## F. S. A. Designated As National Defense Agency

The Farm Security Administration, United States States Department of Agriculture, has been designated as a National Defense Agency, according to word received here by Dennis Q. Lilly, rehabilitation supervisor for the FSA in Terry and Yoakum Counties.

Federal programs contributing directly or indirectly, or both to national defense have been given a defense rating by the Federal Government. The chief contribution of Farm Security Administration to national defense is its rehabilitation of farm families who have suffered the plight of economic insecurity.

"The Farm Security Administration does far more than merely loan money to low-income and needy farm families," Mr. Lilly said. Although this agency does make low interest loans to farm families unable to obtain credit from any other source, it has many other programs to assist America's rural families. Farm Security makes it possible for many low income rural people to find security of tenure, improved housing and sanitation facilities, improved diet, more stable income and, in many cases, improved medical attention.

There is another phase of the defense program Farm Security families are cooperating in the soil conservation program. They are using sound farm and home practices, rotating their crops, planning to plant cover crops, and are growing feed for their stock as well."

The rehabilitation supervisor reported that many of the land owners in Terry and Yoakum Counties have given their tenants long term leases so that live at home and soil conservation programs can be carried out. This is also a defense program. In these times of stress, long term leases--three to five years--are needed to give stability to the tenants and share croppers. These leases are beneficial to the land owners as well as tenants, because it gives the tenants an opportunity to improve the fertility of the soil and take advantage of the environmental program to the FSA.

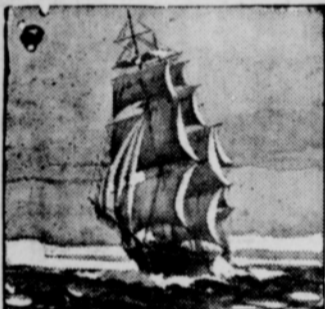

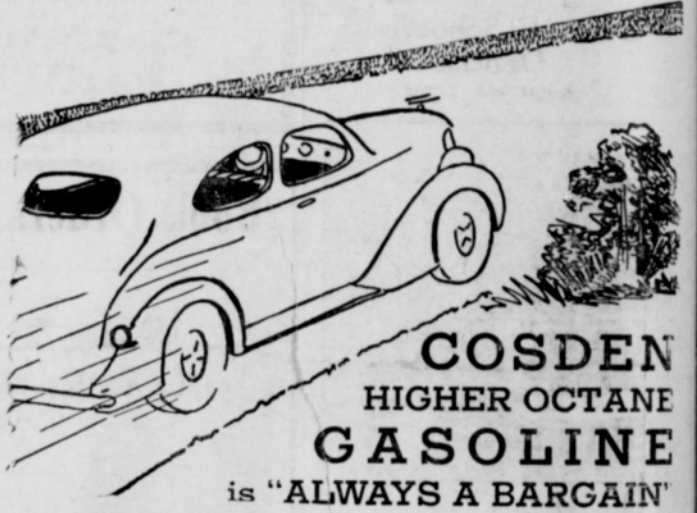
