ously animals that are able to return a profit for the feed given them. However, under present conditions, even the best of animals should not be fed to grade higher than "good", as the extra finish requires too much grain. Young and pregnant animals will have more feed at the time when their nutrition needs are most critical, helping to insure better, heavier calves, lambs, or pigs next year.

Culling will also aid the improvement of permanent pastures, especially important in the South. With unproductive animals eliminated, proper stocking of pastures and ranges is encouraged so that livestock operators will be in better position to capitalize on the use of better grazing in the future.

Another major advantage of culling is that it will help to reduce the hazard of continued large livestock inventories. They urge the elimination now, of many animals which have been kept in the herd in the past because of the general upward trend in prices.

For these reasons, close culling is recommended this fall as one of the important steps in the good management and feeding, which will help to solve the important problem of scarce and high-priced grains.

Texas Rescue 46

This time next fall farmers and ranchmen will be going to their seed stores and calling for Texas Rescue 46.

Rescue grass is a native of South America and has been growing in Texas for almost a hundred years. It is a winter annual which produces green feed when most other grasses are dead or dormant. Early ranchmen named it "rescue" because it came to their rescue when

most needed. Native rescue grass is harvested and sold commercially, as is seed imported from Australia and other countries.

Since 1941 George C. Warner and R. L. Hensel of the Agricultural Experiment Station at Texas A. & M. College have been making selections from both native rescue grass and from several strains of seed obtained from the USDA Bureau of Plant Industry, Soils and Agricultural Engineering.

They found that rescue differed greatly in height, leafiness, seed production and resistance to disease. Out of these tests they came up with a selection they named Texas Rescue 46.

In the field tests with other native and imported strains it has ranked high in forage and seed yield and in protein and phosphoric acid content. Foundation seed was placed with Texas registered seed growers in September, 1946, and the seed will be available for general planting next fall.

Things Texas farmers—and their livestock—will like about Texas Rescue 46 are its upright growth, leafiness, resistance to disease and its habit of producing lots of grass early in the spring. Once established, its high seed yield will cause it to reseed itself year after year. Any body interested in securing seed for demonstrational purposes here in Callahan county will be given help in securing and planting of seed.

Feature Fruit

Now that flour and eggs are on the list of critical foods it's a good idea to feature fruits in desserts for the family. A variety of fruits, fresh, canned and dried, are on the market this fall, and there is plenty of sugar and sirups for sweetening.

Dried apples, peaches, apricots and prunes can be served many ways. Raisins add taste and texture variety to such dishes as baked apples, apple-raisin marmalade, fruit and waldorf salads.

Spiced prunes are good hot or cold and may be served as a relish with the meat course or as a dessert. Prepare the prunes in the usual way, Louise Mason, Extension food preparation specialist for the Texas A. & M. College, says,

then toward the end of cooking, add sugar to taste a few grains of salt, such spices as clove, nutmeg, cinnamon or allspice, and a little vinegar or lemon juice. Other dried fruits can be spiced by the same receipt.

If fruits are used as much as possible, Miss Mason pointed out, there is less need for cakes, pies and puddings. By cutting down on baked desserts, the housewife is doing her part in the government's program for saving certain foods.

Wanted Shoes

Shoes are the delight as well as the bane of existence for women. . . . A trim, becoming shoe can make a woman feel almost as good as a new hat. . . . but if the shoe isn't right, she's miserable.

Stores sell shoes designed for nurses . . . for girls scouts . . . for tennis, golf, skiing and other sports . . . but Mary Routh, clothing specialist for Texas A. & M. College Extension Service, says that work shoes for farm women have been forgotten. And the six million rural housewives of this country are unhappy about it.

The active farm woman needs durable shoes for outdoor work—but she usually has to buy heavy work shoes which look clumsy on feminine feet and are tiring as well. When she wants a comfortable shoe for the long hours on foot indoors, she has her choice of expensive "Health" or other "sensible" shoes . . . which often do not fit her needs, her pocketbook or her taste.

Farm women in every state have reported to their Extension clothing specialists that what they'd like to have in work shoes are sturdy moisture-resistant but flexible soles, medium heels, comfortable but trimly shaped toes, reinforced at the tip, durable uppers with some ventilation and scuff- and moisture-resistant finish, good arch support, and neat, attractive lines that flatter the feet.

Sounds like a large order, but I'll bet those 6 million farm women get what they want.

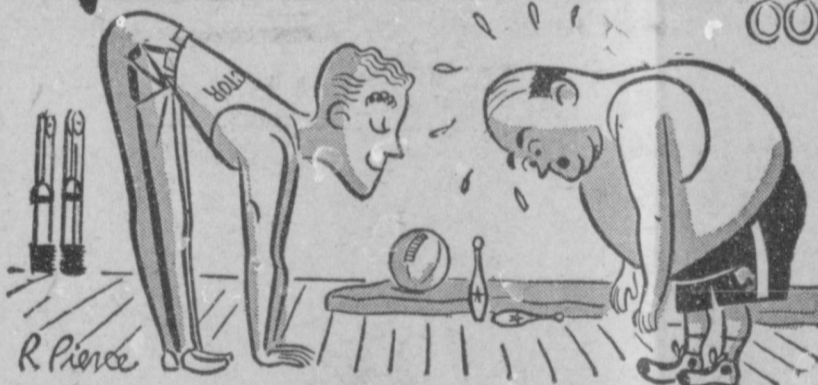
