scattered cases of foot rot was that the plants had lacked water and the disease set in, thus ruining the cells in the root system and giving the heads a drought look,

'The county as a whole didn't experience any wheat mosaic which would cause any economic damage," the agent

He added that the county wheat yield should be about average and may be slightly above average which will be a reflection of the lower acreage harvested, due to the heavy grazing out of wheat in the

"I hope that this trend of grazing out wheat will continue until prices on the market are leveled out to make wheat a cash crop and turn a profit for the farmer of the area," Mc-

The growth in exportation of wheat has not increased with yearly increase in production. McBride said that what is needed is for the supply to level off with the domestic demand so that prices can be at an expected norm.

With all the beef about high meat prices, I decided to run an unofficial study of the situation at our local grocery store.

parked myself at the check-out counter first. Presently, a lady shopper shoved her cart into the slot by the cash register. I watched her unload a giantsized box of washing powder, a familysize tube of toothpaste, a tablecloth (our grocery store sells about everything), a carton of cigarettes, a six pack of beer, a four-pack of toilet. tissue, a loaf of bread, a half-gallon of milk, a pound of bacon and a package

"I'll swear, I don't know how we're going to eat if food prices get any higher," said the lady shopper. She waved the package of lunch meat in the air. "I have to feed my family this stuff," she said. "We just can't afford to eat steaks and chops and roasts

I got a quick look at the lable on the package and went to the meat counter to check it out. The package contained six ounces of lunch meat, and sold for 45 cents. That comes to \$1.20 a pound, if my arithmetic isn't acting up on me.

In the same meat case, chuck steak was 79 cents a pound. Loin pork chops were the same price. And a special on Choice T bone had them at \$1.39 a pound. That gave me something to think about

While I was thinking, another lady came to the meat case. I was acquainted with her. Her husband is a mechanic at the garage where they charge me \$7.50 an hour to work on my

'Meat's awfully high, isn't it?" the

lady said. 'Compared with what?"

... compared with just six months ago," she said, surprised like. The government ought to do something about it."

I sensed that it would do no good to explain that six months ago cattle feeders were just starting to make a little profit and pork producers were barely breaking even.

"You're right," I said. "I think they

were 20 years ago."

"Now you're talking," said Mrs. Mechanic. She paused a moment, then asked: "What were meat prices 20 years ago?"

"About the same as now," I said. "In fact, in 1951, farmers got a little more for Choice steers than they got this year. What were mechanics' wages 20 years ago?"

"I . . . uh . . well, I don't remember, exactly," she said. "Are you sure farmers aren't getting any more for their beef now than they were 20 years

'Positive," I said. "The retail price of beef is some higher, but farm prices are no higher than 20 years ago." *

"I didn't know that," she said, wheeling her cart toward the dairy

Too many people don't," I called

I felt so good about having educated a "consumer" that I looked around for another one. A young lady was aiming her cart in my general direction.

"How do you feel about meat prices,

'Oh, I don't mind high meat prices so much, since I've hit on a system," she said.

"What king of system?"

"Well, when meat prices go up, I just shift my menu planning to other dishes," she explained, angling toward the frozen fish section.

"Sure. For instance, instead of beef, we now have fish three times a week," she said, selecting a package of frozen ocean perch.

But that fish is 89 cents a pound," I said. "You could feed your family beef arm roast for the same price."

"Yeah," she agreed. "But with the tough enforcement by a small as not having a coathook on the Ifish, they don't eat near as much of it." About there is where I called off my

unofficial survey I didn't even point out to her that an empty soda pop bottle is worth five cents' deposit today. The same bottle, full of soda pop, only cost a nickel 20 years ago.

Hearings to be Held

Flooded with complaints, the House Subcommittee on Enronmental Problems Afing Small Business will hold hearings on OSHA starting June 20. Chairman William Hungate (D., Mo.) said; "we want to identify the specific problems small businessmen are facing with the safety and health la

These hearings should prove useful in exposing the OSHA situation but chances for new legislation to soften the impact of the law are remote. The Hungate subcommittee is part of the Select Committee on Small Business, which can only. recommend legislation for processing by another committee.

committee with legislative powers in the safety and health area is the House Education and Labor Committee, which produced OSHA in the first place. The Labor ommittee is dominated by pro-

laber members not inclined to do any favors for business. particularly when the unions are quite happy with their part in enacting OSHA.

However, those objecting to OSHA and its strict enforcement will get a chance to tell their story to the Small Business subcommittee and perhaps build a record that could lead to legislation in 1973 or some subsequent year. There appears to be no chance for any of the pending bills to be adopted in 1972.

