



Census Takers Needed In Rising Star Area

Census takers are be paid at a rate of 181/2 needed in this area, according to Manager of the area's 1980 census office.

The manager said the Census Bureau welcomes applications from persons who will be able to work 40 hours a week, including many evenings and Saturdays, calling at homes and interviewing the residents. The Texas Farm Bureau board of directors has just reaffirmed its total opposition to the program. The Eastland County Farm Bureau Board of Directors has

gone on record as being opposed.

According to information coming to this desk, the following are "against" the Referendum: The Farmers Union, Texas Farm Bureau, Tennessee Farm Bureau, Independent Cattlemen's Association of Texas and Concerned Cattlemen of

Information shows that 128 organizations, including the National Cattlemen's Association and the National Grange, plus 30 other state Farm Bureaus, are "for" the referendum.

A Texas Farm Bureau leader says that most livestock raisers support a program to promote their industry (the National Live Stock and Meat Board, a private voluntary checkoff program), but believe that it would be difficult to comply with the proposed Order "because it is complicated, costly and difficult to administer."

Proponents of the measure, in a press release from an Amarillo headquarters, say: "The Beeferendum is a selfhelp program designed for and to be administered by a Beef Board comprised of cattlemen. And in true democratic fashion, cattlemen who do not wish to participate may request - and will promptly receive - refund of their contribu-

overhead, (2) a specified minimum percentage of the net assessments collected must be devoted to research activities, to be determined by the Secretary of Agriculture, (3) the program must engage only in promotion or advertising that is substantially devoted to presenting nutritional information and other educational information, as well as the results of research, (4) funds must be made available to those producers not willing to participate, (5) the program must be initiated by a referendum of producers and (6) provide for the appointment by the Secretary of Agriculture of public members (consumer advocates) to the program administrative agency.

"It is the nature of government to mismanage most everything they touch," Farm Bureau said, "and I can't see throwing away beef producer funds into a quasigovernment agency directed Agriculture.

RANGER

There's been a lot of talk about the Beeferendum being a government program that cattlemen should turn down. Fact is, cattlemen had better recognize the realities of government and its involvement with agriculture and quite being naive. Like it or not, the U.S. Federal Government now sets meat import quotas, inspects your product, regulates the use of animal pharmaceuticals and even taxes you for income you make on the cattle you produce. Cattlemen and the beef industry are already caught up in the government Passage of the Beeferen-

A Voice 'For' Referendum

dum would at least give cattlemen some clout as they bump heads with government-funded consumer groups, governmentfunded anti-beef nutrition groups, and others who threaten our industry.

Yes, there are some individual farm and ranch by the Secretary of organizations who make some effort to promote beef

and protect the interests of cattlemen as best they can. But no single group now in existence has enough money to do the job that needs to be done. The Beef Board, created by passage of the Beeferendum, will have enough money to expand foreign markets, promote the nutritional value of beef. combat beef substitutes, fight anti-beef propaganda and counter the extreme highs and lows in the cattle cycle. The Beef Board will be made up of cattlemen. and they'll have the kind of power it takes to meet the opposition head-on.

Whether you think the Beeferendum is government or not doesn't really matter. The important thing is to

recognize that cattlemen don't have enough force now to influence factors that affect them. It's important that they take advantage of this opportunity to put some power behind their punch. If the Beeferendum fails, cattlemen will have to admit that they were too scared of power to grab hold of some when it was offered them.

Local Talent Has Showing In Abilene

ART-both creating it and appreciating it-is an escape for many people, but for little Lela Abernathy, it was an especially good way to get out of piano practice.

Actually, it wasn't quite that drastic, but she did prefer sketching to scales, and she's gone on to become one of the more accomplished-if lesser-known-painters in the Big Country.

Being honored as the Abilene Chamber of Commerce Artist of

the Month, Lela Shults--she's married to retired businessman and rancher Bob Shults-says she still sees it as an escape, but with even loftier rewards than when she

first took up art.

"Everyone has an urge to be creative in some way, and I was just putting mine into art," she said. "It's always fascinated me that you could create something on paper, bring something to life.

grown children out of the house and more time for her painting, Mrs. Shults says she is sometimes able to knock off a 20-inch by 24-inch canvas in a day.

Most of the works are landscapes or still lifes, the latter of which are noteworthy for their fluidity. The landscapes are more stark, particularly those of West Texas.

Of course, artistic Today, with two zeal doesn't account for her rapidity in producing works. She's also of the school of painters that prefer to use the knife rather than the brush.

The artiat prefers oils, using a wet palette knife to paint on a wet background, rather than resorting to the teaditional and somewhat "stiff" paintbrush.

In a way, the necessity of painting on a wet background forces the artist to

finish the work quickly, rather than doing it over several days. "You can't let it dry and go back over it.'

Besides demanding dedication from the artist and a lot of talent from his or her hand, the process also results, at least for her, in softer colors and freer designs.

A tree for instance, will "flow" into the sky, she explained. She gained her talent for palette knife painting from Nell Goble of Baird.

Born and raised in Palo Pinto and a resident of Rising Star for 35 years, Mrs. Shults grew up drawing and considered art as a career at one point.

Enrolling at Texas Women's University, she began taking basic art courses with plans of moving into fashion illustration. However, she got married after only a year, "and that was the end of that."

Although she loves wildlife and has done some paintings of her husband's ranch, Mrs. Shults does most of her work from photographs. Part of the reason may stem from the famous West

Texas wind. The artist recalls doing one painting out in the wilds, only to see the wind toss it onto the Big Country dirt. She scraped it off, but it apparently was pretty hopeless.

After that, she said, she "decided to do it a little differently."

While her hubby is a good sketcher when he has the time, the real art craft seems to have rubbed off on Mrs.Shults' children, Bill Shults of San Marcos and Mary Wheat of Rising Star.

Calling her children "more talented than me," Mrs. Shults says her daughter is particularly imaginative, coming up with abstract works, something Mrs. Shults has always resisted.

"She wouldn't sit in a class and just paint flowers and a vase," Mrs. Shults says. "That would bore her to death."

Both her children have duties that occupy much of their time now, but Mrs. Shults is more involved in painting than she has been for a long time.

Part of the reason deals with an increase in the time she has available for the craft. but another aspect has to do with increased confidence in her talent.

"I agree with that maxim that says you're getting a little better with each work," she said, looking over her works. "It took me a long time to realize I could do it on my own."






