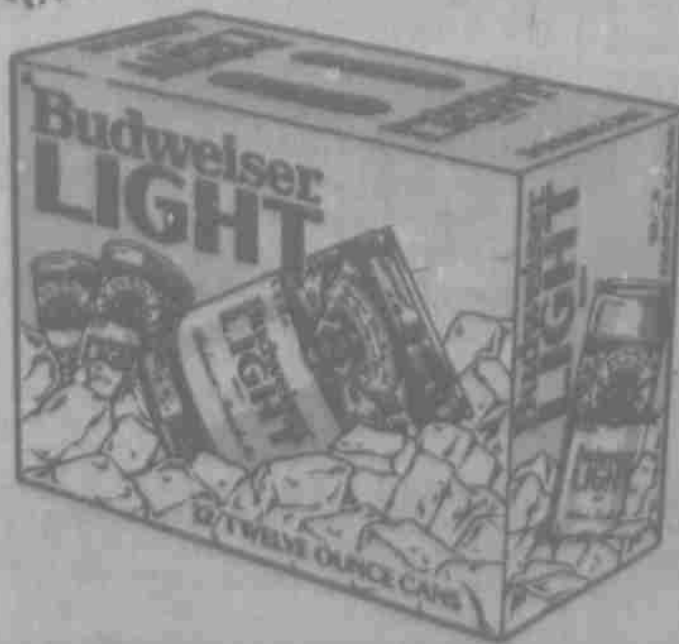

The Duty and Authority of a Preacher

The world today is so vast and complex. The problems of mankind are mounting steadily and really many have given up hope. Many of you who read my writings weekly no doubt have complex problems and no where to turn. But

let me recommend that you turn to the Lord. You may ask "How can I turn to the Lord?" The Bible says, "How shall they hear without a preacher and how shall they preach except they be sent?" As it is written, how beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace and bring glad tidings of good things." Romans 10:14-15. The preacher is to bring glad tidings of good things, whether they are of sickness as God is a healer; whether it be financial as the Lord can answer our financial needs; or whether the heart is in sorrow, for the Lord can bind up a broken heart.

Let us examine the power and the authority of a gospel preacher. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; because the Lord has anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound. To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all that mourn." Isaiah 61:1-2. Notice that the effective message is one where the Spirit of the Lord has touched the minister, not a message of articulation or rhetoric, but one where the anointing of the Holy Ghost is present, to preach good things -- not of sin but of salvation. God has sent the minister to bind up the broken hearted, God has anointed the preacher to give hope to the man who is at the end of his rope.

The gospel message is one of liberty to the people who are in captivity to alcohol, tobacco, drugs, homosexuality, prostitution, gambling, murderings, you name it; but through the blood of Jesus Christ there is liberty. If you go to church and you still have these problems, I suggest that you listen to the gospel of deliverance which Jesus brought all the way from heaven down to the earth. The message of the preacher called of God should open prisons. I speak of the prisons of life shut up in you. Each person has his prison but Jesus is there to open it for you, all you have to do is accept him.

TTUHSC Medical School Celebrate First Decade

There are high risk babies alive and healthy today because Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center's medical school has developed systems of care during pregnancy and following delivery. There are alcoholics living productive lives with their families. There are people of all ages whose vision problems have been corrected and who are enjoying the privilege of sight. There are hundreds of cases, some of whom have had chronic disabilities, some of whom were brought in as emergencies, all of whom have been able to receive the medical care they needed nearer home because West Texas has a medical school.

All of these people don't live in Lubbock or Amarillo or El Paso, where Tech's medical school has educational centers. They come from Pampa, Monahans, Tahoka, Muleshoe, Sierra Blanca, Dalhart and many places in between. Most of them have come because their physicians are on the medical school's clinical faculty and have referred them.

since the med school's ambulatory clinics opened, patient visits have increased 410%. Last year over 90,000 outpatients sought care in its 12 specialty and 59 subspecialty clinics. Before West Texas had a medical school, that care either would not have been available or would have required a trip to Dallas, Albuquerque, Denver or Houston.

This spring, the Medical School of Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center is celebrating its first decade in medical education. It is being called "a decade of progress" because it has been. The medical school was created by the 61st Texas Legislature to develop a program of regional medical education and to address problems of rural health care delivery.

"We have not accomplished all of the things we plan to do, but we feel a celebration is in order because we have reached the point of critical mass," J. Ted Hartman, M.D., interim dean, noted in announcing the celebration. "Buildings and programs are in place and our facility contingent is strong. From now on, our plans will be much easier to implement than they have been in the past. From now through graduation in June, we wanted to pause to help West Texans understand the types of services which are available and to thank the many physicians, legislators and civic leaders who have helped us make them so."

Creating services which have not been available is a valuable outgrowth of medical education. In the process, the medical school has brought over 600 million in real dollars into the local economy.

Providing referral support for rural physicians is another product and one that is important to physician retention. Last year the medical school presented 26 two-day continuing education symposia for physicians and over 100 lectures per month. Today, Tech's physician faculty specialists also hold day clinics in the local physician offices of 17 rural towns and contribute to the services of 33 community agencies. In addition, faculty operate an inner city clinic in El Paso and rural clinics in Claude and Shallowater.

The bottom line, however, is the education and retention of new doctors for Texas and West Texas. Of the 335 physicians who have graduated from Tech Medical School, 100 have finished residencies and gone into practice. Of these, over 75% have elected primary care disciplines and nearly 75% are in practice in Texas, many in towns like Boerne, Denver City, Haskell, Hebronville, Fairview, Fredricksburg, Jourdan, Lockney, Refugio and Olney with populations of less than 5,000.

"A medical school complements existing health care and extends its dimensions," Hartman concluded. "We have made substantial contributions during this decade of progress, and the best is yet to come."
