Newcomer recalls poverty stricken African city

"Seeing children and adults running naked through the streets begging for money just to buy food was heart-breaking," says Gladys Greenawalt.

Mrs. Greenawalt and her husband, Bill, who reside at 709 Seminole, moved to Hereford from Crete, Neb.

"While Bill was working as a supervisor and maintenance engineer for Seaboard Allied Co. out of Kansas City, he had an opportunity to work in Nigeria, Africa for a year," explains Ms. Greenawalt.

"We had originally planned to live there for two years but things got pretty rough. The government was changing and there was much killing in the area we lived. We decided to come back to the states early."

"It was a fascinating experience living in a foreign country," continues Ms. Greenawalt. "I never did get used to seeing the horrible poverty, though, that exists in Africa. We read of the pathetic living conditions and we see photographs of starving children, but the ugly reality of it all can never really sink in until we see it firsthand."

"If the African people were fortunate, they had shacks to live in, if not, they literally made their homes on the streets. They used the streets as their bathroom as well as their sleeping facilities. If they lived on the river, the water was used to urinate in, to bathe, in and they even had to drink the green-tinged, contaminated water."

"It was a common sight to see people beg for food for their families. Shopkeepers would line the streets of the cities and cry for people to buy merchandise," explains Mrs. Greenawalt.

"My husband and I lived in a small town called Sapel-Bendel which is located in West Africa. We had a very nice apartment and I had a steward and driver available at all times."

"Our driver was very faithful. He was trained to literally give his life for me and the steward was equally faithful."

"He performed all the household chores, did all the cooking and purchased household goods for us," continued Mrs. Greenawalt.

"Everything, especially food, was extremely expensive. We had most of our food shipped to us from the states. Just as an example to the

high cost of living, a one-pound box of crackers sold for \$3.49; a small chicken was \$15 and a small ham sold for \$100."

"We seldom had to buy meat, as all of our seafood, bread, eggs and chicken were furnished to us free," states Mrs. Greenawalt.

"Our apartment was air-conditioned, or I think I couldn't have stood the heat and the high humidity there during the rainy season."

"Other services offered to us included barbers who came to our home to cut my husband's hair, merchants bringing their goods to us and wood carvers who came to our home."

The couple brought many articles of art work with them and Mrs. Greenawalt had several long party dresses designed and made for her. She also purchased an exquisite silver necklace and earring set in Africa.

"I wouldn't trade the experience for anything. I love people and I love seeing how people in different countries live," said Mrs. Greenawalt.

"We have traveled to London and Amsterdam and thoroughly enjoyed it. I have been as far east as New York and as far west as California. In fact, I guess I have been in most every state except Mississippi and Georgia."

Mrs. Greenawalt's hobbies include reading and cooking, and she is currently teaching herself to play the organ.

"I like to keep busy," she says. "Bill and I have done a lot of redecorating on the house and plan to build an enclosed sun porch. We also share an avid interest in sports, especially baseball."

Mrs. Greenawalt is currently serving as reported in the Hereford Newcomers Club. "I have met many nice people in the club and am really becoming involved in the organization," explains the homemaker. "The club members hope to plan more activities in the future that will be of interest to all members."

Bill Greenawalt is employed as a maintenance engineer at Amstar in Dimmitt. The couple attends First Christian Church.

Mrs. Greenawalt has two daughters, one stepdaughter and two stepsons.

SWC runnerup going to Bluebonnet Bowl?

DALLAS (AP) — The Bluebonnet Bowl in Houston may get the Southwest Conference runnerup for its annual Dec. 31st game which pays each team some \$900,000.

If SMU defeats Arkansas Saturday, the Mustangs clinch the SWC title and a berth as the host team in the Cotton Bowl. Arkansas was expected to get a Bluebonnet Bowl bid if it loses to SMU.

However, if Arkansas beats SMU then things get more complicated.

The Cotton Bowl host team may not be decided until Dec. 4 when Texas and Arkansas play in Austin if SMU loses to

the Razorbacks Saturday in Texas Stadium.

If Arkansas beats SMU and Texas, it goes to the Cotton Bowl and SMU would likely go to the Bluebonnet to play Louisiana State.

Texas was expected to be Sun Bowl-bound.

The SWC had to settle for a lesser bowl because of the Dec. 4 Texas-Arkansas game, said SMU Athletic Director Bob Hitch.

