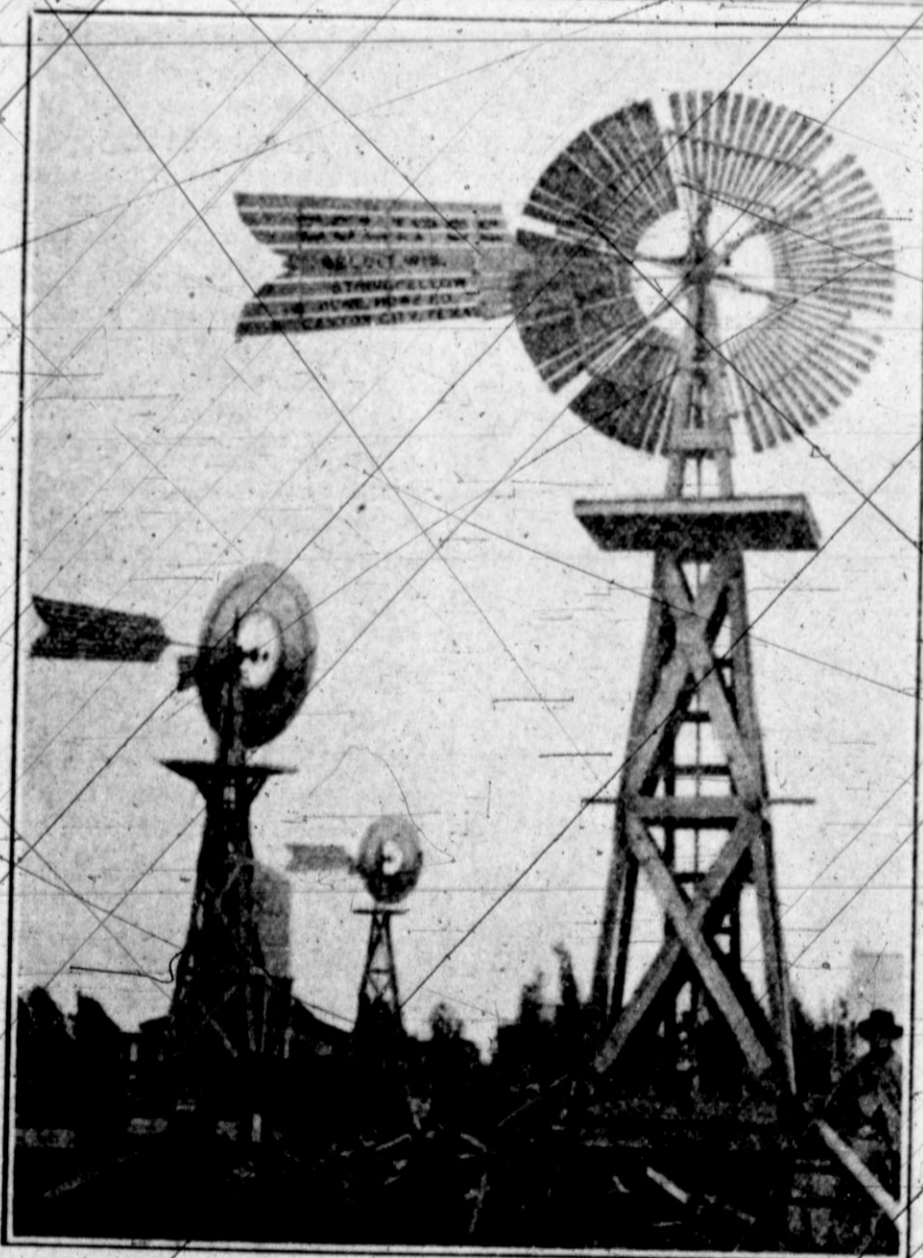

THE BAPTIST COLLEGE.

Well, the Baptist College question is settled, and we hope the Baptists of the Panhandle are satisfied with the result of their commission's work. While every man feels that his particular town should have been awarded the college, the Hereford people hope that the Baptists and other citizens of the Panhandle will accept the decision of the commission and do all in their power to make the college a success in every way in its present location. The Canyon people are to be congratulated, not only for having captured the prize, but for having a citizen who is wealthy enough and public spirited enough to donate cash enough to insure the college for his town, as did Louis Lester, president of the Stockmen's National Bank, who donated \$10,000 in addition to the \$1000 he had already subscribed. Canyon's future is assured if this loyal citizen continues to boost the town—with his cash. While Hereford was our first choice, Canyon was our second, so we do not feel as if we were entirely defeated.

There is no use of offering any reasons or apologies for Hereford's defeat. She simply offered all the cash she thought the college would be worth to her from a financial and moral point of view, together with a location and natural advantages superior to those of any other competing town, as was admitted by the locating committee and had no citizen wealthy enough to buy it for her and don't know that he would have bought it if she had. She made a good showing and one that any town could well be proud of—in fact, many of the members of the commission said that they considered Hereford's the best proposition from a financial point of view.

