Lubbock, April 2 (Special)-Big League Baseball comes to the South Plains next week when Chicago White Sox of the American League meet their cross town rivals, the Chicago Cubs of the National Circuit, in a regulation exhibition contest at the Lubbock Hubber park.

Fiery Jimmy Dykes, the fabulous skipper of the White Sox and a former star in his own right, has notified local officials that he plans to start the veteran Ted Lyons, Dean of American League pitchers, on the mound for the Sox. and Manager Jimmy Wilson of the Cubs-the same who stole the World Series Show for the Cincinnati Reds last autumn-has agreed to send the famous Dizzy Dean to the mound for at least a part of the game.

The White Sox, who sponsor the Lubbock Hubbers in the West Texas-New Mexico league, will present such popular players as Joe Kuhel, Catcher Mike Iresh, Julius "Moose" Solters, Pete Appling, Mike Kreevich, and Pitchers Thornton Lee, Jess Dobernic, Orval Grove and others.




