Blagojevich's appointment of former state Attorney General Roland Burris injected reaction to the drama surrounding the embattled governor, who embattled governor, who repeatedly sought to distance his selection from charges that he tried to sell the seat to the highest bidder.

"Please don't allow the alle-gations against me to taint a good and honest man," the governor said, turning to the smiling 71-year-old standing by his side.
