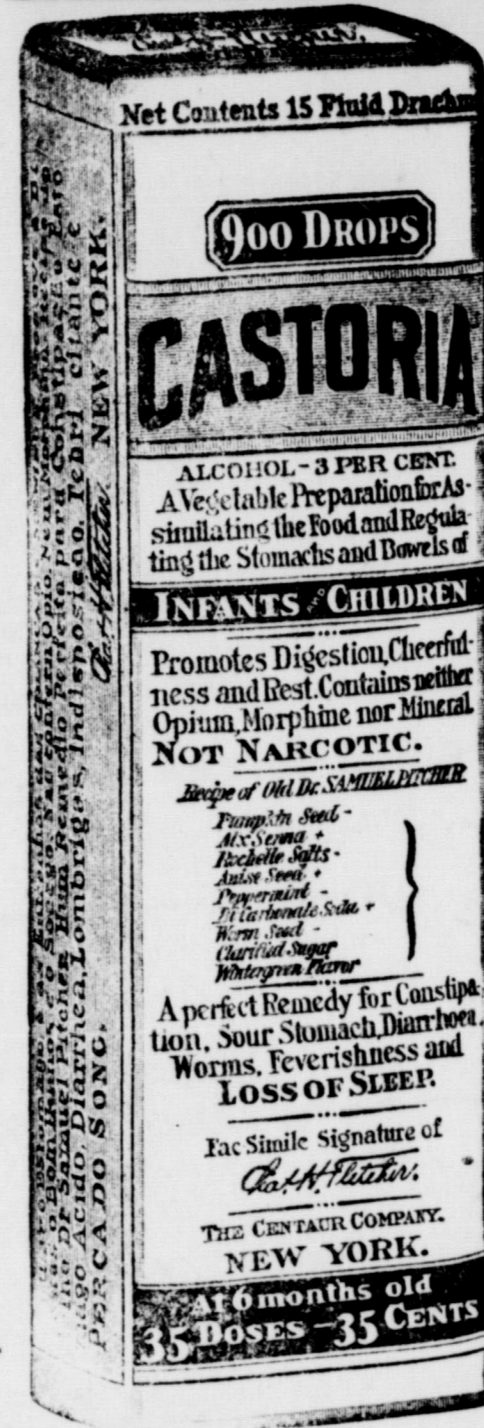
Be it further resolved that we enter into full sympathy with the family in these sad hours, when the dearest of all on earth has departed.

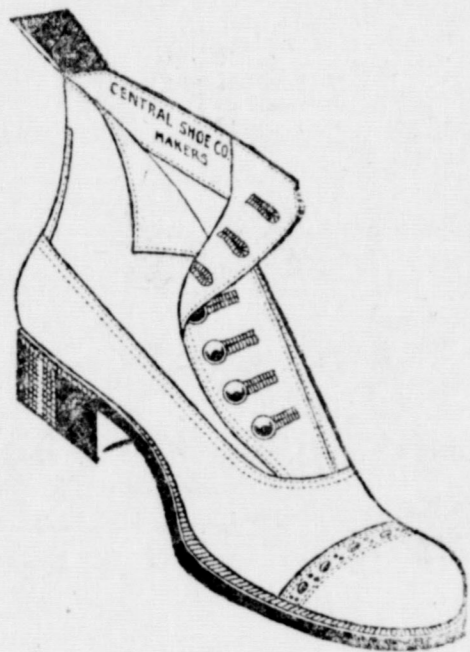

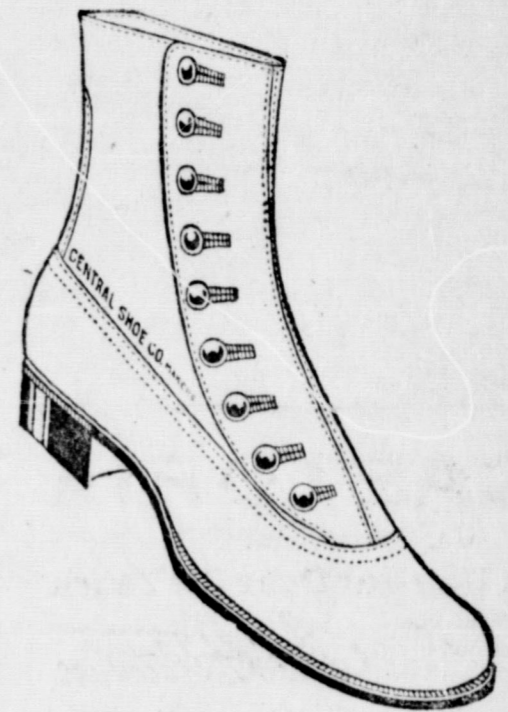
