Join the fun and fellowship this Saturday, April 9th when Texans all over the state will be working to make Texas A cleaner, more beautiful place to live.

Our Adopt-A-Highway groups are going to be working as well as individuals and organizations. Come join the fun and you will be proud you are a Texan!

### SCHEDULE

**9:00 a.m.:** Registration for everyone (city volunteers and Adopt-A-Highway groups) inside the Memorial Building, Cottonwood Street entrance. (Please register, we need your name for our records!) You will receive lunch badges and will be able to pick up your trash bags.

**10:00 a.m.-12:00 Noon:** Information Center open at Memorial Building.

**12:00 Noon:** Hot Dog Lunch - served to all workers with badges.

**1:00-4:00 p.m.:** Resume Clean-up; Information Center open at Memorial Building; - additional trash bags available.

All volunteers are asked to bring trailers, pick-up trucks, mowers, gas weed-eaters, rakes, brooms, gloves, etc. for clean-up. Coca-Cola will again provide trash bags. **Please place filled bags along the curb or next to dumpsters. Please DO NOT put bags in street, dumpsters or blocking alleys.**

City trucks will be picking up bags that day and the Sanitary Landfill will be open from 8:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.

Trucks going to dump trash, please bag or tarp debris. Southwest Texas Electric Co-op, Adopt-A-Highway Group for 190 West, will appreciate your cooperation. We don't want debris blowing out of the trucks.

We hope everyone will participate and have fun helping Keep Eldorado Beautiful!



"Great Texas Trash-Off" Slated for April 9th

This year, the Tyler Longriders (pictured), other Adopt-a-Highway groups and Keep Texas Beautiful affiliates from across the state will once again turn out more than 85,000 volunteers to clean up trash on Texas roadways, parks and streets. The Trash-Off, sponsored by the Texas Department of Transportation, is part of the state's aggressive "Don't Mess with Texas" campaign, which has reduced roadside litter by 72% since it began in 1986.

The bluebonnets are back - and so are the Adopt-A-Highway and Keep Texas Beautiful groups who volunteer to give the Lone Star State a thorough spring cleaning every year.

On Saturday, April 9th, some 95,000 Adopt-A-Highway and Keep Texas Beautiful volunteers will help ready the Lone Star State for another colorful wildflower season by participating in the ninth annual "Great Texas Trash-Off." This event, which is part of the Texas Department of Transportation's "Don't Mess with Texas" antilitter campaign, is considered the largest one-day cleanup in the nation.

This year, TxDOT is adding a new twist to the event by encouraging all Texans to kick the littering habit for at least 24 hours in observance of Trash-Off day.

In Sutton and Schleicher Counties, 10 Adopt-A-Highway groups: Agape Assembly of God, American Exploration, Beta Sigma Phi - Eldorado, Chamber of Commerce/Chamber Pride, Eldorado Air Force Station, Eldorado Eastern Star, Employees of Perry's, Isaac's Descendants, Meridian Oil Employees, and FM 1828 Neighbors will scour state roadways for litter while Sonora and Eldorado Keep Texas Beautiful groups spruce up city streets and parks.

For the fourth year in a row, Trash-Off sponsor Coca-Cola is providing volunteers with Texas-sized garbage bags. Last year marked the largest Great Texas Trash-Off in the history of the Don't Mess with Texas campaign, with 85,000 volunteers picking up more than 7 million gallons of litter across the state. That's enough garbage to fill the beds of 17,000 pickup trucks. Participants are expected to pick up more than 9 million gallons of litter this year.

"Programs like the Trash-Off are saving taxpayers nearly \$4 million in litter pickup expenditures every year," says J. Don Clark, director of TxDOT's Travel and Information Division. Since the Don't Mess with Texas and Adopt-A-Highway programs were launched in 1986, the state has seen a 72 percent decrease in roadside litter. "That's a great improvement, but there's a lot of trash out there in our bluebonnets right now. What we want to see is a zero tolerance level for litter in Texas."

Keep Texas Beautiful, Inc., a grassroots partner of the Texas Department of Transportation's antilitter program, is a non-profit, environmental umbrella organization consisting of a network of private citizens,

communities, industries, civic groups, schools, and government agencies.

### "Great Texas Trash-Off" Facts

\* The ninth annual "Great Texas Trash-Off," scheduled for Saturday, April 9th, will involve more than 95,000 volunteers throughout the state in the largest one-day cleanup effort in the nation.

\* The Texas Adopt-A-Highway program, sponsored by the Texas Department of Transportation, is the first of its kind in the nation. Except for Vermont and New Hampshire, every other state has since developed similar programs.

