to the door to call the children to lunch and found the entire structure in flames

Going to the barn, she found a doll which one of the children had been playing, but could find no trace of the children themselves. She called and searched for a short time and then went over a half mile to a telephone on a neighboring farm and called the fire department for help.

When firemen reached the scene they found a mass of burning hay with the three bodies laying in the fire near the back end of the house. The children evidently had been trapped and had run to the back of the barn in an effort to get away from the flames. Hooks were used to pull the bodies from the fire.

The arms and legs of the children were practically burned from the torsos and recognition was impossible.