"I'm going to introduce legislation in our conference that would prevent a game from being moved that late again," Hitch said. "I don't

blame Texas or Arkansas. They're doing what they think is best, and the national television exposure is good for the conference. But it just kills our bowl chances. No bowl wants to wait that long to know who they're going to get and who can blame them."

"They need time to publicize the game, sell the tickets, all the stuff that goes with the bowl."

The Fiesta, Gator and Orange bowls all apparently have turned their backs on the SWC because of the Dec. 4 game.

Close sources say no!

NFL strike settlement near?

NEW YORK (AP) — Paul Martha, a running back turned lawyer who last weekend became a mutually agreed-upon go-between for the National Football League owners and players, believes a settlement in the 57-day-old strike could come today.

But his presence in the talks was about the only thing mutually agreed upon Monday night. Neither side expressed his optimism. And neither agreed on just what the problem was.

As midnight approached, Martha stood in the lobby of a midtown Manhattan hotel and said: "Sometime this evening we should have an all-inclusive agreement." Unbeknownst to him, though, union chief Ed Garvey was at a different hotel, firing a salvo at the owners for what he called their "union busting" and claiming the Management Council had pulled back earlier offers.

"There is not a deal that is even close," he said. And shortly thereafter, Jim Miller, the Management Council's public relations director, observed from his office: "We're not too close together" and said the owners' offer had been "restructured," not reduced.

Then Martha's optimism waned a bit. "I thought we were going to get together, earlier in the evening, but things got late," he said. "I am still optimistic, but it won't be tonight. Some of the (management) people were disappointed at the remarks Ed made at the press conference. I am still optimistic for a settlement tomorrow." The sudden surge of activi-

ty was accompanied by the disclosure of Tex Schramm, president of the Dallas Cowboys and chairman of the NFL's Competition Committee, of contingency scheduling for the rest of the season, a plan calling for a 10-game season and a full playoff slate employing midweek wild-card games.

Johnson wins grid contest

Garvey said, "while we have moved considerably in their direction."

But Miller said the owners, in their four-year, \$1.313 billion offer, had simply taken money from several areas to satisfy union demands for more money in others. And he denied the Management Council had ever agreed to security for player reps.

Monday's developments followed nine days of virtual inactivity, during which Garvey repeatedly tried and failed to bring the Management Council back to the bargaining table. The owners' negotiators had walked away from it the night of Nov. 6 — mediator Sam Kagel went home to San Francisco that night, too — and said it had no intention of returning unless the union moved markedly from its position.

Over the weekend, Garvey met with Kay McMurray, the head of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, a reversal of the union's previous stance against the FMCS's involvement. And McMurray, in effect, took the owners' side, saying: "I don't think they (the two sides) will meet soon, not unless the ballplayers move further from the position they've already taken."

That's when Martha, a running back for the Pittsburgh Steelers (1964-69) and Denver

Broncos (1970) and now vice president of the National Hockey League's Pittsburgh Penguins got involved as a messenger between the union and Management Council. The Penguins, like the NFL's San Francisco 49ers, are owned by the DeBartolo family. On Monday night, Garvey said Martha's optimism was misguided and called him "someone from management."

On Monday, the National Labor Relations Board rejected a union request that it seek an injunction to force the Management Council to bargain "in good faith," an action which would have forced the owners' negotiators back to the table.

Still pending, and set for a Nov. 29 hearing before an administrative law judge is an unfair labor practice complaint alleging the Management Council attempted to bypass the union and bargain directly with the players.

Schramm said the season would resume Sunday if an agreement was reached by Wednesday. The 10-game schedule would include two weekends affected by the strike, with playoff berths decided by conference rather than division records.

Five Texans have heavy clout

If you're going to Washington and want a ticket for a tour of the White House, call your congressman. He can also untangle some of the red tape if you feel your Social Security check is lower than it should be.
But if you want laws changed - if you're an executive raving mad about unfair trade competition from abroad, excessive taxes on oil and gas production, or the decline in housing construction - you need to talk with someone who "runs the place."
Someone like Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, Sen. John Tower, Vice President George Bush, House Majority Leader Jim Wright or presidential aide