Here are the propositions which were offered by the competing towns:

Hereford, \$22,000 cash and 20-acre campus, or \$12,000 cash and 317 acres of land, all of which was in the city (with the exception of 85 acres, which was about one mile from town) and which was deemed by one of the most prominent members of the commission to be worth fully \$18,000.

Canyon, \$25,000 cash and 40-acre campus. (\$10,000 of this money was donated by Mr. Lester, at Claude, on the day of the decision, who made a neat little speech to the commission, and which is said to have influenced some of the members. By this statement we do not wish to take any of the credit from Canyon for having obtained the college, as she, of all the competing towns, deserves the most credit for having won the prize.)

Amarillo, \$20,000 cash and 70 acres of land.

Ciarendon, \$15,000 and 50 acres of land.

Memphis, \$15,000 and 75 acres of land.

Canadian, \$2500 cash, a building and 40-acre campus and about 1000 acres of ranch land.

It will thus be seen that the value of an educational institution is not underrated by any of the towns in the Panhandle (the competing towns being the only towns of importance situated so as to stand any show for obtaining the college) and that this country is settled with a progressive, live, energetic class of citizenship, such as cultured people delight to mingle with, and to such the people of the Panhandle extend a most hearty welcome, either as visitors or settlers; to such they offer an unexcelled climate and a medium elevation—insuring good health—pure, cool, sparkling water in exhaustless quantities, broad acres of rich farming land at a small cost, which needs only the man with the hoe to make it yield an abundance of crops of all kinds; to such they offer live, hustling, moral towns (most of them being under an ENFORCED local option law, as is Hereford) containing excellent public schools (and many of them colleges second to none, as has Hereford), a cultured, contented and law-abiding citizenship, and having many of the social advantages of the older and more densely populated towns and countries. Should you wish to change your location, we would be pleased to have you investigate our claims for a desirable country in which to live. After having visited it, if you are not entirely satisfied we would advise you to locate and try it for a year, for if you are not satisfied at the end of that time you can easily dispose of your holdings at an advance enough to pay you well for your times spent here. On that proposition we invite you to come. Could anything be fairer?

THERE is more or less agitation this week on the feasibility and probability of Hereford's obtaining a summer Chautauqua, such as is held at Boulder, Colo., each year, and this week the Searchlight will contain the opinions of our business men upon the subject. While we do not wish to take any credit away from the Searchlight for the agitation of this subject, we do wish to be a factor in helping to secure such a high-class entertainment for Hereford if such a thing is possible, and will do all in our power to bring it here. The first thing necessary to be done, after having secured the attractions, is to build a large auditorium with a seating capacity of at least 2000.

Well, the Baptist College question is settled, and we hope the Baptists of the Panhandle are satisfied with the result of their commission's work. Canyon's future is assured if this loyal citizen continues to boost the town—with his cash. While Hereford was our first choice, Canyon was our second, so we do not feel as if we were entirely defeated.

There is no use of offering any reasons or apologies for Hereford's defeat. She simply offered all the cash she thought the college would be worth to her from a financial and moral point of view, together with a location and natural advantages superior to those of any other competing town, as was admitted by the locating committee and had no citizen wealthy enough to buy it for her and don't know that he would have bought it if she had. She made a good showing and one that any town could well be proud of—in fact, many of the members of the commission said that they considered Hereford's the best proposition from a financial point of view.

Here are the propositions which were offered by the competing towns:

Hereford, \$22,000 cash and 20-acre campus, or \$12,000 cash and 317 acres of land, all of which was in the city (with the exception of 85 acres, which was about one mile from town) and which was deemed by one of the most prominent members of the commission to be worth fully \$18,000.

Canyon, \$25,000 cash and 40-acre campus. (\$10,000 of this money was donated by Mr. Lester, at Claude, on the day of the decision, who made a neat little speech to the commission, and which is said to have influenced some of the members. By this statement we do not wish to take any of the credit from Canyon for having obtained the college, as she, of all the competing towns, deserves the most credit for having won the prize.)

Amarillo, \$20,000 cash and 70 acres of land.

Clarendon, \$15,000 and 50 acres of land.

Memphis, \$15,000 and 75 acres of land.

Canadian, \$2500 cash, a building and 40-acre campus and about 1000 acres of ranch land.

