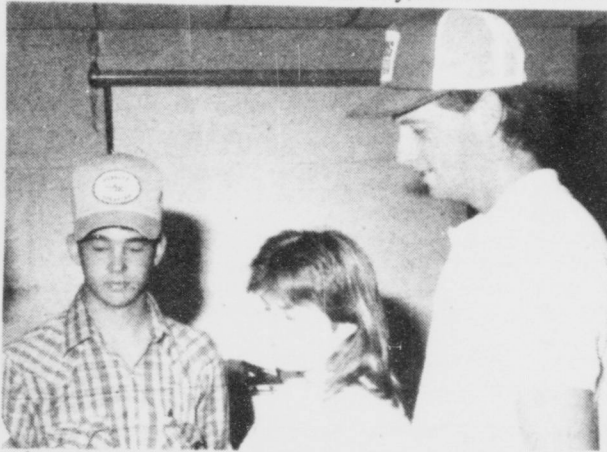

Dr. William Kirby Spoke To Area Administrators

Area school administrators and other Panhandle School Leadership Association members met November 16 in Amarillo at the Region XVI Education Service Center. Featured speaker was Dr. William N. Kirby, State Commissioner of Education from Austin. Kirby addressed the school finance issue. A recent ruling by the Texas

talented instruction at the Region XVI Education Service Centers.

Supreme Court in the Edgewood v. Kirby lawsuit holds that the Texas school finance system must be revamped by May 1, 1990. requires all students to attend 80 days each semester in order to receive credit for classes.

Schools are permitted to combine semesters for first through eighth grades, in which those students will attend a minimum of 160 days each year.

Local administrators may at such times excuse a student's absences and allow them to receive credit for their classes.

If however, they feel that they cannot decide alone whether a student's absences are excusable or not, they will refer the student to the attendance committee, made up of Mrs. Judy Babcock, Mr. Kenneth Sweatt, Counselor, Jimmy Branch and two other teachers.

The attendance committee will review the case and

decide if a student should receive credit.

If the committee decides to withhold credit, a student may appeal to the school board.

Students may be allowed to regain lost credit by fulfilling one of the following requirements: complete additional assignments, as specified by the committee, satisfy time-on task requirements before and or after school, attend tutorial sessions as scheduled, maintain the attendance standards for the rest of the semester or year.

In all cases, the student must maintain a passing grade.

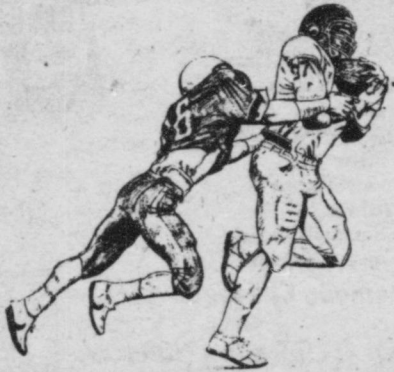