\* More than 4,300 groups have joined the Adopt-A-Highway program since it was introduced in March 1985 in Tyler, Texas.

\* Specially designed thirty-three gallon trash bags, provided by Coca-Cola, will be used by the volunteers to pick up an estimated 9.6 million gallons of trash.

\* The Great Texas Trash-Off is part of TxDOT's tough-talking "Don't Mess with Texas" program aimed at convincing habitual litterers to put their trash where it belongs.

\* Don't Mess with Texas, the Adopt-A-Highway and Keep Texas Beautiful programs are credited with an estimated 72 percent reduction in litter since 1985. Texas celebrities like George Foreman, Willie Nelson, the Texas Tornados and Warren Moon have donated their talents to spread the word about messin' with Texas.

### Keep Texas Beautiful Facts

\* Keep Texas Beautiful, Inc., (KTB) is a certified state affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, Inc., and the grassroots are of the Texas Department of Transportation's "Don't Mess with Texas" antilitter program.

\* Established in 1967 as the Beautify Texas Council, KTB works through more than 300 local Texas affiliates to provide grassroots solutions to Texas' solid waste and litter issues.

\* KTB has been recognized as the "Best Statewide Program in the Nation" by Keep America Beautiful, Inc. three of the last four years.

\* KTB was one of 13 Presidential Citation winners in the 1992 President's Environmental Conservation and Challenge Awards.

\* The Great Texas Trash-Off, sponsored by TxDOT and KTB, will kick off Keep America Beautiful and Keep Texas Beautiful Month.

\* KTB volunteers will be cleaning up statewide in conjunction with Adopt-a-Highway groups so that every street, park, vacant lot, neighborhood and school ground sparkles on April 9th.

### TOP OF THE DIVIDE by Thomas Giovannitti

Tuesday afternoon a considerable segment of the population of our community attended the funeral and burial of Neria Pina. The large number of persons who paid their last respects speaks well of Neria. In her relatively short life she had made some difference in the lives of people in this town. I am sure not everyone was her friend. I am equally sure that was not a major driving force in her decisions about how to approach a situation as she

perceived it. I know of at least two events in which she took positions not necessarily popular with others. She took her stance based on her conviction that she was correct. The fact that her position might incur some resentment or even hostility did not deter her from her decisions. It is an admirable quality in a person when they can do something not based on the praise they might receive but upon their principles as they

perceive them. From the size of the throng Neria will be missed not only by her husband and family but by a considerable portion of the community. She also stood her ground with her final struggle. Some people might think she lost. She did not! Just as she did in the rest of her life she took what facts she had made her decision and followed through. She believed and she kept her belief

to the end. Easter Sunday morning, for many of us the celebration of Jesus' resurrection and, I think, much more so for Neria.

children and her colleagues. We will all miss her very much.

Neria wanted everyone to know she appreciated the visits, flowers, food for Felipe and the boys, and especially all your prayers.

In the next few weeks I want to look at ethics and how we as individuals and a society make decisions on what is wrong and ethical decisions whether we realize it or not. We have some kind of hierarchy that regulates the choices we make in life. When we understand our foundations it gives us the chance to evaluate whether or not this is how we truly want to live and decide. I want to very generally examine some of the systems that people use and the pros and cons of each.

The first means of ethical decision making that is in popular usage (whether realized or not) is Utilitarian ideas, it is John Stewart Mill who is its true developer and popularizer historically. The basic concept of Utility, or the Greatest Happiness Principle, is that the more pleasure an action provides the more right it is, and the more pain an action brings about the more wrong it is. Good actions produce pleasure and freedom from pain. Each choice in life must be weighed on the scales of pleasure to see if it is worthy.

## Insights

Pleasure must not be understood in terms of physical pleasure alone, but also as mental and spiritual pleasure because all contribute to one's happiness. It is the pleasures of the higher faculties that are to be placed above the pleasures of animal instinct. It is the quality of pleasure which matters and not the quantity.

Now this seems at first to be a totally selfish system, but Mill makes it clear that our judgment of right and wrong is not to be based upon personal pleasure and pain, but according to how our actions will effect the world in general. We must judge if our actions will lead to the greatest amount of happiness for all concerned and not just for ourselves. Mill even states that Utility can be summed up in the golden rule, "do unto others as you would have them do unto you." It is the need of society that determines personal choices. I may even have to choose personal pain if it will bring about happiness for the whole. The needs of the many outweigh the needs of the few or the one.