It will thus be seen that the value of an educational institution is not underrated by any of the towns in the Panhandle (the competing towns being the only towns of importance situated so as to stand any show for obtaining the college) and that this country is settled with a progressive, live, energetic class of citizenship, such as cultured people delight to mingle with, and to such the people of the Panhandle extend a most hearty welcome, either as visitors or settlers; to such they offer an unexcelled climate and a medium elevation—insuring good health—pure, cool, sparkling water in exhaustless quantities, broad acres of rich farming land at a small cost, which needs only the man with the hoe to make it yield an abundance of crops of all kinds; to such they offer live, hustling, moral towns (most of them being under an ENFORCED local option law, as is Hereford) containing excellent public schools (and many of them colleges second to none, as has Hereford), a cultured, contented and law-abiding citizenship, and having many of the social advantages of the older and more densely populated towns and countries. Should you wish to change your location, we would be pleased to have you investigate our claims for a desirable country in which to live. After having visited it, if you are not entirely satisfied we would advise you to locate and try it for a year, for if you are not satisfied at the end of that time you can easily dispose of your holdings at an advance enough to pay you well for your time spent here. On that proposition we invite you to come. Could anything be fairer?

THERE is more or less agitation this week on the feasibility and probability of Hereford's obtaining a summer Chautauqua, such as is held at Boulder, Colo., each year, and this week the Searchlight will contain the opinions of our business men upon the subject. While we do not wish to take any credit away from the Searchlight for the agitation of this subject, we do wish to be a factor in helping to secure such a high-class entertainment for Hereford if such a thing is possible, and will do all in our power to bring it here. The first thing necessary to be done, after having secured the attractions, is to build a large auditorium with a seating capacity of at least 2000.

Northwest Texas Press Association.

As we were prevented from attending the meeting of the Northwest Texas Press Association last week, on account of having so much work in the office, we copy the following report of the meeting from the Amarillo Livestock Champion:

Amarillo has had the pleasure this week of entertaining a good representation of the Northwest Texas Press Association.

The visiting editors arrived on the noon-train Thursday and were met by the members of the local press and escorted to the hotels. The first session of the association at the opera house was opened with prayer by Dr. Clark, followed by addresses of welcome and response by C. B. Pash and President J. N. Rogers. In the evening the editors were most enjoyably entertained by the young ladies of the J. U. G. club at the Commercial Club rooms. On Friday morning after a drive over the city the members of the association again assembled at the opera house at which time important business was transacted and the program carried out in part. Cyrus Coleman of the Henrietta Index was unable to be present on account of sickness in his family, but sent in his paper. F. L. Vanderburgh of Hereford was also unable to be present, but with these exceptions the program was carried out in full.

In the Friday afternoon session the premiums, as printed elsewhere in this issue, were awarded, a place for the next meeting selected, and officers elected. Hereford was put in nomination in a very fetching manner by Editor Stocks, and Harry Koch made an appeal for Quanah. The association seemed to be almost of one mind that the center of the district should be selected and Quanah proved the successful candidate. The election of officers for the ensuing year resulted as follows: President, Harry Koch of the Quanah Tribune-Chief; vice-president, C. L. Stocks of the Hereford Searchlight; secretary, Orion Proctor of Bridgeport Index, re-elected; treasurer, W. A. Johnson of Hall County Herald, re-elected.

As will be seen by the notice printed elsewhere, the citizens of Hereford are asked to meet the Commissioner in charge of the Colonization Agency of the Southwestern Railway at the time stated, and have a conference with him upon the subject through which immigration as it affects our city and how to get it.

A brief explanation of this immigration movement ought to be given. The Colonization Agency mentioned was founded a few months ago by nine of the southwestern lines, including the Rock Island, the Santa Fe, the Frisco and others. For convenience the Agency was located at St. Louis, and its business is, in brief, "To Advertise the Great Southwest."

The railway lines in interest have furnished the money to maintain the Agency and its work, but the idea involved is that of mutual help. That is, the railroads will organize, print, distribute, pay rents and salaries, keep the movement going, but they need also the co-operation of the people of the communities that are to be described and advertised. This is natural and proper.

Meantime it ought to be understood that the Colonization Agency is in no sense a speculation. The railroads do not advertise their own lands, if they have any, and most of them have not. No money contribution is asked for from anybody, and would be declined if it were offered. That which is needed and asked for is a simple thing, and that is the facts about the country by those who live in it. Those who know what the Eastern farmer wants to know are the men and women of actual experience. They alone can give the facts wanted in a way that convinces the man, who, as a rule is possessed by the idea that somebody is trying to sell him a piece of the Great American Desert, and that the Southwest has no schools, or churches, and no teachers, preachers or doctors.

The sole purpose of this visit of the Commissioner to our city is to place the Agency he represents more in touch with the men and women of the community, and to ask them to help him to help themselves.

The Commissioner, Capt. Jas. W. Steele, has been nearly all his life a resident of the Southwest. He has had large experience in immigration business. Much more a writer than a speaker, he is not intending to deliver lectures, but wishes merely to talk for a few minutes with the people who will attend these meetings, so that they may better understand what the Agency is trying to do, and may help him to do it, while at the same time helping themselves by bringing more people to occupy the land.

