

Children's Nosebleeds - Rarely a Cause for Alarm

By Dr. John Hellerstedt

Mosebleeds are common in children. They can be scary but they're Tarely dangerous. If your child gets a nosebleed, stay calm, and help your child sit quietly. Gently pinch the and of the nose shut for ten minutes and, afterwards, try to keep the child as inactive as possible.

A common cause of nosebleeds is very dry air in the home caused by central air conditioning and heating. It's a good idea to humidify your child's room with a vaporizer if the nosebleed persists.

It is important to call your doctor or go to the emergency room if:

- Your child gets a nosebleed as the result of a blow to the head or a fall.
- 2 You are unable to stop the nosebleed.
- Nosebleeds are frequent or they last longer than fifteen minutes.
- The nosebleed causes your child to have difficulty breathing.
- 5. The nosebleeds start or occur more frequently just after your child has begun taking a new medicine.
- There is a foreign object stuck in your child's nose.

She was Active with the inerdenominatioal Ministers wives Alliance, Black Church Fellowship of the Lubbock Baptist Association, served as secretary of the Executive of the LBA, and Played Piano one Sunday a month for Mount Vernon United Methodist Church.

She is survived by her husband, Rev. Elijah W. Austin; Three sons: Jacob Glickman of Pasadena, California, Samueli Glickman of Atlanta, Georgia and Charles Austin of Lubbock; two daughters, Ashuana Austin of Lubbock, and Sharon Thomas of Atlanta City, N.J.: a Brother. 



"That if you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."-Roman 10:9, NIV

The Greek word translated "confess" means to say the same thing, to

agree with what another has said.

The central affirmation of Christians in the early days of the church was that Jesus is Lord. Everyone in the Roman Empire was expected to confess, "Caesar is Lord." During times of persecution, Christians were commanded to confess Caesar as Lord; instead, they would reply, "Jesus is Lord," and go to their deaths. In confessing Jesus as Lord, they were declaring, "Jesus is the Master of my life. He is the Son of God."

Wycliffe Bible Commentary says the following about Roman 10:9: "Confession with the mouth and belief in the heart refer to the believer's outward and inward responses. His inward conviction must find outward expression. When he confesses that Jesus is Lord, he is asserting Christ's deity and His exaltation, and the fa* that he, the believer, belongs to Him. A man's belief in the Resurrection shows that he knows God acted and triuniphed in the cross. The man who confesses that Christ is Lord and has such a belief or conviction will attain salvation. This trust or belief is a constant activity and refers to righteousness; the confession is also a constant activity and Lord!"

refers to salvation. These confessed and believed truths are constant, lifelong conditions."

People today seem far more ready to confess Jesus as Savior than to confess Him as Lord. They want Him to save them, but save they seem reluctant to allow Him to take control of their lies. To confess Jesus as Lord is to affirm His mastery over every area of our lives. I means that we seek and submit to his will in such matter as the use we make of our money, the kinds of entertainment w e pursue, sur speech, etc. Paul allured to the fact that is simply not enough to believe in our hearts that Jesus is Lord. We must confess "with the mouth.n Wny is this so? Someone once said "thoughts are confined to our minds until we express them. Before such time, they lack objective reality." All of us may think many thoughts and possess many convictions, however, the former take on a new quality when we express this in word. When we express them in words, they are not only inside our heads, affecting our lives; they now are outside of our bodies, revealing our convictions, and may in some way affect the lives of others,

It is God's intention that the whole world should know about Jesus and the salvation He has made possible. How shall the unsaved ever know of Jesus unless those who believe in Him express in words the conviction they hold in their hearts?