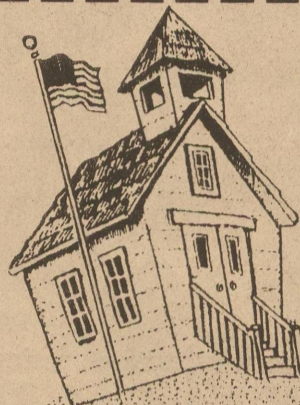
Utilitarianism has had a

definite impact historically. Utilitarianism arguments are the basis for many government actions. How many times are we told by government leaders that we must be willing to sacrifice for the good of the nation? And most of us are willing to do so -- if we are assured that it is really in the best interest of all concerned. No society can survive if the individual is given precedence over the corporate. That would mean that laws and regulations would be meaningless and chaos would ensue. There must be some guiding principle behind our activities and Utility is one of our sources.

Even though we use Utility, however, there are some questions which give pause to Utilitarianism being our only source of decision making. Who

is going to determine what is best for all? What if I disagree? What if a large minority disagree? Are the desires and pleasures of a majority always the guides to what is right? does not history teach us that a majority's desire for pleasure can lead to terrible injustice and suffering on the part of a few?

The pleasure principle and majority rule seem to leave us on very uncertain ground in many areas of life. The principles of Utilitarianism may be helpful in certain cases, but the cost may be higher than we want to pay if this is going to be our sole ethical guide in life. If you do not think so, just gauge your response the next time the president asks you to pay for someone else's desires, "for the good of everyone."

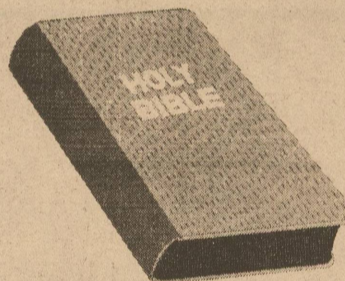

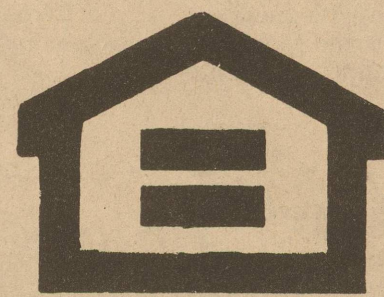

**Editor's Note:** The following article is being reprinted by request from the Enid News.

Four years ago, when he began playing with the Enid-Phillips Symphony Orchestra, Steven Stark "couldn't substantially contribute to the orchestra."

On Sunday, March 27th, the 18-year-old cellist joined Mozart and Ravel as one of the composers whose work was performed during the afternoon concert.

It is a substantial contribution indeed for someone who recalls he was not very enthusiastic about sixth-grade orchestra and had to be talked into sticking with it in junior high school.

"I never would have imagined in the sixth grade that my life would have turned so much to music," said Stark. But somewhere in high school, "I just finally clicked."

The world premier of Stark's composition titled "Reflections" was performed by the Enid-Phillips Symphony Chamber Orchestra at a concert in Briggs Auditorium.

The Enid High School senior was commissioned to compose an original piece for the nearly all-strings concert in exchange for a scholarship to attend the prestigious Interlochen Arts Camp last summer.

"He has written a very lovely piece," said Douglas Newell, EPSO artistic director. "There's a lot about Steven's work that has the sound of the English composers of this century."

Composition was one of three subjects Stark studied during his eight weeks at the arts camp in Interlochen, Michigan. He also studied 20th century music styles and majored in orchestra.

Stark wrote the first version of "Reflections" for two violins and a cello while at Interlochen and later expanded it for all string parts.

"I was really happy with it at the last rehearsal we did," the composer said. "It's coming along really nice."

"I know what I'm writing and I know how it will sound, and yet you never know what the exact blend will be," he said of hearing his music performed.

Stark's first composition was something he jotted down in his sophomore geometry class when his mind wandered from the subject hand. It was a cello duet he called "Geometry Duet."

"I didn't know what I was doing but I did it anyway," Stark said.


He credits his experience playing with the EPSO as a major factor in his musical success, and thanks Newell for giving the opportunity to high school students.

"He really gave us a break when he allowed us to play. We couldn't substantially contribute to the orchestra then," Stark said. "But we can now substantially contribute to the orchestra. It's really a great opportunity."


Stark is one of eight high school students currently playing with the orchestra.

This will be the second time during the 1993-94 symphony season the EPSO has premiered a work from a local composer. "We Of the Plains" by Phillips University professor emeritus Eugene Ulrich was first performed at the EPSO's September season opener.

Steven is the grandson of Jon and Jo Callison of Eldorado, who attended the concert with Mary Barton Robinson, also of Eldorado.