In these hurried journeys of a busy man, Capt. Steele is obliged to conform to the hours of the trains on which he must travel. At the hour named, it is to be hoped that the citizens, and if possible their wives, and the teachers in the public schools, will meet him for half an hour at the place named in the notice mentioned.

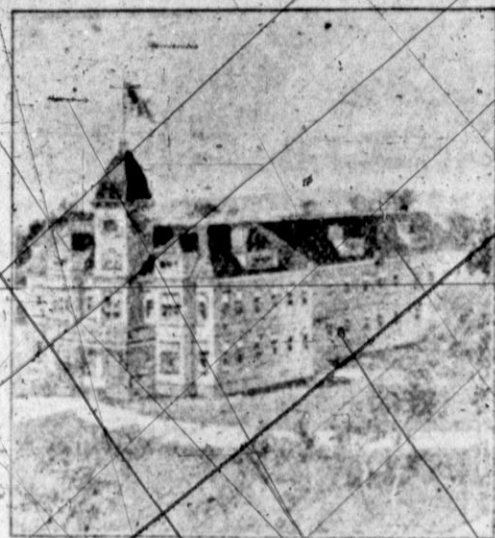

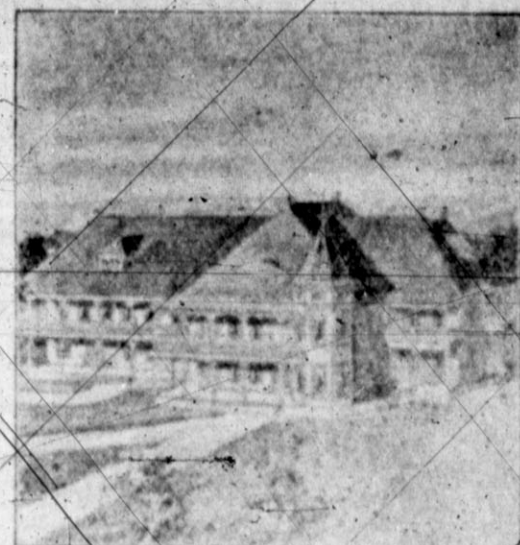

The department of Mental and Moral Science and History includes Psychology, Logic and Christian Ethics. History is considered valuable only as it furnishes useful lessons of life. The aim in this department is to bring into the student life the principles that will develop symmetrical character.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND CHRISTIAN EVIDENCE

On these subjects Dr. A. Clark will deliver two lectures each week. These will embrace the science and pedagogy of ethics and the why of Christianity.

DEPARTMENTS OF MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE

A thorough course in mathematics is offered including arithmetic, algebra, geometry, trigonometry, surveying, and analytical geometry. The science course embraces physiology, zoology, botany, physical geography, chemistry, physics, and laboratory work

DEPARTMENT OF ANCIENT LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE

Two years' work in Greek is offered. The Latin course covers four years, including first book, grammar, composition, Cæsar, Cicero, and Virgil. The English embraces four years, including rhetoric, composition, history of literature and critical study of authors

INDUSTRIAL DEPARTMENTS

Practical training in horticulture can be had in the Hereford Nursery, near the College, and as fast as they learn the business can get pay for their work

DOMESTIC SCIENCE

This is recognized as one of the most important departments in the school. It is hoped a teacher will be secured before the next issue of this paper

DEPARTMENT OF ART

Courses include free hand drawing, crayon, pastel, water

colors, oil, and china painting

DEPARTMENT OF ELOCUTION AND PHYSICAL CULTURE

This department offers training in correct breathing, vocal culture, reading, literary interpretation, oratory, and physical culture

DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC

In the different branches of the Music Department the pupil is not only taught to know correct rules of position, technique, etc., and given a thorough knowledge of the rudiments of music in the Theory and Harmony Classes, but to be able to render, in an intellectual and pleasing manner all selections whether of a simple or difficult degree.

PIANO—The piano course includes five years' work—each year being so extensive as to require diligent application to complete it in the given time, and the whole course is as thorough and extensive as is offered in the best conservatories in America.

VIOLIN—A thorough course in violin and other string instruments is offered, the ensemble work making a prominent feature in this department.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENTS

The buildings and equipment are in all respects first class. The college building now being completed is of stone and brick 117 by 70 feet, two stories, with basement for heat and light plant and work shop. In the planning, construction and furnishing of the building the convenience for study, the comfort and health of the students have been constantly in mind. The Girls' Home is finished and furnished after the most approved modern style with steam heat, bath rooms and all conveniences necessary for comfort and health. The young men will be furnished offices on their own campus and will take their meals with the teachers and young ladies at the Girls' Home.
