

### **Dungy Retires After Seven** Seasons as Coach of Colts

Tony Dungy walked away from football and the Colts Monday, Jamuary 12, 2009, announcing his retirement after seven seasons with the team in which he became the first African American coach to win Super Board.

Dungy, 53, said he hadn't decided what his post-coaching career will be, but he hopes to work with children in some way.

"My wife and I talked, and we just felt it was the right time," Dungy said at a news conference. "I think I've got a chance to do some things down the road. I think I've got a responsibility to be home a linte

Dungy is to be replaced by associate head coach Jim Caldwell who was designated as Dungy's eventual successor by the Colts last offseavon.

Dungy had been contemplat-ing his coaching future since the Colts' season ended in a first-round playoff loss at San Diego He said he originally had hoped

to walk off the field in Tampa next month with a second Super Bowl triumph and retire then. When the Coles lost to the Chargers, he initially wanted to return for another season because he didn't want to exit on such a disappointment, he said.


The report, Sexually Transmitted Disease Surveillance, 2007, shows persistent racial disparities across these and other sexually transmitted diseases (STD), and a particularly heavy burden of disease among women. The report also finds continued

mcreases in syphilis. This dis-ease, while once on the verge of elimination, began re-emerging as a threat in 2001 and increased

Percent between 2006 and 2007.
"The widespread occurrence

of these diseases should serve as of these diseases should serve as a stark reminder that STDs remain a serious health threat in the United States, especially for women and racial and ethnic minorities," said John M. Deuglas, Ir., M.D., director of CDC's Division of STD Prevention." Left untreated, Chlamydia and gonorrhes can cause infertility, affecting a woman's chance to bear children later in life.

Infertility

Women continue to bear a disproportionate burden of the long-term health consequences of STDs. In 2007, the of STDs. In 2007, the Chlamydia rate among women was three times that of men (\$43.6 cases per 100,000 women, compared to 190 cases per 100,000 men). The gonor-hea rate was also higher among women (123.5 per 100,000 women, compared to 113.7 per 100,000 among men). Although the two diseases can be easily diagnosed and

Although the two diseases can be easily diagnosed and treated, they often have no symptoms and go undetected. If left untreated, up to 40 percent of Chlamydia and gonorrhea infections in women can result in pelvic inflammatory disease—a condition that causes as many in pelvic inflammatory disease— a condition that causes as many as 50,000 women to become infertile each year Untreated Chlamydia or gonorrhea can also cause ectopic Pregnancy, chronic pelvic pain, and other serious health problems.

serious health problems. The report found that there were more than 1.1 million Chlamydia cases reported in 2007, up from about one million in 2006, making it the largest number of cases ever reported to CDC for any condition. Gonorrhea, the second most commonly reported infectious disease, had more than 350,000 cases reported in 2007.

attorney general Roland Burris will likely be sworn in this week after his new credentials were

will likely be sworn in this week after his new credentials were found to be in order.
Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-Nev.) and Majority Whip Dick Durbin (D-III.) issued a statement saying that they have spoken to Burris. "to let him know that he is now the senator-designate from Illinois and as such, will be accorded all the rights and privileges of a senator-elect."

"Accordingly, barring objec-tions from Senate Republicans, we expect Senator-designed Burris to be sworn in and for-

Hurris to be sworn in and for-mally scated later this week," Reid and Durbin stated. The announcement ends a two-week standoff between Democratic leaders and the for-Democratic leaders and the for-mer Illinois attorney general. Burns was caught up in the aftermath of Illinois Gov Rod Blagojevich's (D) arrest for allegedly seeking to auction off President-elect Obama's Senate

are coordinating with Vice President Dick Cheney to deter mine when Burris can be swon

"As we had outlined to be fol-lowed that respects the rules of the Senate," Reid and Durbin stated, "We committed to Mr. Burnis that once those require-ments were satisfied, we would be able to proceed. We are ments were satisfied, we would be able to proceed. We are pleased that everything is now in order, we congratulate Senator-designee Burris on his appointment and we look for-ward to working with him in the 111th Congress."

The Democratic leaders released their statement after a

released their statement after a meeting between Burris's attorneys. Senate lawyers and Secretary of the Senate Nancy Erickson, who had rejected Burris's certification papers last week. Burris's attorneys submitted two separate documents that they say fulfill an 1884 Senate rule that all senations must have certification signed by their states' governors and secretaries.

Erickson issued a statement saying Burns's papers "appear to contain all the essential elements" of the Senate rule.

Democratic leaders last week refused to seat Burns because his appointment was not certified by Illinois Secretary of State Josse White. However, the Illinois Supreme Court ruled that Burns's appointment by Blagojevich was valid even without the signature of Secretary of State Jesse White, who refused to co-sign the cer-

At a Chicago press conference, Burris declared victory and said he hopes to join the Senate immediately.

"The single most important teason I fought to defend this appointment, was because I.

reason I fought to defend this appointment was because I believe Illinois people didn't deserve to unfairly be punished again by delaying their right to have full representation and equally full voting rights at such a crippled, crucial time for our state and our nation," he said. "My mitivation is to serve, and had nothing to do wit the sen-

ment."

Pointedly, Burris thanked
Reid and Durbin for negotiating
with him and and he holds no

with him and said he holds no grudges.

"Never once did I doubt their intentions, were motivated by anything other than doing what was right for the people of Illinois and by what they believe had to be done to protect the Senate as an institution," he said. "It will be my honor both to serve with them and to learn from them."
