Technicians of the Soil Conservation Service made a topographical map on a twenty-acre field, last week, on the H. Leslie Jones irrigated farm at Ft. McKavett. The map was made to get a cross sectional picture of the land as to elevation, in order that irrigation borders may be laid off in such a manner that there will be an even distribution of water on all parts of the field.