Jim Baker. Those five are Texas "movers and shakers" in Washington, according to a poll of the state's most powerful men and women.
The Associated Press asked editors and publishers of more than 90 Texas newspapers to identify the most powerful people in their areas. Assuring anonymity, the AP then asked the 168 leaders who emerged on that list to pick the 10 most powerful Texans.
"Bush could well become the most powerful person in Texas, either if he becomes the Republican nominee for president at some time or if in later years of his administration, President Reagan were to turn over considerable power to his vice president,"

said one respondent, an Austin attorney.
Baker, "because of his role within the president's inner staff, is a man of great influence," a noted lawyer said. Baker, who joined the Reagan administration after losing a race for Texas Attorney General to Mark White in 1978, is one of a triad of Reagan's closest advisers.
Bentsen and Tower "both have loyal statewide followings, both greatly influence national issues and are respected in Congress. And both have key committee assignments that give them power over defense, economic and financial policies," another survey participant said.
Wright was named in a recent survey of House

members as the most effective member and the most persuasive speaker. His colleagues say Wright fights hard, but plays by the rules.
"Jim's a fighter who goes full tilt all the time for the party, but who's never bitter in defeat," an admiring Democrat said of Wright, 60, a 28-year veteran of Congress who is next in line for speaker when Tip O'Neill steps down.
Bentsen's stock rose - not just within Texas but nationally - when he pioneered an effective get-out-the-vote mechanism that not only swept him into office again but benefited other Democratic candidates statewide earlier this month.
"Presidential candidates for 1984 are aware that

historically they have to win Texas to be president, and they are aware of the muscle he demonstrated in this election," a longtime political observer noted.
"They are going to be coming to him, seeking his help. How much assistance he gives will depend upon the extent they are going to keep in mind the interests of Texans if they make it to the White House."
Bentsen's knowledge in economics and energy areas have earned respect from other senators.

King Carl XVI Gustaf and Queen Silvia had a flurry of appearances scheduled today and Wednesday, including openings of Nordic Festival exhibits, receptions, a concert and visits to two universities.

In September, Iceland President Vigdis Finnbogadottir dropped by for two days to spotlight the celebration.

The 36-year-old Swedish king, whose role in government is largely ceremonial, is "a sporty guy" who likes to boat, ski, hunt and fish, says Lars Malmstrom, acting Swedish consul general for the Western United States. The king also is active in the International Union for Con-

servation of Nature and Natural Resources and the World Wildlife Fund.

But his hobby "is his family," said Malmstrom. The king and his 39-year-old, German-born queen have three children — Victoria, 5, heir to the throne; Prince Carl Philip, 3; and Madeline, born in June.

LONDON (AP) — Queen Elizabeth II lent a hand in the celebration of London's International Press Club's 100th anniversary, and was presented with a replica of a royal admonition to journalists.

Club chairman Peter Grosvenor, literary editor of the London Daily Express, gave the queen a copy of a proclamation by King James II warning journalists "to restrain from the spreading of false news." James was toppled by the British civil war in 1646.

"The penalty could be assignment to the Tower of London in those days," Grosvenor said at the Monday night celebration. "But we believe that facility is not so easily open to you nowadays."

NEW YORK (AP) — Michael Morgenstern, who wrote the best-selling book "How to Make Love to a Woman," says that "for one second I lost control" and socked his girlfriend in the face.

Doreen Abraham, Miss Parks' attorney, said that along with Morgenstern's plea, he agreed to a \$30,000 settlement of a civil suit Miss Parks filed against him.

The author, whose book topped The New York Times best-seller list for months, had been accused of third-degree assault for hitting the woman "once in the mouth, fracturing one of the bones in her upper jaw and breaking a tooth."

MIAMI (AP) — The fugitive former mayor of Clarksville, Ga., who was convicted in the "Black Tuna" drug smuggling trial, has been returned from a Caribbean island for sentencing, officials say.

Carl Jerry London and seven others, noted for wearing "Black Tuna" medallions, were convicted in 1980 of importing \$300 million in marijuana in the 1970s. London jumped bail, was convicted in absentia, and was arrested on a yacht docked in Aruba and returned here Monday.

London, 41, was one of two defendants who fled during the trial. The other, Mark Stephen Phillips, 36, has not been found and there have been unconfirmed reports that he is dead.

MARTINSVILLE, Va. (AP) — The wreckage of a plane that crashed in an isolated area soon after takeoff from Blue Ridge Airport, killing all eight aboard, was not discovered for 12 hours, officials say.

The Federal Aviation Administration said the twin-engine plane, flying from Greenville, S.C., to Baltimore, took off late Sunday night and crashed almost immediately.

The wreckage was spotted at 11:30 a.m. Monday when another plane took off from the field. The dead were identified as J. Edgar Seigerwald, whose Baltimore company owns the plane, and members of his family and friends.
