Mrs. Mae Simmons Resigns as Principal of Ella Iles School

Mrs. Mae Simmons has resigned her position as principal of Ella Iles Elementary School after 13 years of service.

Mrs. Simmons' resignation came as a shock to her teachers and friends.

She tearfully made the announcement Friday May 1 at the final faculty meeting, and immediately the atmosphere of the room was one of tears and regret. However, when her reasons were revealed, her colleagues were in sympathy, and realized she was wise in her actions. The responsibilities and pressures of any consecrated leader are indeed a strenuous task, and takes its ravages on a strong healthy body. For many years Mae Simmons has been a victim of polio, then called "infantile paralysis", and continued demands of her job was indeed tiring.

During her long years of services here, she has been the example of "The house by the side of the

road". She has been a true friend to man.

Many persons have been given jobs and work because of Mrs. Simmons. A needy family or a bedraggled unfortunate child never escaped her attention if she was aware of the condition.

Mae D. Thomas Simmons was born at Dawson, Texas in Navarro County. She is the daughter of the late William Homer Thomas and Mrs. Callie Thomas now of Houston. Mae began her school life in the public schools at Wichita Falls, Texas, where she graduated from the Booker T. Washington High School. She attended Prairie View College through freshman and sophomore years. Because of a lack of funds, her college career was delayed. During the lull, she was married to Ira Simmons July 28, 1939 with the late Rev. Chilton Thomas officiating. For the next few years she did