OSHA Constitutionality Upheld OSHA has already survived one Constitutional test. Four construction companies cited and penalized under OSHA charged the law was unconstitutional because so-called 'civil penalties" were really "criminal penalties" and those penalized should be accorded Constitutional safeguards,

including trial by jury. Federal Court in Atlanta dismissed the suit, agreeing with the U.S. Department of Labor that the plaintiffs had failed to exhaust their administrative-remedies. The law established an independent Occupational Safety and Health Review Commission, whose decisions may be appealed to the U.S. Circuit Court of Ap-

The Review Commission, by the way, is a new bureaucracy in its own right. Its staff already includes 25 new judges serving in various major cities, and soon the total will climb to 45. These judges do nothing but rule on appeals from those penalized by OSHA. At last count; nearly 1,000 cases were pending

Of interest today, tourists spend much time looking at the museum, which has been established by the Thomas Jefferson Memorial Foundation, a patriotic, non-profit organization. The 700-acre plantation and Monticello were purchased by the foundation in 1923 for a half million dollars.







HISTORY'S FORGOTTEN MAN

John Frank Stevens (1853-1943)

For many people, his name rings no bell. Which is a shame, for without this great American civil engineer, whom history has largely overlooked, the Panama Canal might have never been built and the development of our far northwest would have been severely delayed.

Born in Maine in 1853, Stevens, before he was 20, decided on a career as a civil engineer. He further decided that experience, rather than the classroom, would be the best teacher. So he headed west, to work on designing and constructing railroads and learn his chosen profes

The choice was a good one, for Stevens' subsequent mastery of civil engineering was highly regarded, earning him the awe and respect of his professional colleagues. In 1927, they capped his career by honoring him with the presidency of their professional organization, the American Society of Civil Engineers.

Among Stevens' many Herculean accomplishments, the three that cry out most for public recognition are his singular responsibility for the successful completion of the Panama Canal, his work on Russian railroads, and his discovery of a far northwest passage for the U.S. transcontinental railroad.

In 1905, the Panama Canal could have become one of the country's most colossal and costly flops. Plagued by inefficiency, mismanagement, obsolete construction equipment and the fear of yellow fever, the project was at a standstill

Brought into this problem by President Theodore Roosevelt, Stevens was given a seemingly impossible task to engineer and problemsolve. But, not long after his arrival at Panama, he had turned chaos into order.





Environmental Science Projects To Be Offered Throughout State

The first step in a long-range program designed to prepare studies of ecological systems, nigh school students for immediate careers or additional training in environmental science has drawn the support of several state agencies with the approval of 14 pilot projects in school districts across the

The test program, scheduled to begin September 1, will focus on health science, enabling students to study the relationships between man and his environment in terms of the emissions from both population and industry.

Later additions will also bring conservation of natural resources, and energy systems under the environmental science umbrella.

Aim of the first phase of the program is to provide students with an education which can be used in the water industry in Texas. An 11th grade student with a science background can learn what water and wastewater utilities do, expand this learning with on-the-job training in the 12th grade and then progress through additional years of college

training if he desires until he finds where he fits.

This type of educational approach has the potential of meeting both industry needs and student hopes. The approach is called Career Education-providing a marketable skill at whatever level a student stops his formal

schooling. The environmental science program was designed by staff members from the Texas State Department of Health, Texas Education Agency, Texas A&M University, and representatives of related industries.

Social Security

My brother was covered under Medicare. At the time of his death, he owed a large doctor bill which I intend to pay. Can I file a claim for the reimbursement that would normally have been paid to him

had he lived? A. After you have paid the doctor and obtained a receipted bill, you should phone or visit the social security office. The people there will be glad to assist you in filing the special claims form necessary so that payment can be made to you. Q. I have heard that women can collect some social security payments at the age of 60. Is

that correct? A. Yes, a widow may receive reduced benefits at age 60. The amount is thirteen to one-third percent less than the widow's benefit at age 62, and the amount is not later increased. A widow who is disabled for work may receive payments as early as age 50. In this case, her payment is only 50 percent of her deceased husband's amount figured at the time of his death. This applies to widows only. Q. Under what conditions can a wife receive payments on her husband's earnings record? A. If her husband is a beneficiary, a wife can be entitled to payments after she is age 62. Of course, a mother of any age can receive benefits if she has a child under 18 in her care and her husband is insured as a retired, disabled, or
